

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK, **COLLEGE AT CORTLAND**

Located atop one of the many hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys", the State University College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School. Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of the legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a college, providing four-year courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, the state legislature incorporated Cortland College into the new State University of New York.

Today, more than 5,600 undergraduate and 600 graduate students are pursuing degrees within the College's two academic divisions - Arts and Sciences and Professional Studies. Twenty-three departments with a faculty of more than 300 offer the Cortland State student body some 40 majors from which to choose, including liberal arts, elementary and secondary education, health and physical education, recreation education, speech education and speech & hearing handicapped education.

The College's main campus covers 140 acres and includes 30 major buildings. Thirteen of these structures are residence halls and provide on-campus housing for 2,600 students.

At Cortland State, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland State participates in 28 intercollegiate sports - 14 men's and 14 women's - in an attempt to provide a broad program of athletics which will meet the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The stated objective of the College's athletic program is the development and welfare of the student. In the coaching of individual sports as well as in the direction of the overall athletic program, the College endeavors to provide a high calibre of professional leadership which is consistent with the goals of the institution.


Cortland State is particularly proud of its long tradition of intercollegiate athletics and its high standing in small college athletic circles. In support of this heritage, the College offers its student-athletes a

number of outstanding indoor and outdoor facilities which are used for intercollegiate competition as well as educational and recreational purposes. The Park Center for Physical Education and Recreation, opened in 1973, featues a main gymnasium with a seating capacity of 3,600, an Olympic-size swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500, and an ice arena which can accomodate 2,500 spectators.

In addition, Lusk Field House provides an extensive area for indoor practice sessions and activity classes and is the home of th men's and women's indoor track teams. The College has approximately 50 acres of athletic fields. Davis Field, with a seating capacity of 5,000, is the home of the Red Dragon Football and lacrosse squads. Adjacent to Davis Field and the Park Center are 24 tennis courts.



WELCOME TO CORTLAND: THE CROWN CITY

Nestled in the "heart" of New York State, Cortland County is a semi-rural area situated among rolling hills and pleasant valleys. The city of Cortland is alternately nicknamed "The Crown City", because it is the highest (1,129 feet above sea level) incorporated city in New York, and "The City of Seven Valleys", because its location is the converging point for seven valleys along the edge of the Appalachin plateau.

Cortland has a rich background of early history. Five centuries ago, the land was a hunting ground for the Indians of the Iroquois Confederation, whose organizer was the famed Hiawatha. The first white settlers came here in 1792. In 1808, Cortland County was formed, taking its name from General Pierre Van Cortland, the

first Lieutenant Governor of New York State.

Over the years, Cortland County would produce a New York State Governor, Nathan Miller, as well as a U.S. Supreme Court Justice, Samuel Nelson, and 1904 U.S. Presidential candidate, Alton B. Parker, who was the Chief Justice of the New York State Court of Appeals.

The County has also been the home of numerous college presidents, explorers, and inventors such as Alexander T. Brown, inventor of the L. C. Smith typewriter, and Horace White, who discovered cellophane. Cortland County also lists the legendary New York Giants baseball manager John J. McGraw among its native sons.

Today, Cortland County remains a beautiful place for its 48,000 inhabitants to live and work. The city of

Cortland, the county seat, serves both as a center of government and business to the 48,000 residents of Cortland County.

Cortland serves as the seat to one of the Empire State's premier dairy counties. Half of the county's land is devoted to agriculture. While the dairy industry is king, Cortland County also produces maple products and that integral ingredient of a reuben sandwich - sauerkraut.

With three excellent ski centers in the County, Cortland is the undisputed "Ski Capital of Central New York". During the summer months, nearby lakes offer boating and a variety of water sports, while many golf courses and tennis facilities also meet the recreational needs of the area.

Recreation is just a part of the diversified local industrial base. Known nationally, Smith-Corona Typewriter Co. has its roots in Cortland County. After more than 60 years, this world's largest producer of portable typewriters continues to play an important role in the region's economy.

Other manufactured products in Cortland County include: clothing, overhead doors, canoes and small boats, fish line, tennis rackets, industrial filters, soap powders, paints and filaments, and fabricated houses.

Cortland area residents are proud of their 55 churches, their modern hospital, and their more than 100 small retail stores and businesses. But the real pride of local citizens can be found in their commitment to education.

This history of elementary education in Cortland is older than the County itself. The first schoolhouse was constructed in 1800. Higher education became a reality in 1868, when the State Legislature provided for the Cortland State Normal School, the forerunner of State University College at Cortland today. The local support of education remains strong as student needs are being met in several elementary, junior high and senior high schools, as well as at Tompkins-Cortland Community College and Cortland State.

In this same spirit of educational support, the County Legislature, the Mayor of Cortland and the Cortland County Chamber of Commerce, speaking on behalf of the people of Cortland County, welcome the outstanding student-athletes, their coaches, parents and friends to the "Crown City".
