#### BOB WALLACE

Head Coach

Now in his 17th season as head baseball coach at Cortland, Bob Wallace is one of the winningest coaches in college ranks. His teams have won 181, lost 85 and tied 1 for a .680 winning percentage. In the State University of New York Athletic Conference, Wallace-coached teams have won 100 and lost 40, a .710 winning percentage. Wallace has coached Cortland to five SUNYAC championships.

Wallace has B.S. and M.S. degrees from Cortland State. Before joining the Physical Education Department at his alma mater in 1956, he taught at Painted Post High School where he coached football, wrestling, track and volleyball. In addition to his baseball coaching at Cortland, Wallace has served as coach of freshman football and basketball and filled in as varsity basketball coach for a year.

The Cortland coach was named the 1973 recipient of the Cortland County Sports Award for his contributions to the world of sport.

#### AL STOCKHOLM

J.V. Coach

Al Stockholm is in his seventh year as coach of Cortland's JV baseball team. He is an assistant professor of physical education and is head basketball coach.

Stockholm is a graduate of East Stroudsburg State College and has an M.A. from Maryland. Before joining the Cortland staff, he was an instructor in physical education and basketball coach at Allegany Community College, Cumberland, Md.

#### RED DRAGON REPORT

A 22-game schedule faces Coach Bob Wallace and his Cortland State baseball team this spring. The Red Dragons have the benefit of a 10 game fall schedule in which they won 8 and lost 2. Two fall wins against Geneseo State will count in the SUNYAC standings. Nine lettermen are on the 24-man roster.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Cortland had four players named to the SUNYAC all-star team last year: pitcher John Worthing, first baseman Stuart Frankel, shortstop Tom Carroll and right fielder Martin Muscatiello. Carroll and Muscatiello are back for another season. Both are seniors.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

The Dragons were 7-11 overall in the spring of '73 and 6-5 in SUNYAC, good enough for fourth place. It was the first losing baseball season ever for Wallace-coached teams.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Mark Rotker, an all-conference first baseman in 1972 and 1973 while playing at Cortland, is working with Wallace as an assistant. Rotker is doing graduate work at Cortland. He's a native of Levittown.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Freshman Tom Pack of Liverpool is the only lefthanded pitcher available this spring. Righthanded throwers are two juniors, Bill Bartlett of Amenia and Garth Tymeson of Troy, and sophomore Randy Page of Clinton. Bartlett and Tymeson both had 3-1 records in the fall. Bartlett had the most strikeouts, 28 in 55 innings pitched. Seniors George Grimm of Snyder and Tom Kehoskie of Auburn probably will split the catching Chores. Grimm hit .357 in the fall. Junior Bill Evans of Syracuse fills the backup role.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

The infield assignments seem to be set at first base, third and short. Competition is heavy at second base however. Vying for starting roles are senior John Brady of Troy, Freshman Clem Caprara of Wappingers Falls and junior Jon Cooley of Clay. Brady and Cooley are lettermen. At first base will be junior Bob Graham of Massapequa, sophomore Bruce Randall of New York Mills will be at third, and the shortstop will be all-star Tom Carroll, a senior from Coxsackie. Carroll had 25 assists in the fall, high for the team.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Martin Muscatiello, all-SUNYAC rightfielder a year ago, heads the outfield crew. He is a senior from Rotterdam and hit .321 in 18 games last spring. Senior Jim Mix of Liverpool probably will start in left. He led the spring team in total bases with 34. Other leading OF candidates are sophomore Rich Dellork of Clay, Craig Johnsen of Staten Island and David Bowman of

Carthage.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \*

Jim Mix led the team last spring in home runs with 2 and triples with 5. Marty Muscatiello was the RBI leader with 13, and shared the lead with graduated Stu Frankel in most singles with 15.

#### THE COLLEGE AT CORTLAND

Cortland is one of 13 colleges of arts and sciences which are part of State University of New York. In addition, SUNY includes four university centers, two medical centers, six agricultural and technical colleges, and 38 community colleges. Together, these campuses offer students a choice of more than 3100 academic specialties representing more than 1500 different degree programs.

Cortland is organized into three divisions for undergraduate and graduate study: Arts and Sciences; Education; and Health, Physical Education and Recreation. The College has 36 separate academic majors. Enrollment is 4800 undergraduates and 1200 graduate students. The College was founded in 1868 and its alumni number more than 15,000.

With nearly one-third of the student body enrolled as majors in Health, Physical Education and Recreation, the College has completed a new PER Center which is pictured in the center of this brochure. Major facilities in the building include: a 50 meter swimming pool with a seating gallery to accommodate 1500; a main gymnasium with a capacity of 3600; and an ice arena with seats for 2500.
