

HEAD COACH MARIA HUTSICK

Maria Hutsick is beginning her first year as women's varisty lacrosse coach at Cortland, replacing former coach Suzzane Wills. Hutsick is a 1975 graduate of Ithaca College where she received a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. She is completing work on a Master of Science degree in athletic training at Indiana University.

Before coming to Cortland, Hutsick served as assistant coach of the women's lacrosse team at Ithaca College in 1976 and played there as a student on the field hockey and lacrosse teams in 1974 and 1975.

1978 WOMEN'S LACROSSE OUTLOOK

Cortland State should be a strong contender to upset two-year defending champion Brockport for the New York State women's lacrosse title this year, according to Coach Maria Hutsick. Hutsick feels that the Lady Dragons' physical conditioning and mental desire should prove to be their outstanding assets. Hutsick has been guiding her players through an extensive pre-season conditioning program to prepare them for the upcoming schedule.

Led by co-captains Kathy Mahoney and Gail Lozado, Cortland has 15 returning veterans from last year's 5-5 team. Mahoney, a senior from Corning, brings three years of varsity experience to this year's team. Operating from the first home position, Mahoney was the second leading goal scorer (19 goals and 1 assist) on last year's team. Co-captain

Lozado, a senior from Lindenhurst, had four goals and three assists as left defense wing last season and was selected to play in the Central District Tournament sponsored by the Women's Lacrosse Association. Lozado is highly regarded for her speed and ability to intercept enemy passes.

Senior Charlyn Robert of Oxford, Mass., will return to anchor the defense from the cover point position. Robert's game sense and timing make her a defensive threat to any opposition. "Charlie" was captain of the 1977 Cortland State women's field hockey team.

Veterans Gail Hamilton and Kathy Powers also have looked good in pre-season play, according to Coach Hutsick. Hamilton, a junior from Huntington, is returning for a third season as attack wing. Powers, a sophomore from Greene, is returning at right defense wing.

Goaltending will be filled by three returning veterans - Lynn Hambel, Sue Ramos, and Geri Hens. Hambel, a senior from North Babylon, who was selected to play in the Central District Tournament last year, and Ramos, a senior from Bayside, have prior goaltending experience with Cortland. Hens, a versatile player from North Tonawanda, is being considered for goal, third man, point, and wing positions.

Freshmen Cory Shaw of Brookline, Mass., and Vanessa Hamilton of Scotia also should see plenty of action. Shaw will be used at center and Hamilton will perform from a defensive position.
