#### HEAD COACH BOB WALLACE

Coach Bob Wallace is in his 21st year as head coach of Cortland's varsity baseball team. He is the winningest coach in the history of Cortland athletics. Since he took over the baseball reins, Cortland's baseball record stands at 250 wins, 145 losses and a tie. Since the SUNY Athletic Conference began in 1959, Wallace-coached teams have won the title eight times.

Wallace is a 1944 graduate of Onondaga Valley Academy High School in Syracuse, N.Y. As a high school athlete he was selected to All-City Teams in basketball, football, and baseball. Following graduation he enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served in the Pacific and Mediterranean Theatres of Operation.

He attended Colgate University in 1947-48 and was starting halfback on an undefeated freshman football team. Transferring to Cortland State in 1949, Wallace graduated with a major in physical education in 1953. At Cortland, he played football for 3 years and baseball for 1 year. During his senior year he was a member of the Varsity football coaching staff.

Before joining the Physical Education Department at his alma mater in 1956, he taught at Painted Post High School where he coached varsity football, wrestling, track and volleyball. All of his teams were successful in winning league, county or sectional championships. In addition to his baseball coaching at Cortland, Wallace served as assistant varsity football coach, freshman football and basketball coach and also filled in as varsity basketball coach for a year.

The Cortland coach was named the 1973 recipient of the Cortland County Sports Award for his contributions to the world of sport. In 1975 he was voted Coach of the Year by his fellow State University Baseball Conference coaches.

#### 1978 SPRING OUTLOOK

Nine seniors on the 1976-77 baseball team graduated and Coach Bob Wallace faced a major rebuilding year as the 1978 spring team gathered for diamond duty. The losses were heavy, including All SUNYAC and All-Upstate New York outfielders Dave Bowman and George Smith; All SUNYAC and All-Upstate first baseman Art Cotugno; All-SUNYAC pitcher Paul Bianco; and starting catcher Joe Papillo.

On the bright side, Wallace welcomed back two SUNYAC all-stars, pitcher Dan Revai of Massena and outfielder Gary Piper of Wantagh. Also returning are catchers Joe Edgley of Wellsville and Mike Chiapparelli of Mamaroneck, first baseman Jim Johnson of Binghamton, shortstop Alberto Maccou of Jamaica and two third basemen - Mike Brooks of Huntington and Glenn Shiebler of East Patchogue.

Seven members of the team have moved up from junior varsity status a year ago. They are infielders Bob VanMeter of Rome, Jeff Maisonet of Newburgh, and Mike Maiorano of Staten Island. Joining the outfield crew from the JV are Dave Bendlin of Howells and George Casey of Marlboro. Two other JV promotions are pitcher Pete Kowalski of Lyon Mountain and catcher Matt Senk of East Northport.

Coach Wallace also can look for some help from several transfer students. Shortstop Gary Michell of White Plains is from Westchester Community College; outfielder Mark Barriere of Camillus comes from Onondaga Community College; first baseman Kevin Rich played at South Carolina; pitcher Steve Colt of Lansing

played at Alfred Tech; and pitcher Pete Daddio of Westbury was at Ithaca College.

Other experienced players on the club are pitchers Chris Brunelle of Yorktown Heights and Bob Forman of Port Chester.

Wallace also has added four freshmen to the roster. They are pitchers Tom Fountain of Geneva, Ray Gadd of North Babylon and Bob Schlanger of Kingston, plus catcher Doug Moonan of Pulaski.

Wallace says this is one of the youngest clubs in terms of varsity experience that Cortland has fielded in recent years. He believes that his defense is reasonably solid but that the hitting and pitching aspects of the game are in need of some rapid seasoning if the team is to repeat as SUNYAC champions.
