THE COLLEGE

The State University Teachers College at Cortland, New York is situated midway between Binghamton and Syracuse in the center of New York State. The college itself is built on a beautiful hilltop, about 1200 feet above sea level overlooking the seven valleys which converge in this city of some 18,000 inhabitants.

As an institution for education of teachers, the State College at Cortland has a long history. It was founded in 1863 as a State Normel and Training School, giving a two-year course to prospective teachers. When the original building burned in 1919, it was replaced by the present main building located on the hill in 1923. At that time the course was lengthened to three years and the specialized physical education course was established.

In 1941, the state legislature and the Board of Regents made Cortland a college, giving it four year courses leading to a Bachelor's degree. Six years later in 1947, the college was authorized to begin graduate instruction leading to a master's degree.

1948, saw the college made a part of the new State University of New York. Since that time the enrollment has steadily increased to it's present enrollment of 2100 students who come from every county in the state.

The college campus consists of over one hundred acres. In addition to the Main Building there is a temporary gymnasium annex and classroom annex. To the east of the main building are the two residence halls. Between these two buildings is the Student Union Building, Brockway Hall, named in honor of George A. Brockway, who contributed substantially to its erection. Here much of the social life is centered. The new Health and Physical Education Building was recently dedicated and features the latest in gymnasia, swimming pool and classrooms.

A new football field, track and baseball diamond are presently under construction and should be available for use within several years. Plans are also under way for the construction of a library building which will be part of a ten million dollar expansion program.

In 1948, Mr. Archer M. Huntington donated his camp located on Raquette Lake in the Adirondack Mountains, as a memorial to his father, the late Collis P. Huntington a railroad builder, financier and philanthropist, who attained national fame during the nineteenth century. The camp is comprised of over 200 acres of timber land, embracing three and a half miles of shore line and having a group of eighteen buildings.

MEET THE VARSITY BASKETBALL COACH

This year the Varsity Basketball team has a new coach. Robert Wallace, a 1953 graduate of Cortland, has taken over in the absence of Whitney "Pete" Corey, who is on a leave of absence to complete his doctorate degree.

Mr. Wallace taught physical education in Painted Post High School for two years and coached football, wrestling, and track. In his undergraduate days at Corbland, he played football and baseball. Upon his return to his alma mater last year he served as assistant football coach, J.V. basketball coach and assistant perchall coach. This year he continued as assistant football coach and will take over the varsity baseball team next Spring.

Mr. Wallace served with the U.S. Navy from 1944-46.

CORTLAND STATE 1957-58 VARSITY BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

This year's squad will be quite small compared to the teams Cortland has had in the past. The team will miss three of last year's starters - sharp-shooter Hal Van Earden, backcourt ace Lou LaGrand and leading scorer Frank Dawson. This year's team might be a little faster but the lack of height will definitely hurt. Cortland will also lack experienced backcourt players.

Lettermen (5) returning include Bill Popelka, Wayne Weiss, Jon Grace, Dan Lee, and Robert Deger. Other returnees are Edward Leahey and Clifford Hughes. Up from last year's Junior Varsity team are Tom Galeazzi, Frank Wallace, and John Dennett. Returning to school after a year's absence are Jerry Davis, Don Loucks and Gene Farry. Thomas Murray, after sitting out a year, is a newcomer to the squad. The only player who has not played collegiate ball is Charles Prettyman.

Coach Wallace stated that "this certainly is a building year for the Red Dragons. Unfortunately most of our opponents appear to be stronger than last year".

MEET THE J.V. BASKETBALL COACH

A new Junior Varsity coach in the name of Reuben "Barney" Williams will take over the spot vacated by Bob Wallace. Mr. Williams is in his first year at Cortland State coming to us from Park College in Missouri where he was head basketball coach for three years. Before going to Park College, he was at Steven's Institute for six years as J.V. basketball coach and on the physical education staff. He played intercollegiate ball at West Chester, Pa. Teachers College, graduating there in 1947. He also played basketball while in the service.

1957-58 JUNIOR VARSITY BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

Out of the 50 original candidates, Coach Williams has kept 17 boys with a nucleum of about 4 sophomores. His most important outlook concerns the lack of height on this year's team. His tallest boys, Wilson and Karfut are only 6'3". Freshman Tony Condie, former local Cortland High star and Tom Decker, head the list of outstanding freshmen players. Returning from last year's squad are Larry Faessler who can play equally with both inside and out, and Dennis Murphy. Coach Williams has commented on how the team will have to rely on good floor play due to accurate shooting to compensate for the lack of height and rebounding ability.

MEET THE SWIMMING COACH

This year, Mr. Roland Eckard will coach the swimming team. He is taking over the spot vacated by Dr. James Councilman who has moved to Indianz University. Mr. Eckard graduated from Ohio State in 1940. In his undergraduate days he played football and wrestled. After four years in the Air Force he completed his Master's degree at Ohio State in 1946. He was Physical Education Supervisor in Paynesville, Ohio for four years and came to Cortland in 1948. Since coming to Cortland he has gained a wide background in teaching and has coached many Sports including cross country, football, wrestling and gymnastics. He has had 20 years of teaching swimming in schools, camps and Y's.

1957-58 SWIMMING OUTLOOK

This year's team will be composed of almost entirely Freshman and Sophomores. Thus it is manditory that this be a building year for the Dragon Mermen. There is only one senior and two juniors on the team. The team is rather inexperienced, but Coach Eckard has said there are some excellent prospects amoung the Freshmen. He noted that it is too early to tell just what he'll have; even as far as who will swim what events. He does have a number of outstanding newcomers in the freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. He has said that he doesn't know about his distance men yet. Bud Parsons and Charley Fairben are returning from last year's diving team and should give much added strength in that department. Tom Forbes is slated to give additional help in diving also. Also returning is senior Ken Lee who swam distance last year and Don Ball who swam breast stroke. Bill Ware and Mike Roscoe swam two years ago and are back after a year's absence.

Coach Eckard's most important comment was that this is a new team with a new coach and it's much too soon to make any predictions.

He was in the service four years and upon leaving Phelps, he went to the Sherburne School System. There he coached the football and basketball teams to league championships in each of those sports. Since coming to Cortland in 1948 he has coached many sports including football, soccer, cross countfy, track & field and wrestling.

1957-58 WRESTLING OUTLOOK

The team should be a good one. There are a lot of returning wrestlers with fine experience under their belts. Last year, a number of the wrestlers placed well in the 4-I tournament at Case. The only match the team lost last year was to Colgate, incidentally, our opening match this year. Mr. Miller pointed out that Lock Haven is new on cur schedule and should be one of our toughest opponents. Syracuse always has a good team and should also be hard to get by. Mr. Miller has hopes of placing a few wrestlers in the NCAA tournament this year.
