HEAD COACH

Betsy East is in her third year as Cortland State varsity women's gymnastics coach with an impressive 13-5 won-lost record overall. Last year, she led the team to a 7-4 dual meet record and the New York State Championship. The team also received its first gualification for the Eastern AIAW Regional Championships and placed fifth at the AIAW Small College National Championships in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

A native of Arlington, Va., East earned her B.S. degree from the University of Massachusetts and received an M.S. degree from there in 1976. She has started doctoral work at Temple University and was a teaching associate there before coming to Cortland.

As an undergraduate student, East was co-captain of the 1973 Massachusetts gymnastics team that won the AIAW National Championship and received All-American status for her 6th place finish on the uneven bars. In addition, she was named to the 1973 All-East team for women's gymnastics. East also was a member of the 1974 team which won the Eastern AIAW Regional Championship and placed third at the AIAW Nationals.

East is an instructor in the Department of Physical Education at Cortland State and serves as assistant director of women's athletics. She is a member of the EAIAW Gymnastics Committee and is vice president of the NAGWS Coaching Academy.

1978-79 WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS SEASON OUTLOOK

After a successful 1977-78 season, the Cortland State women's gymnastics team anticipates another exciting and promising year. The Dragons, who finished with a 7-4 dual meet record last season, will have rematches with both Cornell and Springfield this year. In addition, the women gymnasts will defend their New York State AIAW title and attempt to improve last year's fifth place finish at the AIAW Small College National Championships.

During the 1978-79 season, the Cortland women's gymnastics team will host the Danish Exhibition team from Svedboru District, Denmark, and co-sponsor a gymnastics clinic for area students. As defending New York State champions Cortland State also will host the NYSAIAW Championship Tournament on March 2-3, 1979.

Led by senior captain Margaret Wittosch, the Dragons have five outstanding returnees from last year's team. Wittosch, a physical education major from Floral Park, brings three years of varsity experience to this year's squad. Specializing in the all-around, she placed third in both the all-around and balance beam events at the 1978 New York State AIAW tournament.

Also returning for the Dragons are two 1978 AIAW Small College All-Americans, Karen Currier, a sophomore from Glens Falls, and Nancy Rubin, a senior from Brooklyn. Currier, described by Coach Betsy East as Cortland's "highest scoring and most consistent all-around performer" during the 1977-78 season, placed fifth in balance beam, ninth in uneven bars, and tenth in all-around

at the 1978 AIAW Small College National Championships. Rubin tied with teammate Karen Currier for fifth place in balance beam at the AIAW Small College National Championships, and placed fifth in both the balance beam and floor exercise events at the NYSAIAW Championships last year.

Other returning veterans, who will be counted on heavily to provide leadership for the young Cortland team will be junior Kate Shea of Haworth, N.J., and sophomore Jan Dever of Maitland, Florida. Shea, a two year veteran, specializes in the all-around event. Dever, who is formerly of Fairport, N.Y., will provide depth in both the balance beam and uneven bars.

Rounding out the '78-79 Cortland State team will be seven newcomers. All freshmen the young Dragons will provide depth in every event for Cortland. Newcomers include: Shawn Armstrong of Altamont, who will compete in the balance beam, floor exercise, and vaulting events; Sally Halstead of Preble, who plans to compete in the all-around event; Jeannette Hathaway of Oneonta, a vaulting and floor exercise specialist; Susan Lee of Harrington Park, N.J., who competes in both uneven bars and vaulting; Kathy Pfeiffer of Cheektowaga, an all-around specialist; Beth Sholtes of Altamont, an all-around competitor; and Nancy Smith of Rexford, who is making a comeback after a year's absence from competitive gymnastics.
