FIELD HOCKEY COACH CAROLE MUSHIER

Carole Mushier enters her sixth year as the Cortland State field hockey coach. Her objective for the program has been to play at the highest level of competition that is reasonable for the team and which is within the framework of the College's educational goals for the participants.

Dr. Mushier was a member of section field hockey teams and played in seven USFHA national tournaments. She also played on the 1964 women's lacrosse touring team which played in Great Britain and Ireland. She has coached field hockey on the high school, college and association levels. Her overall coaching record at Cortland is 22-17-6.

She holds a master's degree from Columbia University and a Ph.D. from the University of Southern California. An author of two books on team sports for women, she also is current president of the Eastern Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIAW) and a member of the AIAW Executive Board.

FIELD HOCKEY OUTLOOK

The 1975 season was a successful one for Cortland State's field hockey team and there are high hopes for even more success in 1976.

Cortland played one of the strongest schedules of any college team in the Northeast District in 1975 and the 1976 schedule appears even more difficult. Upon recommendation of the team, two new colleges have been added to the schedule--Springfield College and the University of Massachusetts. Springfield finished the 1975 season as the number three team in the nation and the number one team in the Northeast. The University of Massachusetts was the number three team in the Northeast. While the Cortland State schedule makes a good win/loss record difficult, it reflects the philosophy of the program and team members to gain the best experience possible and to grow as participants.

Coach Mushier sees Lock Haven, East Stroudsburg and Penn State as strong contenders in the Middle Atlantic District. Lock Haven finished the 1975 season as the number five team in the country.

GOLF

COACH ERNEST LANFORD

Ernest Lanford comes to Cortland State as the first male to coach a varsity sport in the Women's Physical Education Department. He received his baccalaureate degree from Florida State University at Tallahasee and his master's degree from Michigan State. His doctorate in education was earned at Brigham Young University.

Lanford spent seven years as the assistant golf director at Florida State and three years as the assistant golf pro at Killearn Country Club in Tallahasee. He also served as a physical education instructor at Utah Technical College.

GOLF OUTLOOK

The 1976 women's golf team at Cortland consists of two veterans and three newcomers. Leanne Leonard and Sue DeKalb are likely to play in the number 1 and 2 spots due to their previous experience with the team. Sara Daggett, Heidi Jewett, and Sarah Maiello are the newcomers to the squad.

This years' schedule will be an abbreviated one due to the fact that Ithaca College and Cornell will not be fielding teams this year.

Coach Lanford expects Penn State to be an extremely tough foe due to the fact that they allow some athletic scholarship aid for golf. "I would think they would pick up some pretty good players on that basis alone" states Lanford. Other than that prediction, Lanford has no insight into the power of other potential opponents, stressing that he is new to the area and hasn't seen any of the competition.

TENNIS

COACH JOY BUFFAN

Joy Buffan is in her second season as the Cortland State women's tennis coach hoping to improve on her successful initial season in 1975. A former Cortland player herself, Buffan turned in a 4-2 won/loss record last season in dual match competition.

An instructor in the Women's Physical Education Department at Cortland, Coach Buffan received her master's degree from Penn State. Prior to her experience there, she taught for two years in the Gates-Chili Central School District.

In 1975 she was the NYSAIAW Tennis Tournament director. She also is secretary-treasurer of the NYSAIAW's Tennis Sport Committee.

TENNIS OUTLOOK

This year's women's tennis team shows an interesting blend of youth with experience. There will be five returnees with seven new faces on the roster.

Cathy McManus returns as the only senior, while Holly Manoogin and Carole Triosi make up the junior contingent. McManus played first and second single last season as well as first doubles. Triosi competed in second and third doubles last season while Manoogin saw action in both doubles and singles.

Sophomores Mary Pat Dougherty and Theresa Mc-Carthy complete the list of returnee's from 1975, while two other sophomores, Lorraine DeSale and Sue Outman are out for the team for the first time.

Freshmen who may see a lot of court time include: Sue Johnson (1973 & 1975 Section III High School champ), Areta Rakoczy (1976 National Weekly Tournament winner in singles and doubles), and Becky Sala (Interscholastic doubles winner here in 1976). Other freshmen who also have outstanding high school experience are Jamie Faricellia and Marilyn Hulak.

Buffan notes that her team has a lot of depth. "We have numerous new faces, and they should help to push the returning players. Much of our strength will come from within our own team." According to CoachBuffan, enthusiasm is running high, which should lead to an improvement on last year's 4-3 record.

VOLLEYBALL

COACH KAREN RUDER

Karen Ruder replaces Beulah Wang as women's volleyball coach in her first year at Cortland. She inherits a team that went 39-2-1 in 42 matches before the National Championships last season.

Duplicating last seasons results may be very difficult. It may be impossible. Winning the New York State AIAW Tournament and the EAIAW Tournament require a great deal of skill and a little "good fortune" along the way. Coach Ruder may be able to develop the team's skill but only time will tell what fortune will bring.

Ruder is a graduate of Longwood College in Virginia where she received a bachelor's degree in physical education. She received a master's degree from Indiana University.

Before coming to Cortland she spent 8 years teaching and coaching in Virginia high schools and was the gymnastics and track coach at Ball State University for one year.

A member of the women's physical education staff at Cortland, she also will coach the women's intercollegiate track team in the spring.

VOLLEYBALL OUTLOOK

Last year Cortland's volleyball team won the New York State Championship, the Eastern AIAW Regional Championship and competed in the national championship tournament. Losses to powerful UCLA and Portland State ended Cortland's hopes for a national title.

This year's team has set high goals according to coach Karen RUder. "We have the talent to reach them and part of the reason is the dedication of the players," she said.

"The team is enthusiastic and together," says RUder of the 14 team members left from a group of 58 women who tried out. "We are stressing conditioning and while we won't be in peak condition by the first game, we will be very tough." Ruder continues, "We should be in top condition by the middle of the season and we're working on some new plays which should be very effective."

Ruder feels the team has a very strong defense which will be the team's main strength. "After all," she says, "a good defense IS the best offense."
