HEAD COACH SALLY WALLACE

Sally Wallace enters her eleventh season as the Cortland women's softball coach with an impressive 97-22 (82%) won-lost record.

A Rochester native, Wallace has B.S. and M.S. degrees in physical education from Cortland. She participated in basketball, softball and swimming as an undergraduate student.

Now in her 18th year as a member of the physical education staff at her Alma Mater, Wallace has served as golf coach (3 years), basketball coach (5 years), and swimming coach (1 year).

Softball teams coached by Wallace at Cortland have consistently provided strong competition for New York and Pennsylvania colleges. The Cortland State team finished as NYSAIAW Champions in 1977 and took second place in 1974, 1975 and 1976. Cortland also has participated in several AIAW Eastern Region tournaments.

Wallace will be coordinator for the 1978 New York State AIAW softball tournament at Cortland, May 6-7. She conducted the first and second New York State tournaments during the early seventies.

1978 SOFTBALL OUTLOOK

The outlook for the 1978 season is "uncertain," according to Coach Sally Wallace. Gone from last year's State Champion team are seven starters, including the top pitcher and catcher in the state. Wallace, however, indicates

that the "prospects are good for this year in terms of the number (75) and quality of candidates" trying out.

Wallace will be relying on the strength and experience of her infield this spring where three of five returning veterans hold down positions. Returning for her third season at third base and shortstop is Lori Slaght, a junior from Ithaca. An all around player, Slaght is noted both for her batting and fielding and should be one of the key members of the Lady Dragon team. Last season, Slaght batted .260, hitting three homeruns. In 1976 as a freshman, Slaght led the team in hits (23) and runs (25) while batting .404. She also was a member of the 1978 State Champion women's basketball team.

Also returning to the infield this year are Janet Weschler and Pat Eberle, both juniors in their second season of play. Weschler, a native of Massapequa, is primarily a third baseman but also can play outfield when needed. Described by Coach Wallace as "versatile and very quick," Weschler batted .360 and had a .931 fielding average last season.

Pat Eberle of Delmar will hold down second base this spring. Also known for her "consistency and versatility," Eberle hit three homeruns while batting .375 and fielding .892 last year. Eberle also is a member of the Cortland State varsity field hockey team.

Wallace also has a strong nucleus for the pitching staff with Deb Pallozzi and Cindy Smith returning. Pallozzi a junior from Waterford, is beginning her third season under Coach Wallace. Despite a 2-5 record, Pallozzi had a 2.14 earned run average last year. In 1976 as a freshman, Pallozzi had a 7-0 record and 1.46

E.R.A. Cindy Smith, a senior from Endwell, is returning for her second year of play. Known for her fastball, Smith had a 4-1 record and 1.89 E.R.A. last spring. Both Pallozzi and Smith will be called on extensively to fill the gap left by the graduated Joanne Poppenburg, the number one pitcher in the State last year.
