LACROSSE

COACHES

Varsity: Al Pisano begins his fifth season as head lacrosse coach at Cortland with a 34-12-1 record. He has moved Cortland to the forefront in college lacrosse in his four years, including a national ranking of 12th in 1967. He also produced three All-Americans, Mike Waldvogel, Stan Kowalski and Pete Roy, last season. A 1961 graduate of Cortland, Al obtained his M.S. degree from Penn State and taught and coached at Berner High School on Long Island before returning to his alma mater. He also serves as an instructor in physical education and assistant football coach.

Freshmen: Toby Hargreave begins his first head coaching assignment with the freshman lacrosse team. A graduate of Cortland in January, 1968, he spent the remainder of the year on the teaching staff at the College. He is currently working toward his M.S. degree at Cortland as a graduate assistant. As an undergraduate, Toby participated in football, basketball, lacrosse and wrestling. He has served as an assistant football and basketball coach for two years.

1969 OUTLOOK

The 1969 Red Dragons will be led by two returning All-Americans, seniors Mike "Bones" Waldvogel and Stan Kowalski. Waldvogel was named to the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association Small College All-American first team, while Kowalski earned second team honors. Kowalski received All-American honors for the second year in succession, having earned honorable-mention acclaim as a sophomore.

Cortland should be well-manned on attack, midfield and defense. The big question to be resolved is who will play goalie. Junior Pete Roy, a second team All-American last season, is unable to play this season for medical reasons. Senior Vince Daniele and junior Frank Monte seem to be the most likely candidates to fill that all-important spot.

Junior Rich O'leary and sophomore John Eberenz are expected to lead Cortland on the attack. They will be joined in the front line by sophomore Jack McGetrick.

In addition to Kowalski, seniors Andy Oleski, John Molloy and Ken Hahn should provide experience at midfield. They will be pushed hard by sophomores Don Hallenbeck and Steve Steigerwald. Others who will see plenty of action are juniors Jim Race and Ed Schreiber and sophs Dean Peterson and Ed Zambraski. Pisano will have at least three lines to work with and he could go as deep as four or five.

Waldvogel will lead Cortland's tough defense. Senior Stan Holowinski and junior Dave Urick will fill the other two starting berths.

If Pisano can find the replacement he needs at goalie and everyone else performs as well as he is capable of performing, it could mean another good season for Cortland.

BASEBALL

COACHES

Varsity: Bob Wallace begins his 13th season as head coach of the Red Dragon baseball nine. He has never had a losing season and his teams have captured four SUNYAC conference titles. His teams have compiled an overall record of 118 wins, 44 losses and 1 tie. A 1953 graduate of Cortland, Bob was an outstanding quarterback during the "Chugger" Davis era. He returned to his alma mater in 1956 after three years at Painted Post High School. At Painted Post, his varsity football, wrestling, volleyball and track teams won league and sectional championships. In addition to his baseball duties he is an assistant professor of physical education and an assistant football coach.

Freshmen: Al Stockholm is in his second year on the Cortland coaching staff and his first as freshman baseball coach. He served as head basketball coach for the 1965-66 season, acting as a replacement for "Barney" Williams who was on a leave of absence from the College. He returned to Cortland in 1968 and again was named head basketball coach, this time on a full-time basis. Al is a 1961 graduate of East Stroudsburg State where he majored in health and physical education. The Montrose, Pa., native received his M.A. degree from the University of Maryland in 1963 and is currently working on his doctorate at Indiana University. He is an assistant professor of physical education at Cortland.

1969 OUTLOOK

Coach Wallace faces a major rebuilding year with his 1969 Red Dragon nine. Replacements are needed at three infield positions, catcher, and centerfield. First baseman Brian Cory and shortstop Randy Alexander, all-SUNYAC Conference selections, have graduated along with second baseman Harry Kost, catcher, Gary Howe and centerfielder Bob Yarris. Cory, Alexander and Yarris all were .300 hitters.

Returning from last year's 11-5 team are senior third baseman Bill Ketcham, a .314 hitter, senior leftfielder Don Congdon and All-Conference left-handed pitcher Fred Bruntrager.

Infielders Bob Church, Ed Gremli, Bill Palmer and Mike Bernstein, outfielders Tom Stevens, Bob Haff and Gerry Ruovo, and catcher Lou Foro, reserves on last year's squad, are expected to see plenty of action.

Several sophomore and transfer prospects also could make their presence felt. John Anselmo, Ken Torrey, Doug Doyle and Larry Baxter, all sophomores, and transfers Paul Chartrand and Max Malikow lead the contingent.

The bright spot on the team is the pitching staff. The only loss from last year is Al Greenberg, 4-1, and there are no seniors on the staff. In addition to Bruntrager, Wallace can call on Steve Remington, Dick Lewin, Dave Clover and John Nemcek, all experienced hurlers. Fred Ciampi and Ken Teetz. up from last year's frosh team, could break into the starting rotation.

If the pitchers perform as well as expected and the reserves mature under fire, Wallace could finish with his twelfth straight winning season.

TRACK

COACHES

Head Coach: Joe Pierson begins his third year as head track coach at Cortland. He is a 1961 graduate of Southern Illinois University and earned his master of science degree from S.I.U. in 1965. Joe coached and taught for one year at Carbondale High School in Illinois before joining the physical education staff at the U.S. Military Academy and proceeding to Cortland. He also is the indoor track coach and his team recently won the NYSCTFA indoor championship. In addition to his coaching duties, he serves as an assistant professor of physical education.

Assistant Coaches: Roger Robinson, head Red Dragon football coach, works with the jumpers on the track squad. He is in his sixth year at Cortland and is an associate professor of physical education. Dave Miller, in his 20th year on the Cortland staff, also is the head wrestling coach and has coached practically every sport offered at the College. He is a professor of physical education and supervises the field events on the track team.

1969 OUTLOOK

Coach Pierson expects to have an outstanding season based on the performance of the indoor track team and last year's outdoor team. Pierson will have everyone from the indoor team that recently completed its most successful season ever at Cortland.

Last year's team lost only one dual meet, placed second in SUN-YAC and third in the NYSCTFA meet. There were only two seniors on that team. The indoor team won its last two meets, the Union Invitational and the NYSCTFA Championship, in convincing fashion.

Senior Doug Bayly and sophomore Bob Devins should lead the way for the Red Dragon tracksters. Bayly has scored over a hundred points a season since coming to Cortland, while Devins is a consistent three-event winner in the sprints, long and high jumps. Roy Champagne could be the best Cortland has ever had in the 220 and 440 and Geoff Scarth has the potential to go over 14 feet in the pole vault.

Murray Banks and Ed Faulkner should lead the Red Dragons in the distance events. They were both consistent point winners in the mile and two mile last season. The middle distance events should be well-manned by Roy Pfiel, Pete DeFina, Steve Berry and Ed Hines, The only glaring weakness on the team is in the weights and throwing events.

TENNIS COACHES

Varsity: Reuben H. "Barney" Williams begins his twelfth year as head tennis coach. He came to Cortland in 1957 from Park College and assumed both tennis and junior varsity basketball coaching positions. He also served as head basketball coach until last season. He previously served three years at Park and six years at Steven's Institute.

A native of Chambersburg, Pa., Barney graduated from West Chester State in 1947 where he competed in football, basketball, tennis and track. At Cortland he is an associate professor of physical education.

Freshmen: Pat Siracusa begins his first coaching assignment with the freshman tennis team. He received his B.S. degree in physical education from Cortland in 1965 and is currently working on his M.S. degree at the College. Prior to returning to Cortland in 1968, Pat was a physical education instructor in the Wappingers Central School District in Wappingers Falls, N. Y.

1969 OUTLOOK

Improving upon last year's 2-5 mark and a fourth place SUNYAC tournament finish will not be an easy chore for the Red Dragon tennis squad. Coach Williams sees a rough road ahead in regular season play with the possibility of some improvement coming in the SUNYAC conference meet which will be held at Cortland, May 9-10.

Two key players are missing from last year's squad. Brian Cohen and Paul Reinhardt, the number two and three men on the team. won't be back this season. Cohen won the State tournament second flight while Reinhardt was the runner-up in the third flight. Captain Dave Strebel, the team's number one player, will be back to fill that slot again this season. He was runner-up in the first flight of the State tournament. Also returning are Gary Burghdurf, Dan Cabin and Bob VanSchaick, the numbers four, five and six men from last year.

Coach Williams was counting on Larry Carp, the number one man on last year's freshman team, to move into the number two slot with the varsity, but Carp will miss most of the season with a broken hand.
