THE FOOTBALL COACHES



ROGER ROBINSON is in his fourth year as head coach. He has compiled a three year record of 19 victories and 6 defeats. He has never had a losing season at Cortland and his teams are undefeated at home.

Coach Robinson was named varsity football coach and associate professor of physical education at Cortland in January 1963. He has a B.S. degree in physical education and an M.A. in secondary school administration from Syracuse University and holds a permanent teaching certificate in physical education in New York State.

Robinson came to Cortland after six years as Harvard University's backfield coach. In addition to his football duties there, he coached the freshman track team.

His first coaching assignment was as assistant backfield coach at the University of Rochester. He served two years (1948-50) as line coach for Andy Kerr at Lebanon Valley (Pa.) College. From 1951 to 1956 he was head coach of football and track at Port Jervis High School on Long Island. He moved from there to Harvard.

Coach Robinson is married and is the father of eight children, five girls and three boys.

ROBERT WALLACE, end coach, played four years of varsity football under coach Carl "Chugger" Davis (now retired) and proved to be one of Cortland's outstanding quarterbacks. A 1953 graduate of Cortland, Wallace joined the staff of his Alma Mater in 1956 and was assigned end coaching duties, a post he has held since then. Before coming to Cortland, Wallace was a member of the physical education department at Painted Post High School and coached its football team to two city co-championships.

In addition to his football coaching chores, Bob is varsity baseball coach and assistant professor of physical education.

LARRY MARTIN, freshman football coach for the 1963 and 1964 seasons, moved to the varsity coaching level last year. Like Robinson, Martin is starting his fourth year as coach. He came to Cortland after serving 10 years in the North Country—two years at Gouverneur, four years at Massena High, and four years at Canton Central where he was director of athletics and coached the varsity football and basketball teams. A native of Cortland, Martin received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the College at Cortland. Larry is assistant professor of physical education.

AL PISANO, assistant line coach and instructor of physical education, is starting his third year on the Red Dragon's staff. A graduate of Cortland, Pisano has coached football and lacrosse at Berner High School on Long Island. He received his master's from Penn State. While at Penn State, he coached the freshman lacrosse team. In addition to his football coaching chores at Cortland, he is head lacrosse coach.

HARRY BELLARDINI, assistant backfield coach is also starting his third year on the coaching staff. Bellardini did his undergraduate and graduate work at Cortland. Before coming to Cortland he was on the staff at Corning High School, where he coached football, wrestling and track. Bellardini is currently on the physical education staff of Cortland's Ella Van Hoesen Campus School.

ANDY GRIEVE, came to Cortland in 1965 and assumed the duties of freshman football coach. Grieve is a graduate of New York University and Ithaca College. He has held the posts of secretary and president of the New York Association of HPER, Central Zone. Mr. Grieve's last position was with the Central School in Sherburne, N.Y., as director of health, physical education and athletics. Andy is also coach of the yearling basketball team and assistant professor of physical education.

VINCE GONINO is originally from Watertown, N.Y., where he participated in wrestling, football and track in high school. He is a graduate of Ohio State where he earned his bachelor's degree. Before coming to Cortland, Vince taught at Whitehall High School in Ohio and Keystone Junior College. This season Vince will be assisting coach Grieve with the freshman team. Vince is an instructor of physical education.

1966 VARSITY FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

A pre-season outlook of the 1966 Red Dragons finds Coach Roger Robinson blessed with more experience and better size than at anytime in the past three seasons. There are twenty-three lettermen back in the fold for 1966, and nine of those were starters most of the way last season.

Outstanding returning lettermen include: quarterback Dick Speckmann . . . an outstanding passer and excellent field general; punter Rick Page . . . excellent hands as an end and in 1964 he was second leading punter in the nation with an average of 44.4 yds per punt; John Knapp . . . tackle, strong blocker, started as a sophomore; Bill Wallace . . . tackle, good trapper, started at defensive tackle last fall; end Jim Okesson . . . starter last fall, strong pass rusher, excellent tight end.

On offense, the Dragons will be using a wing-T with a split end, while on defense they will use a basic Oklahoma pattern.

Cortland compiled a 7-2 ledger last fall playing a host of sophomores at key positions. They are now veterans and are not likely to make the mistakes they did last year in a learning year. The hoped-for result is the Cortland should have another excellent football season.

THE SOCCER COACHES



T. FRED HOLLOWAY, the veteran of Cortland's coaching staff, has been a member of the Physical Education Department since 1936. He celebrated his 28th season as varsity soccer coach last season by guiding his young team to a 7-4-1 record and placed second in the State University of New York Athletic Conference with a 6-1 record.

In keeping with his tradition of producing outstanding athletes, "Prof" Holloway placed three men on the State University of New York Athletic Conference all-star team in 1965—Rick Joseph of Naples and Dave Schletter of Brookhaven as backs, and Paul Rose of Syracuse as a lineman. Rick was also awarded an honorable mention berth in the All-American selections.

Of the 49 athletes on the 1965 squad, "Prof" has lost only 6 due to graduation.

Coach Holloway earned his bachelor and master degrees from Springfield College and his doctorate from New York University.

JOHN O'CONNOR joins the soccer coaching ranks for the first time this season. John is no stranger to the College. He received his bachelor's in physical education from Cortland. He returned to his alma mater in 1964 as an assistant dean and was freshman lacrosse coach for two years. This year John will be assisting "Prof" Holloway with the varsity team.

FRED FLEWELLING is a new addition to the men's physical education staff this year. Fred will assume the duties of freshmen soccer coach. Like O'Connor, Flewelling is a graduate of Cortland and was physical education instructor at Myn-dense Academy in Seneca Falls last year. He received his master's degree from Ball State University in 1965.

1966 VARSITY SOCCER OUTLOOK

Potentially, the 1966 soccer squad looks very strong. Academic ineligibility will not effect the team. Other factors may reduce the squad, but there will still remain a satisfactory nucleus for a good team.

Although graduation claimed such excellent players as Gerry Gentner, Stan Mechanic, Wagn Soudergaard and All-American Rick Joseph, many veterans should carry the 1966 team.

The veterans include Joe Bocchicchio, John Grace, Leon Hawkins, Jack Larsen, Paul Rose, Dave Schletter, Dave Spina, Chuck Thompson, to name just a few.

Promising sophomores that are expected to add to the depth of the team are Dick Alberti, Mike Bernstein, Era Mugisa, Pete Pepper, Sam Trance, Gary Vail, Jim Vartuli and Jay Wendell.

The only discouraging note is the very short practice schedule before the opening of the 1966 season. Since all of Cortland's opponents will be very strong this year, the outlook is for a very tough but interesting and exciting season.
