

CORTLAND STATE 1984-85 HOCKEY

Located atop one of the many hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys", the State University College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School. Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of the legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a college, providing four-year courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, the state legislature incorporated Cortland College into the new State University of New York.

Today, more than 5,600 undergraduate and 600 graduate students are pursuing degrees within the College's two academic divisions—Arts and Sciences and Professional Studies. Twenty-three departments with a faculty of more than 300 offer the Cortland State student body some 40 majors from which to choose, including liberal arts, elementary and secondary education, health and physical education, recreation education, speech education and speech & hearing handicapped education.

The College's main campus covers 190 acres and includes 30 major buildings. Thirteen of these structures are residence halls and provide on-campus housing for 2,600 students.


At Cortland State, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland State participates in 24 intercollegiate sports—12 men's and 12 women's—in an attempt to provide a broad program of athletics which will meet the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The stated objective of the College's athletic program is the development and welfare of the student. In the coaching of individual sports as well as in the direction of the overall athletic program, the College endeavors to provide a high calibre of professional leadership which is consistent with the goals of the institution.

Cortland State is particularly proud of its long tradition of intercollegiate athletics and its high standing in small college athletic circles. In support of this heritage, the College offers its student-athletes a number of outstanding indoor and outdoor facilities which are used for intercollegiate competition as well as educational and recreational purposes. The Park Center for Physical Education and Recreation, opened in 1973, features a main gymnasium with a seating capacity of 3,600, an Olympic-size swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500, and an ice arena which can accommodate 2,500 spectators.

In addition, Lusk Field House provides an extensive area for indoor practice sessions and activity classes and is the home of the men's and women's indoor track teams. The College has approximately 50 acres of athletic fields. Davis Field, with a seating capacity of 5,000, is the home of the Red Dragon football and lacrosse squads. Adjacent to Davis Field and the Park Center are 24 tennis courts.



HEAD COACH AL MacCORMACK

Fourth-year Cortland State head coach Al MacCormack is a man of many talents and responsibilities. In addition to directing the Red Dragon skaters, MacCormack, a Physical Education instructor at the College, has been assistant coach of the Cortland nationally-ranked men's soccer squad for four seasons and doubles as the Park Center Ice Arena manager.

A native of Sydney, Nova Scotia, MacCormack graduated from St. Lawrence University in 1974. An extraordinary collegiate athlete, he excelled in both hockey and soccer. MacCormack, who finished his career as the all-time leading soccer scorer in SLU history, was named MVP and captain in both sports as a senior.


MacCormack earned a master's degree in physical education from Ithaca College, where he began teaching and coaching in 1975. In six campaigns, he navigated the Bomber men's soccer unit to a 38-43-4 record and two NCAA tournament appearances. MacCormack was voted the New York State Soccer Coach of the Year in 1980.

While at Ithaca, MacCormack also served as part-time assistant hockey coach at Elmira College, where the team earned three consecutive NCAA post-season bids while MacCormack was coaching.

During the summer months, MacCormack remains active with hockey instructional camps throughout the East Coast. Al, his wife, Shirley, and two children, reside in Cortland.

Brent Reid, a native of Lake Placid, N.Y., joins the Cortland State hockey coaching staff this season. The 25-year-old mentor attended Plattsburgh State, where he played right wing for the Cardinals who played in two consecutive national championship games. He captained the Cardinal unit as a senior. Reid was an assistant coach at Lake Placid High between 1981 and 1983, in addition to working with the Lake Placid Youth Hockey program. He is single and resides in Cortland.

SLASHING

A series of chopping motions with the edge of one hand across the opposite forearm.



CHARGING

Rotating clenched fists around one another in front of chest.



SLOW WHISTLE

Either arm, in which whistle is held, extended above head. If play returns to Neutral Zone without stoppage, arm is drawn down the instant the puck crosses the line.



HOLDING

Clasping either wrist with the other hand well in front of the chest.



TRIPPING

Extending right leg forward, clear of the ice, and striking it with right hand below the knee.



MISCONDUCT

Placing of both hands on hips several times and pointing to penalized player.

BOARDING

Pounding the closed fist of one hand into the open palm of the other hand.



ICING

1. Indication of possible icing violation, back official raises arm.
2. Front man blows whistle.



INTERFERENCE

Crossed arms stationary in front of chest.



HIGH-STICKING

Holding both fists, clenched, one immediately above the other, at the height of the forehead.



ELBOWING

Tapping either elbow with the opposite hand.



HOOKING

A series of tugging motions with both arms, as if pulling something toward the stomach.



CROSS-CHECKING AND ILLEGAL USE OF HANDS

A series of forward and backward motions with both fists clenched extending from the chest.



"WASH-OUT"

Both arms swung laterally across the body with palms down:

1. When used by the Referee it means goal disallowed.
2. When used by Linesmen it means there is no icing or no off-side.



DELAYED CALLING OF PENALTY

Referee repeatedly points, with free hand (without whistle) to player to be penalized until play is stopped.
