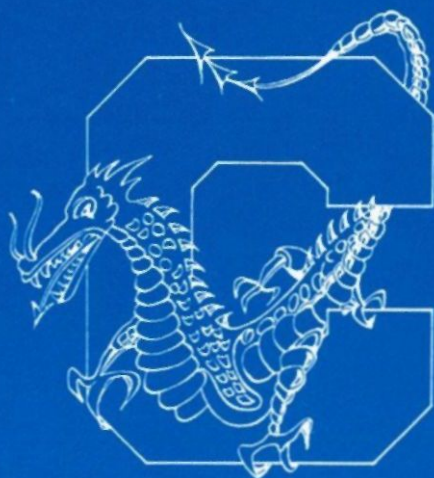

BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

With only three members of last year's 11-10 team graduated, Cortland's Coach Al Stockholm is looking to cushion his 29-29 three-year record.

The Dribbling Dragons will be small, good shooters capable of playing good defense. The team has good experience, as seven lettermen are on hand, including four in starting spots.

Stockholm feels that the Hillmen should be in every game if the squad exercises good ball handling and can keep taller opponents from dominating the boards. Again, a man-to-man defense will be used with an occasional halfcourt press. A bevy of quick guards could make the press effective.

The offense will be a bit more controlled this season as a team pattern has been installed to go along with previously-used two and three-man pro-style free-lancing. Last winter the Red Dragons averaged 77.3 points per game on offense and the top three returnees accounted for 44.2 of these points.

Mike Eidel, 5-11 senior guard from Poughkeepsie, was the leader with 17.4 points a contest, followed by 6-2 senior forward Earl Rogers of Binghamton who chipped in 15.6 a game, and 5-10 junior guard Bob Antin from New York City who averaged 11.2. Antin, a late-season starter, scored 18, 22, 30 and 31 points in the last four games a year ago.

Rogers led the team in rebounding last season, averaging 13.4 over the season and 14.2 within the SUNYAC, making him the loop's number two rebounder. He and Eidel both made All-Conference, as the Dragons' 7-3 SUNYAC record tied them for second place.

Helping Rogers, an All-America receiver in football, on the boards will be another griddler, 6-3 senior Dan Riggins from Wallkill, a sometimes-starter last year. Additional help will come from 6-4 junior Dwight Rees and 6-4 soph Sylvester Murray.

FROSH: The infant Dragons could turn out to be one of the best frosh teams on the hill in years. There is a strong set of guards on hand for more outside strength than usual, while the front line will combine fair height with good inside agility and quickness. The first unit will likely come from a combination of frontliners — Steve Buck, Bob Cohen, John Jackson and Steve Zielinski — while the backcourt will be selected from Frank Schembre, George Renton, Mike O'Flaherty and Tim Kelly.

COACHES

VARSITY: Al Stockholm begins his fourth season with hopes of climbing above the .500 mark. His three-year mark is 29-29. He played both basketball and baseball as an undergrad at East Stroudsburg and holds a master's from Maryland. He coached two years at Allegany, Md., Junior College before accepting his present position as an assistant professor in the Physical Education Department. Currently working on a doctorate at the University of Indiana, Al last year directed his cagers to a 7-3 SUNYAC record, good for third place.

ASSISTANT: John Snell is a graduate of Nebraska State College at Kearney where he played two years of varsity basketball and three years of varsity tennis. He taught and coached for nine years in Nebraska high schools and handled varsity basketball for seven seasons, finishing as runner-up in the state tournament one year. He also coached a high school All-American. He holds a master's from the University of Nebraska and is just completing his doctorate at the University of Indiana.

STUDENT ASSISTANT: Senior Bruce Goldmacher enters his second year in this capacity.

FRESHMAN: Andy Grieve came to Cortland in 1965 and assumed the duties of freshman coach in basketball and football. Grieve received his bachelor's degree from New York University and his master's degree from Ithaca College. He spent 17 years in the high school ranks and, before joining the Cortland faculty, was director of health, physical education and recreation at Sherburne High School where he was head football and basketball coach for nine years. Andy is an assistant professor of physical education and was also defensive backfield coach of the Varsity football team this fall.

FROSH ASSISTANT: Chuck Brady is working on a master's in recreation education after teaching and coaching high school for one year. A three-year starter at LeMoyne from 1966-69 and captain his senior year, he proved quite a nemesis to Cortland in LeMoyne-Cortland games. He should help the big men considerably.

GYMNASTICS OUTLOOK

With seven returning lettermen and more depth than usual on hand, the Dragon gymnasts don't feel they're being overly optimistic in thinking they have a good chance, barring injuries, of improving upon their last year's third-place finish in the North Atlantic Gymnastics League.

The only loss through graduation is Ray Berman, considered perhaps the best side horse man Cortland has ever had. Top returnees include Ron Coulson, Gary Drennan and Karl Cutler. It is hoped that additional help will come from soccer player Billy Bulgin and a trio of promising freshmen.

Coulson placed seventh in last year's college division NCAA Finals in the long horse vault at Mankato State after overcoming an early season injury. He finished second in the NAGL Finals a year ago but could be the blue medalist this time around. He will be competing as an all-around man this year.

Drennan is called probably the best horizontal bar man Cortland has ever had. He took a second in last year's NAGL and could expect to do better except for the fact that he will be handicapped this season by a concurrent student teaching assignment. Cutler finished fifth in the same event at the same meet last year and should be improved. Bulgin has a good deal of potential and could be one of the squad's all-around men.

It seems that the Dragons are traditionally weak in the rings and floor exercise and this year looks to be no exception, a circumstance that will hurt team scores considerably. Also to be considered in the team outlook is the fact that the level of competition in college gymnastics is moving ahead very fast, making our opponents a good bit stronger, especially those that actively recruit, a practice that Cortland does not engage in.

COACH

Bill Tomik begins his 12th season as head gymnastics coach. A 1951 Cortland graduate, he received his master's from Syracuse in 1956 and his doctorate from Maryland in 1968. Before returning to Cortland, Bill coached and taught at Vestal Central High School, Hamilton College and Hamburg High School. As an undergraduate at Cortland he was an all-around performer on the varsity gymnastics team for four years and also played two years of varsity soccer. He has also coached soccer and lacrosse at the college level.

INDOOR TRACK

With 18 lettermen back from last year's team that won three invitational meets, tied for first in another, and ran away with Dragontown's third straight NYSCTFA-Conference Meet, things look good for coach Joe Pierson's indoor tracksters.

The team will be deeper than ever before as several community college transfers and a number of freshmen will be on hand to add some quality depth — an ingredient marked by its absence in recent campaigns under the roof.

To win consecutive conference meet number four, the team will have to overcome the loss of four key men through graduation. Middle distance men Terry Horton and Ed Hines, distance man Ed Faulkner and pole vaulter Geoff Scarth must be replaced.

The team strengths will be the sprints and the jumping events, all insured by the presence of senior Bob Devins who holds a host of school and track records. Devins has marks to his credit of 6.2 in the 60, 6-6 in the high jump and 23-6 in the long jump. He will be tough to beat in all three of his specialties. His younger brother, Barry, a freshman, has a tough act to follow but has posted high school bests of 6-2 in the high jump and has been over 21' in the long jump. If Barry improves, opponents may be seeing some double-Devins finishes.

Additional sprint help will come from Jim Ramsey, Dan Houtman and Cobblekill transfer Gary Johnson who has been clocked at 9.5 in the 100 and 6.1 in the 60. This gives the team four men who are all under 9.8 outdoors.

Devins gets help in the high jump from lanky sophomore Steve Suto who has an indoor best of 6-4, and in the long jump from senior Jim Keough who has done 23-5.

The middle distances also will be strong with returnees Pete Defina, conference 600 champ, and soph Dennis Lynch again on hand. Hopes in the mile and two-mile rest with returnee Don Myers and freshman cross country whiz Phil Bonfiglio.

Apparent weaknesses will be lack of depth in both the hurdles and the pole vault. Gary Drennan tied for the conference vaulting championship last year at 14' but appears to be the only vaulter out.

Other transfers counted on for points include footballer Al Brunetti, a 51' shot putter last season at Nassau Community, and distance men Bob Fenton, Greg Nitti, Bob Tennenbaum and Jim Gorney, all of whom have just finished running cross country.

Pierson foresees the strongest challenges coming from Syracuse, Cornell, Colgate, Lehigh and Rochester, no surprises since all were strong a year ago. If the freshmen and transfers come through, and if the veterans stay healthy, the Runnin' Red Dragons should make it hot for everyone else on the schedule come the cold season.

COACH

Joe Pierson is in his fifth year, both at Cortland and as head track coach. He is a 1961 graduate of Southern Illinois University where he competed in the long jump and high jump. He earned his M.S. from S.I.U. in 1965. Upon graduation he taught and coached at Carbondale, Ill., High before accepting a "uniformed civilian" position at West Point where, for three years, he headed up research — especially pertaining to athletic injuries — for the Physical Education Department in addition to handling the conditioning programs for the football and basketball teams. He returned to teach at his alma mater for one year before accepting his present post. He is an assistant professor of physical education.

SKIING OUTLOOK

Six lettermen and nine freshmen will comprise the bulk of the Dragon slopers who will be hopefully eyeing a 10-meet schedule. Last year the team got to compete only three times as six meets were canceled for one reason or another. Returnees Bob Napolitano, John Kowal and Dave Nass will be the leading cross country skiers in a group that must replace graduated Marc Shale and Mike May.

The jumping team stays pretty much intact as Dave Tyminski, Jeff Mols, Kowal and Napolitano are all back to form an experienced unit that should perform better than average. The long loss through graduation is Don Cook. The Alpine team has the potential to fare well with the presence of Kowal, Tyminski, Roger Oesterle, Tom Lehman, Roy Placet and Napolitano and the chance of adding some of the promising first-year men.

The team again will be coached by Pete Jeffers and Dick Miller (when he returns from sabbatical second semester) of the Chemistry Department with help from competition veteran Sam Allison, now a grad student, and last year's co-captain Mike May. Allison will help the racers, May will assist with the Nordics.

SWIMMING OUTLOOK

Last year's 10-4 record marked the first winning season in 10 years and it was achieved with minimal senior help. The squad took third place in the 10-school SUNY Conference as all team points were registered by underclassmen. The team set 11 school, six pool and one conference record in an unprecedented onslaught of the record book. Bob Stefferson's eighth in the 400 i.m. and his 12th in the 200 yard backstroke in the NCAA Championships qualified him as a two-event All-American.

Jack Cothren, team captain, and diver Mitch Mergenthaler also competed in the Nationals at Oakland University in Michigan. All three are back and have some

talented accompaniment as the team points toward the NCAAs, to be held this year at California State College at Fullerton.

Other top returnees from last year are sprinter George Youtt, butterfly George Maul, freestyler Steve Langendorfer, breaststroker John Scheetz and diver Rick Little.

Frosh who should help include Pete LeValley, breaststroke and i.m., Gary Kenline, free, fly and back, and Jim Ryan in the distances. Since the biggest team weakness will be lack of depth in most events, it is hoped that the newcomers will come around in time to eradicate the problem.

COACH

Jack Boehm was a high school All-American in 1957 at Canisius High School in Buffalo where he turned in a 23.7 50-yard freestyle time which was the 10th best in the nation for a prep that year. He attended Cortland for one semester before following his coach, Doc Counsilman, to Indiana University. As a Hoosier, Jack was a two-year letterman, swimming the 50 and 100-yard freestyle.

Beginning his fifth year at Cortland, it would appear that swim fortunes on the hill under Boehm's direction may be ready to surpass even the fine years enjoyed by Counsilman during his stay at Cortland. Boehm has brought the team record from 3-8 his first year, to 10-4 last year. Interest in swimming and diving is on a definite upswing with even brighter days ahead as the College's new 50-meter Olympic-size pool and 1,000 seat gallery, which will be one of the best swim facilities in the nation, is now under construction.

Boehm has coached two All-Americans at Cortland, Bob McMurray, 1966-67, and Bob Stefferson, who was a two-event A-A last year as a sophomore. Jack is married and the father of three mini-splashes.

WRESTLING OUTLOOK

Repeating as SUNYAC team champion will be a secondary consideration to most of the 37 candidates out for the Dragon varsity. The first concern will be to make the starting team, a task made very difficult by the presence of probably more quality wrestlers than the school ever has had at one time. Many weights find former starters vying for the same job. The intra-squad wrestle-offs may be as exciting as the beefed-up schedule.

Outstanding returnees from last year's 10-3 squad include league champs Ron Behe, 150, and Stan Rogers, 142. There are no less than five loop runners-up, as

Kevin Stock, 118, Jim Tortorici, 126, Doug Hartman, 158, Hank Carpenter, 167, and Len Schlacter at unlimited, all return for what should be a banner year.

Other promising candidates are Marty Halleron, who was 4-0 at 142 pounds before being sidelined by an injury last year; Ed Zukowski, the football tailback who was number one at 158 pounds and had a 6-0 record before being injured two years ago; Gary Van Derzee, a football tackle who finished third in the conference last year at 190; Bill Lett, a promising 177-pounder from Nassau Community; Jim Carr, a 190-pound transfer from Corning Community; and football linebacker Billy Giugliano, an outstanding high school wrestler before attending Nassau, who will try at 177.

FROSH: The Baby Dragons have some quality but there won't be much quantity on hand, a situation that should bring mixed emotions to new coach Jerry Casciani. The turnout for the squad was the smallest in years.

The team will be strong in the lower weights but for the second year in a row there is no bona fide candidate out for either the 177 or 190-pound weight classes, a situation that is bound to hurt team efforts.

Among the candidates out are Dick DiFabio, a Section 3 champion last year who will go at 134; Joe Bernholz, who lost in the counties to last year's eventual state champ, who will wrestle at 158; Dave Warren at 142 who had an outstanding record in four varsity prep years; and Ira Green, 6-1, 280, who lost last year to the Nassau County champion.

COACHES

VARSITY: Vince Gonino begins his second year heading Cortland's wrestling program after being named second runner-up for the national "Rookie Coach of the Year" award last year when he directed the Grapplin' Dragons to a 10-3 mark and the SUNYAC Championship. A fine undergraduate wrestler at Ohio State, Gonino won two Ohio AAU championships and two Big Ten awards at 167 pounds. He holds a master's from Ohio University and has previously coached and taught at Ohio's Whitehall High School and at Keystone, Pa., Junior College. He had a four-year record with the Dragon frosh of 30-10-1.

FROSH: Jerry Casciani begins his first year at Cortland with nine years of coaching experience behind him. The Springfield graduate has been head coach at North Eastern York, Pa., High School, Manhasset High, Baltimore Junior College, and York, Pa., Junior College. With a master's from Penn State, Jerry also coaches football and lacrosse.

GRAD ASSISTANT: Ron Russo comes to Cortland with a background of excellence as an undergraduate at Bloomsburg, Pa., State College. He was a two-time PSCAC Champion, 1968, 1969; he was the NAIA champ in '69 after being runner-up the year before; he was 6th in the NCAA university division in '68 and 4th in '69. He finished fourth in the 1968 Olympic trials after his junior year, and was a member of the East-West All-American team last year.
