Returning this year as head mentor of the varsity squad is Reuben H. (Barney) Williams. Barney was on sabbatical last year to work on his doctorate at the University of Maryland.

He first came to Cortland in 1957 when he assumed the duties of junior varsity basketball coach. He came from Park College in Missouri where he was head basketball coach for three years.

Before going to Park College, he was at Steven's Institute for six years as J.V. basketball coach.

He played intercollegiate ball at West Chester (Pa.) State College, graduating from there in 1947. He also played basketball while in the service.

At Cortland, Barney is associate professor of men's physical education.

1966-67 OUTLOOK

Barney Williams foresees another rebuilding year for the 1966-67 "Red Dragon" hoopsters. The team will be built around 5'7" senior captain Paul Fernandes of Malverne, N.Y. Paul, the only senior on the team, has been the number one defensive man for the past two years. He is the type of hustling player that every coach would like to have on his team.

Only two lettermen, in addition to Fernandes, are returning to the squad. They are: Terry Gaskill, a junior from Uniondale, and junior Joe Tuttle from Hammondsport.

The freshman team from last year should be a big help for Williams. Two reasons are the number 1-2 scorers and rebounders: sophomores Bob Chrust of Jamaica and Bill Williams of Homer, N.Y.

Cortland has added an in-season tournament, the first in 11 years, to their schedule, namely the Pocono Christmas Classic to be held at East Stroudsburg, December 27-29. Cortland's first opponent for the Classic will be the always powerful University of Delaware.

Thirteen athletes, 1 senior, four juniors and eight sophomores, comprise the 1966-67 varsity team. "The season outcome depends on how fast the sophomores can handle themselves in varsity competition," according to coach Williams.
