Field Hockey Coach

Carole Mushier enters year number five as Cortland coach, having steadily upgraded the program each season to a point where Cortland now plays most of the top teams in New York and Pennsylvania.

Dr. Mushier is president of the New York State Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women and president-elect of the Eastern AIAW as well as serving as Region IA coordinator for field hockey.

A graduate of Boston University with a master's degree from Columbia and a doctorate from Southern California, Dr. Mushier was a member of sectional teams which played in seven U.S. Field Hockey Association national tournaments, and also played with the 1964 Women's Lacrosse Association team in a tour of Ireland and Great Britain.

The author of two books on team sports for women, she was director of women's intercollegiate athletics for several years at East Stroudsburg.

Golf Coach

Entering her 16th year as a member of the Cortland faculty is Sally Wallace, golf coach in the fall and softball coach in the spring. In addition, she has coached basketball and swimming while at Cortland.

A native of Rochester, she is a Cortland graduate and has an M.S. degree from the school as well. Active in Cortland's alumni affairs, she is a past member of the Alumni Association Board of Directors.

Chairman of the Golf Section of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, she is also an active member in state and national athletic and physical education organizations.

Tennis Coach

Cortland's new tennis coach for 1975 is Joy Buffan, a former Cortland player herself.

After graduating from Cort-

land, she completed her M.S. degree at Penn State.

She has also been a teacher in the Gates-Chili schools in Gates, N.Y. and was director of the Eastman Kodak Co. Junior Tennis Program.

Volleyball Coach

Beulah "Buff" Wang hasn't coached at Cortland for four years, but her last volleyball team went to the nationals.

Returning from a leave of absence, she succeeds Dr. Norma Carr, who led last season's team to the eastern regionals.

A graduate of Mankato State College in Minnesota, she also received an M.A. degree from the University of Iowa.

In addition to her duties at Cortland, she has taught in Turkey at three separate times for a total of over 10 years. She has also taught at schools in Iowa, Oregon and Michigan.

Field Hockey Outlook

By reaching the final game of the state tournament a year ago, Cortland now has made it to the title game in each of four consecutive seasons. The loss to Ithaca made Cortland a runnerup and completed another successful season at 5-4-2.

With coach Mushier's record now at 16-12-5, Cortland still has one of the most difficult schedules among eastern teams. With the stated objective of "the highest possible level of competition," Cortland again has scheduled the top teams in New York and Pennsylvania.

Defending champion Ithaca, also one of Cortland's top rivals, will host this season's state tournament.

With regional play now in a team situation rather than an all-star format, Cortland has an opportunity to go beyond a state tourney title quest with as many as five New York State teams possibly being invited to the regional tournament.

Though nine seniors graduated after last year, there is a nucleus of 14 returning members of the 1974 squad back on the roster including the players responsible for close to half of last year's scoring.
