Women's Coach

Toni Tiburzi is in season number six in charge of Cortland's women's gymnastic fortunes. And those fortunes are perennially bright.

In the previous five years, Cortland has never finished in worse position than second in the state meet.

A graduate of SUNY Buffalo, Ioni received her master's degree from Penn State. On the Cortland staff since 1969, she has also taught at Penn State. Rosary Hill College and in the Clarence, N.Y. Central School system as well as St. Mary's School for the Deaf.

Men's Coach

Conrad Steele is Cortland State's new men's gymnastics coach, taking over from Bill Tomik.

Steele has been a member of the Cortland'staff since 1973. Prior to coming to Cortland, he was an instructor and lacrosse coach at Ohio State. A graduate of West Chester State College, Steele received his M.Ed. degree from the University of North Carolina and a Ph.D. from Ohio State.

Steele has also been on the University of North Carolina staff, coaching lacrosse, diving and gymnastics.

Men's Outlook

Consistency, and the higher scoring that goes with it, is the goal of new men's gymnastics coach Conrad Steele. He feels that, "barring injuries, we should reach the 100-point mark in most of our meets and if all goes well, we'll reach my objective of 120 points per meet later in the season."

Twins Rick and Wayne Suddaby are a driving force behind the new coach's optimism. The freshmen are both expected to improve Cortland's scoring in all events, Steele pointing both toward an all-around total of 35 and possible even 40 later in the year.

Leading the top returnees for the Red Dragons is junior George Kayser, who improved in both floor exercise and vaulting last season. Steele has considered adding events for Kayser, but may not do so, at least early in the season.

Seven other men return from last year's team, including a trio of seniors. One is team captain Mike Sinardi.

Also back are seniors Jeff Ellis and Dennis Barr, juniors John Drozda and Gary Pienkowski and sophs Mike Finein and Tom Pearson.

Women's Outlook

A young, talented team and a small roster are the distinguishing features of Cortland women's gymnastics this season and coach Toni Tiburzi feels she has a stronger team than the one which finished second to Canisius in the state meet last season.

All the short roster means is that, according to Tiburzi, "all of them can do a lot of things."

One of the most heartening aspects of this year's team is the comeback of bars performer Lynn Spadine after being sidelined last year by a dislocated elbow and later injuries from an auto accident.

Also back is Jan Seraphim, a strong all-around performer and especially strong on the balance beam. More strength in the beam should come from two freshmen, Sue Wimmer and Eve Palmisano.

Wimmer, frosh Margaret Wittosch and junior Deb Jones are the mainstays in a solid floor exercise group with Lynn Smith adding to a solid group of new gymnasts.

Among the returnees is also Traci Dalton, probably the top vaulter on the squad.

oost Season Meets

Both of Cortland's gymnastics teams take part annually in post-season competition.

Last season, the women were unseated as New York State Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women champions by Canisius in the state meet at Ithaca.

While champion Canisius was first in each event, Cortland had Jan Herringer second among uneven bars competitors, Traci Dalton in a second-place deadlock in vaulting, Jan Seraphim fourth in balance beam and in a tie for fourth in floor exercise, and Deb Jones fourth in all-around, sixth in floor exercise and sixth in vaulting competition.

The men's team is a member of the North Atlantic Gymnastics League and thus competes in the league's season-ending meet.

After hosting the meet in 1974, Cortland finished ninth among ten teams in last year's competition at West Chester.

This year's NAGL meet will be held at Oneonta while the women will travel to Canisius for the NYSAIAW championships.
