

COACHING STAFF

ALAN STOCKHOLM

Head Coach

A native of Montrose, Pa., Alan Stockholm has been the head basketball coach at Cortland for five years. In addition to his coaching duties, he is an assistant professor of physical education and serves as J.V. baseball coach in the spring. Stockholm is a graduate of East Stroudsburg State College where he majored in health and physical education. He received an M.A. degree from the University of Maryland and is presently working on a doctor of physical education degree at Indiana University.

While an undergraduate at East Stroudsburg, Stockholm played guard on the varsity basket-ball team for three years and was the starting first baseman in baseball where his coach was a Cortland alumnus, George Ockershausen.

From 1962 to 1965, he served as an instructor in physical education and basketball coach at Allegany Community College in Cumberland, Md. He first came to Cortland in 1965-66 to fill in for Coach Barney Williams who was on a leave of absence. Stockholm returned to Cortland in 1968 and has been head basketball coach since that time.

An avid competitor in local and national horseshoe pitching contests, his 77 percent ringer average and a 10-1 won-lost record in New York State tournaments last year was good enough to make him the New York State horseshoe pitching champion. Athletics and academics are two areas where Neil Langelier has excelled in recent years. He won a graduate assistantship in physical education at Cortland this year after earning a bachelor of science degree in PE at the State University of New York at Buffalo. His cumulative average at Buffalo was 3.0 over four years. He played three years of varsity basketball as a forward and was team captain in his senior year. His athletic and academic prowess earned him the ECAC Medal of Merit, the John N. Bennett Basketball Award at Buffalo, and selection as one of the Outstanding College Athletes of America.

Langelier is a native of Moira, N.Y., and graduated from Brushton-Moira High School where he competed in basketball, baseball and cross country. This past fall, he served as varsity golf coach at Cortland.

MIKE EIDEL

J.V. Coach

Guiding the J.V. forces in basketball will be a member of the Class of 1971 at Cortland, Mike Eidel. He has returned to campus as a graduate student in physical education and is well schooled in the science of basketball. Last year, he was assistant coach at Our Lady of Lourdes High School in Poughkeepsie and the team compiled an 18-3 record, won the Dutchess County League for the first time and finished second in the sectional playoffs. Eidel is a native of Poughkeepsie and played his high school ball at Our Lady of Lourdes. At Cortland, he played three years of varsity ball and was among the top three small college players in the nation in free throw

shooting in 1970-71. He sank 101 of 114 attempts, for an .885 percentage. The 439 points he scored as a senior (20.0 per game ave.) gave him 1,053 points in his three years as a Dragon, second best ever in the Cortland record book.

STEVE KUZMAN

Assistant J.V. Coach

Steve Kuzman is a graduate assistant in physical education at Cortland. He has a B.S. degree in physical education from Ithaca College (1968) where he played basketball, soccer and tennis. He recently completed a three and one-half year tour of duty with the U.S. Air Force as a jet fighter instructor. He was active in sports while in the service, particularly the racquet sports. Before entering the Air Force, he was a graduate assistant at the University of Wisconsin. He is a native of Cobleskill.

RED DRAGON OUTLOOK

Cortland State will play a 20 game basketball schedule in 1972-73 in addition to competing in the annual Pocono Classic at East Stroudsburg in January. Hobart and Elmira are on the Red Dragon schedule for the first time. Sixteen teams which Cortland has met previously are again scheduled including home and home clashes with traditional rivals Ithaca and LeMoyne.

The Red Dragons have some interesting basketball records to be proud of and to add to this year. Of the 16 regular season opponents on the schedule, Cortland is leading in series victories over 10 teams and is tied in another. Only LeMoyne and Albany have a margin of more than two games over the Dragons through the years. In total games played with the 16 opponents since Cortland became a four year college in 1938, the Dragons have won 198 and lost 151. In total games played against all opponents since 1938, Cortland has won 339 and lost 254, a winning percentage of .571.

Al Stockholm will be in his sixth season as head coach of the Dragons. His record at Cortland is 45 wins and 53 losses. His best season was in 1968-69. The Dragons were 11-7 overall and had a 9-1 record in the State University of New York Athletic Conference and tied with Buffalo State for the title. Cortland was 11-10 the next year and a 7-3 SUNYAC mark was good for a second place tie.

Pre-season evidence indicates that Stockholm's career record at Cortland could easily go over the .500 mark this year. The coach himself admits to be optimistic, in a reserved sort of fashion.

What Stockholm has more of this year than last season's 6-14 club is more of everything--fire-

power, board strength, team speed and defense. Perhaps the most important ingredient will be player depth.

Picking the starting five won't be easy. Every player on the 12-man roster has an honest crack at starting jobs and almost everyone of them is capable of deserving such recognition. Stockholm won't have to worry about fighting a 20-game plus schedule with an iron-man five. He'll have plenty of help and that goes for the front line as well as the back court.

There are no seniors on this team. The four returning "veterans" include two juniors and three sophomores. The key man is John Jackson, Cortland's leading rebounder and scorer last year. He'll head the front line again. Jackson's status as a player and a leader is indicated by his election as team captain by the players.

Jackson's scoring average for 20 games in 71-72 was 19.2 and his rebound total was 202. He also was among the team leaders in assists. He's a 70 percent plus free throw shooter.

Don Selsky, a sophomore forward had a good year with the varsity as a freshman. He was the team's third leading scorer with 172 points, good for a 9.6 average in 18 games he played. He should be better this year.

Although he didn't win a letter, Chris Moore is another of the finest offensive players in Stockholm's camp. Injuries kept him out of several games last year but he still managed a 9.6 scoring average.

George Renton, a junior, and Larry Hazen, a sophomore, are the other lettermen. Both are guards and both are starting team caliber. Renton aver-

aged 7.5 per game a year ago and Hazen was 6.5 scorer. They ranked 2-3 in assists.

Up from the J.V. team last year are 6'5" Greg Tyler at center and 6'2" Peter Weishan at Guard. Tyler is strong and quick and can trigger the fast break with good outlet passing. Weishan has played forward in the past but is in the process of learning his way around the backcourt.

Willie Fields, 6'5" sophomore will be a prime contender for the center spot. Reg Gordon and Jim Luchsinger are two 6'4" newcomers who will be available for duty at forward. Terry 0'Brien and "G.W." Washington are the other two guards on the team. Both are quick and shoot well.

In utilizing the talent available to him, Stockholm will employ a pro-type offense which stresses taking advantage of enemy mistakes. The Dragons won't run too many patterns and will work the fast break when possible. All his forward line people have mobility which should give the offense some extra opportunities for two and three man plays. Defensively, the Dragons will lean toward manto-man, sometimes with pressure.

Stockholm says that this team will improve each week as the players get to know each other and their individual styles. With a good season this year, Stockholm might even get enthusiastic about next year.

PLAYER PROFILES

WILLIE FIELDS -- One of the biggest men on the squad at 6'5" and 190 pounds...is a newcomer to Cortland basketball after transferring from Farmingdale...has a good jump shot from inside ...strong rebounder...should contribute to front line effectiveness...will probably be used at the center position...his major is recreation education.

REG GORDON -- Another transfer student from Farmingdale who shows real promise...is a good shooter, particularly from the corners...his jumper is one of the best on the team...can do a good job rebounding...fast learning the Red Dragon system...will see action as a forward...physical education is his major.

LARRY HAZEN -- One of four returning lettermen from last year's squad...played with the varsity as a freshman...was the team's sixth leading scorer with 124 points for a 6.5 average...a guard, he has the ability to hit the open man with sharp passing... could score in double figures this year... adequate on defense...was second in steals in 71-72...is a likely starter...majors in physical education.

JOHN JACKSON -- Elected captain by his teammates this year...regarded by Coach Al Stockholm as one of the best he's coached at Cortland... was team's leading rebounder and scorer last year as a sophomore...scoring average was 19.2 over a 20 game schedule...he's 6'4" and 200 with good mobility...is expected to be a solid all-around performer...a second team

forward SUNYAC all-league team in 71-72, should be first team selection in 72-73...tremendous desire to win...leads by example...has the stamina to play full game every game...major is physical education.

JIM LUCHSINGER -- Considered one of the best of the newcomers...plenty of promise...does everything well...at 6'4" and 208, has the ability to work both ends of the court as a forward... good basketball sense...will be counted on for valuable floor leadership...is a likely starter ...physical education major.

CHRIS MOORE -- Potentially one of the finest offensive players on the team...6'2", 180 is fighting for a starting forward spot... defense needs work...hardest player to guard one on one...real good leg spring...plagued by injuries last year...averaged 9.6 in 7 games...could be one of the happy surprises for the Dragons this year...is a physical education major.

TERRY O'BRIEN -- A transfer from St. Joseph's Junior College in Florida...quickest man on the squad...can shoot outside...drives well to the basket...has more natural ability than most guards...coaches say he gets better every day...teammates call him the "Phantom" ...is a physical education major.

GEORGE RENTON -- A junior, he returns for his second varsity campaign at guard...scored an average of 7.5 in 19 games last year...was a leading assist man and was one of the team's best free throw shooters...good floor leader ...probably plays the best defense of the guards ...has good spring...steady performer...major is recreation.

DON SELSKY -- Played with the varsity in 71-72 as a freshman...scored 172 points for a 9.6 average...a good forward at 6'4" and 195... one of the best long range shooters on the front line...excellent driving ability... tends to foul with aggresive style...will play a lot...majoring in secondary social studies.

GREG TYLER -- A sophomore center, 6'5" and 210.
...was key man on J.V. team last year...very consistent...will be one of the best rebounders...strength and quickness are prime assets ...good hands...can throw the outlet pass with precision...fair inside scorer but should improve...is a likely starter...majoring in mathematics.

GEORGE WASHINGTON -- Sophomore guard...nicknamed "G.W."...one of the quickest of the ball handlers...good scorer...exceptional driver...highly regarded as a fast break leader...coaches hope for rapid development...will play a lot...could be a starter...majoring in Black Studies.

PETE WEISHAN -- A sophomore who has been converted from a forward to a guard...he's 6'2" and 175 and if the move works, the Dragons will have a top performer...is working on ball handling ...good shooter from close range...best rebounding guard...no real weakness...very coachable...has won laurels as the best hustler on the team... played J.V. ball last year...majoring in physical education.
