"The Challenge Of Change"

Through the years, American institutions of higher education have continually expanded their role in response to the nation's needs. Since its founding in 1868, State University of New York's College at Cortland has followed this tradition, broadening its role from normal school, to teachers college, to college of education and now to a college of arts and sciences. In keeping with this tradition, "The Challenge of Change" has been chosen as the Centennial theme for the College at Cortland in 1967-68. The College is observing its 100th anniversary throughout the academic year with a full program of special events to commemorate this historic milestone in its development.

A great deal has happened to the College at Cortland in its first hundred years. It has grown from ten faculty members, a handful of students and one building on a five-acre lot to 300 faculty members, 3,400 students and 22 major buildings on a 140acre campus.

The institution received its state charter in 1868 after residents of Cortland County, seeing a need for higher education in central New York and particularly for providing a means of preparing teachers, joined to establish a school. Local residents raised \$100,000 for the launching of the school which was housed in a new building at the site of the present Cortland County Courthouse.

This interest and support on the part of Cortland area residents has continued and flourished. It was evidenced no more clearly than in 1919 when fire destroyed the original building. Within four days the school was in operation again—in rooms made available by churches and civic organizations as well as in some private homes. Four years later, the school reopened its doors under one roof in a new million dollar structure on the present hilltop campus.

Today, the College offers bachelor of arts and bachelor of science degrees in 35 areas in the arts and sciences; elementary and early secondary education; and health, physical education and recreation. There are also opportunities for teacher certification and master's degree programs are offered in an increasing number.

Cortland's physical development has been stimulated by a \$32 million building program between the years 1962 and 1970. Included is a new fine arts center housing the Departments of Art, Music and Speech and Theatre. Sperry Learning Resources Center provides modern technological approaches to learning in sophisticated class room settings and lecture halls. Bowers Hall is being doubled in size to meet the needs of the College's four science departments, Biology, Chemistry, Geology and Physics. And the Library has more than doubled its holdings to more than 160,000 volumes within the last five years.

COACHES

Varsity: Reuben H. "Barney" Williams begins his fifth year at the Cortland helm with a 47-31 record. He came to Cortland from Park College in 1957 and assumed the duties of junior varsity basketball coach. He had been head coach for three years at the Missouri school. Prior to his stint at Park, Barney spent six years as JV coach at Steven's Institute.

The Chambersburg, Pennsylvania native graduated from Westchester State in 1947 where he competed in football, basketball, tennis and track. At Cortland he is an associate

professor of men's physical education and serves as the varsity tennis coach in the Spring.

Freshman: Andy Grieve came to Cortland in 1965 and assumed the duties of freshman football and basketball coach. He is a graduate of New York University and Ithaca College. Andy is in his twentieth year of coaching, seventeen of which were spent in the high school ranks. He is an assistant professor of men's physical education.

1967-68 **OUTLOOK**

1967-68 could be a good year for the Red Dragon hardwooders who seem to have an adequate stockpile of balance and experience returning. They will attempt to rebound from last year's disapointing 7-13 mark which fell short of pre-season expectations. Gone via the graduation route is captain and floor leader Paul Fernandez but seven lettermen including four starters return to the Dragon fold. Scoring leader John Miller (17.6) and top rebounder Bob Chrust (126) along with Rod Verkey and Bill Williams will be expected to carry much of the load through the 19 game schedule.

Also expected to add to the Dragon potential is sophomore Bob Alspaugh who at 6'5" led last year's frosh in scoring with a 14.6 average. Other lettermen who should see considerable action on a squad that makes up in depth what it lacks in height are Joe Tuttle and Terry Gaskill.

WRESTLING

COACHES



Varsity: Dave Miller begins his 19th year on the Cortland staff with an overall wrestling record of 124-65-3. He graduated from Cortland in 1936 and received his master's degree from Syracuse University. He taught and coached at Phelps and Sherburne high schools and spent four years in the service before returning to his alma mater in 1948.

Since then he has coached football, soccer, cross country, track, and wrestling. He is also a professor in the men's P.E. department.

Freshman: Vince Gonino is a graduate of Ohio State University where he was also a Big Ten wrestling champion. This will be his third campaign at Cortland where he also serves as freshman football coach and as an instructor in the P.E. department.

1967-68 OUTLOOK

The 1967-68 edition of the State University College at Cortland wrestling team is into pre-season workouts and taking aim at another banner year on the mats.

Coach Dave Miller is beginning his 19th year at Cortland and faces the prospect of having a team which will be strong through the middle weights and weaker in the light and heavyweight classes. Seven lettermen return for the Red-Dragon grapplers who lost two blue chip boys via graduation in Doug Prato and Paul Rose, both former SUNY champions.

The return of Bill DeSario, a senior from North Bellmore, New York who finished 6th in last year's N.C.A.A. championships in the 130 pound class, will bolster a lineup of returnees which includes Dave Bundy, 137, John Camelio, 191, Mike Dunford, 137, John Mulada, 152, Dave Sherman, 145, and Mike Tully, 167.

Coach Miller also looks for possible help from the sophomore ranks in Ken Furnkranz at 123, Bill Martin in 177, Terry Pearl at 152, Paul Seamans at 137, and Brian Hunt at 191 or heavyweight.

There is plenty of time before the December 12 opener against Oneonta for the 25 prospects to round into shape and Coach Miller may do some weight class shifting before the season begins and the Dragons try to improve on last year's 8-1 mark.

Miller is optimistic about his team's chances and he has good right to be as they have been SUNY conference champions four times since 1961 and runners-up the other three years. The Dragons do face a rough schedule this season which includes the likes of Syracuse University, Springfield which has been tops in New England for more than a decade, and Oneonta.



Jack Boehm is in his second year on the Cortland staff and also beginning his second season as the Red-Dragon swimming coach. He is a graduate of Indiana University where he received both his BS and MS degrees. Prior to his appointment at Cortland, Jack served as an instructor in physical education at Niagara University.

Jack also coaches cross country at Cortland and his 1967 team was the finest on record compiling a 7-1-1, placing high in a number of invitational meets, and winning the SUNY conference championship.

Jack is also an instructor in the physical education department.

1967-68 OUTLOOK

The 1967-68 Red Dragon swimming team will be hard- pressed to improve on last year's 3-8 mark, due mainly to the loss via graduation of All American Bob McMurray who swam every event for Cortland and won a good share of them. Six lettermen return on the Dragon team including Gary Seaman who finished 3rd in the SUNYAC tournament swimming the individual medley. Also expected to carry a good share of the load are Jay Wendell in the freestyle event and sophomore Ed Hines in the breast stroke.

Tough competition will again be the story with the two strongest opponents coming in the first week of the season as both Buffalo State and Oneonta will invade the Moffett Center pool. The Red Dragons strength this year will lie in depth but they will be lacking in experience having lost three key seniors.

Before coming back to Cortland Bill coached and taught at Vestal Central High, Hamilton College, and Hamburg High. In addition to his coaching duties Bill is also freshman Lacrosse coach.


1967-68 OUTLOOK

Coach Bill Tomik is a realist more than he is an optimist and his outlook for the 1967-68 Cortland gymnastics team is based on frankness and the realization that there aren't many boys on the team with a lot of experience. Consequently, Coach Tomik was moved to remark "We're going to take our licks this year but we're looking ahead. The boys have a good attitude and have been working hard".

The prospects, in truth, are not bright but there is potential there. Only two lettermen return from last year's 2-7 squad. Gone are Art Murphy, Dick Zaikowski, George Cuadrado, the boys who pretty much constituted the nucleus of the team. They will be hard to replace, especially since there is not much help available from last year's frosh team.

With only eight upperclassmen on the team any injury will play havoc on Red Dragon possibilities against the tough competition they face. Junior co-captain Mike Robilotto will be expected to carry much of the load with help from outstanding sophomore Ray Berman. Robilotto is the most versatile performer on the squad being able to compete in all seven events while Berman is the only team member with highschool gymnastics experience. Most of Tomik's charges are in only their second or third year of competition with some of the varsity boys competing for the first time. Also expected to provide some punch to the Red Dragon effort are senior Tom McCarthy and Al Leslie a junior.

While not expecting a banner year this campaign Coach Tomik is optimistic about the future with some bright prospects on this year's frosh team and the probability that many of his boys will pick up some valuable experience against top-flight competition.

Joe Pierson begins his second year en the Cortland staff and his second campaign as indoor track coach. He is a 1961 graduate of Southern Illinois University where he also earned his master's degree in 1965. In addition to his coaching duties Joe is an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department.

1967-68 OUTLOOK

Prospects for the 1967-68 indoor track team look pretty bright with a number of experienced lettermen returning to don the togs for Coach Joe Pierson.

This will be the first season that Cortland has been able to schedule home meets due to the installation of new heating units in Lusk Field House. The 220 yard oval track will allow all combinations of reguation running events.

The Red Dragons will be without the services of five outstanding graduated lettermen but should be able to pick up a lot of the slack on the strength of the undefeated freshman outdoor track team of last year. Gone are All American Bob Fitts, Harris Silver, Tom Rogan, Jim Ripley and Gerald Hollings. Returning are Doug Bayly, a strong high hurdler and pole vaulter; three strong distance men in Murray Banks, Ed Faulkner and Ron Fleury; Chuck Kerrigan in the weights; Tim Hale in the high jump; and Dave Hill in the sprints.

1967-68 OUTLOOK
