

CAROLE MUSHIER

Field Hockey Coach

Carole Mushier is beginning her fourth year as field hockey coach at Cortland. She played the sport herself while attending Boston University and was a member of sectional teams which played in seven U.S. Field Hockey Association national tournaments. She also played with the 1964 Women's Lacrosse Association team which competed in Great Britain and Ireland.

She has a master's degree from Columbia
University and a Ph.D. from the University of
Southern California where she was an N.D.E.A.
Fellow. She is the author of two books on team
sports for girls and women and served for several
years as director of women's intercollegiate
athletics at East Stroudsburg State College.

Dr. Mushier is the current president of the New York State Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. And she is the director of the 1974 NYSAIAW Field Hockey Tournament which will be conducted in Cortland Oct. 25-26.

FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Cortland's 1973 team compiled a 9-2 record on the way to winning the championship tournament of the New York State Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. The team has played in the championship final in each of the last three years.

Since Carole Mushier has been coaching the team, Cortland's field hockey record stands at 11-8-3. The J.V. team, which had no scheduled

games three years ago, has nine games to play this fall. The J.V. record in 1973 was 5-0.

Dr. Mushier says that this year's schedule is the most difficult ever faced by the field hockey team at Cortland. All of the top four-year colleges in New York State are scheduled as well as three of the highest ranking teams in Pennsylvania, Penn State, East Stroudsburg and Lock Haven. "The highest level of competition" is the stated objective in field hockey scheduling at Cortland.

Tennis

SYLVIA STOKES

Tennis Coach

Cortland's tennis coach, Sylvia Stokes, has a rich background in the sport as a player and coach. She teaches tennis as an activity course at the College in addition to her coaching duties. She is a member of the U.S. Lawn Tennis Association. She was born in England and played field hockey there.

In recent summers, Mrs. Stokes has been tennis director during Women's Week at Golden

Valley Sports Camp in Sidney, N.Y. From 1954 to 1960, she was tournament director for girls' tennis in the Eastern Lawn Tennis Circuit.

She has won a number of titles in doubles competition and played in the first all-amateur National Tennis Championships in Rochester. In international competition, she played on the Marsh Cup teams involving the U.S. and Canada.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Winning has become a habit with the women's tennis team at Cortland and indications are that the 1974 fall season will see more of the same. Last year, the team had a 6-1-0 record in the fall and finished 5-0-1, in spring activity.

For the last two years, Cortland has played in the tournament conducted by the NYS Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. The tourney attracts about 20 colleges each year. Last spring was the first time that a State team champion was determined in the competition and Cortland finished second to Ithaca. In 1972, when there was no team title, Cortland won the State doubles championship while Lehman College took the singles crown.

Cortland's women tennis players took three straight SUNY tournament titles in the last three years before the tournament was dropped in favor of the NYSAIAW championships.

The 1974-75 team appears to be strong in singles talent but needs some work to develop first line doubles entries.

Volleyball

NORMA CARR

Volleyball Coach

Norma Carr has been a faculty member at Cortland for four years. A graduate of UCLA, she has a master's degree from the University of Washington and a Ph.D. from Ohio State University.

Before coming to Cortland, Dr. Carr was a teaching associate at Ohio State while she was

doing graduate work. Previously, she was a teacher and administrator in the women's intercollegiate athletic program at the University of Washington. She also has taught physical education in the Los Angeles school system.

In addition to volleyball, Dr. Carr has coached basketball, bowling, badminton and tennis. She holds the academic rank of associate professor.

VOLLEYBALL REPORT

A total of 64 candidates tried out for the women's volleyball team at Cortland at the start of the college year. Dr. Norma Carr, coach of the team, conducted an intensive three days of testing to narrow the group down. Included in the try out program were a series of strength and conditioning tests, volleyball skills tests and written exercises on the rules and strategies connected with the sport. "Conditioned and knowledgeable players" were Dr. Carr's goals in selecting the final 14 players who comprise the team.

The team practices two hours daily in preparing for the season and continually works on strength flexibility and skills. Playing 15point games, the women's team will be competing most frequently in best of five game matches with opposing colleges on the schedule. Some matches may be two out of three.

A tough obstacle this fall for the Cortland team is that only two of eight regular season games are at home. A State district tournament however, will be at Cortland Nov. 16.
