PETE CAHILL

In his seventh season as head coach of the men's intercollegiate swim team and his second season as the women's head coach, Pete Cahill has solidly established himself in the Cortland State aquatics program. Cahill's steadily improving 43-28-1 coaching record in the men's sport is evidence of Cortland's emergence as a major contender in SUNYAC competition.

In his first year at the helm, the Cortland men's squad managed just one win in 11 meets. In his second year, the Dragons improved to 5-8-1. Over Cahill's last three campaigns Dragon swimmers have compiled 10-1, 8-3 and 10-2 records, respectively. Twelve Cortland swimmers including Kerry Quilty, have earned All-American status under Cahill's direction.

Cahill is a 1966 graduate of Cortland. He has a master's degree from the University of Massachusetts and a doctorate from Springfield College. He is a native of Watertown, NY, and grew up in Malone, NY, where he graduated from Franklin Academy.

Before coming to Cortland, Cahill was a member of the faculty at SUNY Plattsburgh, where he coached swimming and tennis, and was a teaching fellow at Springfield College.

While an undergraduate at Cortland, Cahill concentrated on the butterfly and breaststroke events as a member of the swimming team. He was captain his senior year. In addition, he played varsity tennis.

A 1977 Cortland alumnus, Kerry Quilty is serving as assistant swimming and diving coach for the Cortland State men's and women's teams. As an undergraduate, Quilty was a four-year participant on the men's varsity swim team. In 1975, he earned All-American honors for Division III diving.

According to Coach Pete Cahill, Quilty was one of the major reasons for the excellent performances of last year's diving teams. The men's team collected over 80 points in the SUNYAC championships, and the women's team placed three divers in the State championships.

Quilty, a native of Liverpool, NY, is a graduate student in physical education at Cortland.

MEN'S OUTLOOK

Speed will be the key word describing this year's team as the men's program sets its sights on another SUNY Conference championship. Graduation losses seriously cut into the depth of the squad but an "excellent group" of freshmen and transfers offer a hopeful sign.

In the diving events, Scott Creighton, Bo Stoianoff and Mark Zeller, all finalists in the SUNYAC Championships, will be returning to take over for Brian Payne and All-American Tom Olivo who were lost to graduation.

Also returning will be two-time All American backstroke specialist Jeff Maxwell as well as Kevin Markwardt and Mark Ouimet. Eric Harvey and Eric Waldbauer are expected to be standouts for the team again.

Transfers Ed Walrath and Jeff Horowitz will be helping out in the IM and fly events, respectively. Freshmen Jim LaLonde in the backstroke and Jan Michell in fly events should be state finalists. Rob Rogan and Roger Evans will be expected to add greatly to the team's depth in the freestyle events.

WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

Coach Pete Cahill expects that this will be the best year ever for the women's swimming program with a vast majority of the 1979 team returning. Seven record holders will reappear on this year's squad and they will be supplemented by an equal number of very talented freshmen.

Cortland will continue its domination on the boards with the return of AIAW national qualifier Lorie Brown. Karen Connolly and Diane Bianco will add a great deal of depth to the diving program.

Backstroke, individual medley and butterfly will be the strongest events for the team. Karen Toper will be returning as the team's strongest breaststroker and the outlook is bright for a repeat of last year's strong showing in the relay events. Cahill expects that all five of Cortland's relays will be finalists in the state competition.

HARRIET R. HOLSTEN POOL

Cortland swimming teams are beginning their seventh season in the College's impressive Physical Education-Recreation Center. The pool is named in memory of the late Harriet R. Holsten who specialized in the aquatics area as a member of the physical education faculty at the College from 1929 to her retirement in 1972. She died in March 1977.

The Holsten Pool measures 45 feet by 50 meters and can be divided into three areas through the use of a pair of movable bulkheads. Generally, the bulkheads are used to allow separate areas for swimming and diving competition and warmups.

The pool is divided into six competitive lanes, while the diving area has two one-meter boards and two three-meter boards. Other features of the facility include an automatic timer and scoreboard, underwater lighting and a surface agitating system for diving competition.

The spectator gallery, on a steep enough angle so each person can see each swimming lane, has room for a crowd of 1,500. In addition to intercollegiate meets, the men's and women's pool also is used by local high schools, synchronized swim groups and for special exhibitions.
