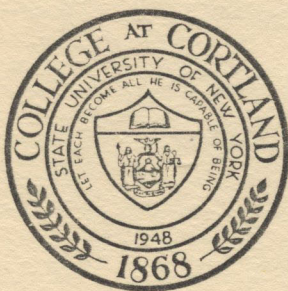

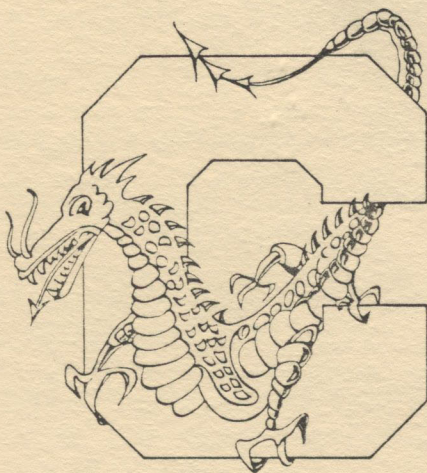

## T. FRED "PROF" HOLLOWAY

### Head Soccer Coach

"Prof" Holloway is head soccer coach at Cortland State. He has been for 34 years and has suffered losing seasons only three times during that span. Since 1936, Cortland Soccer teams have faced 28 different opponents in 296 games. Under Coach Holloway, Cortland has won 183, lost 89 and tied 23. Prof's teams have been in the NCAA Championship Tournament in 1960, 1964 and 1966. Since 1959 when the State University of New York Athletic Conference sponsored league play in soccer with 11 schools, Cortland has won five league titles, finished second twice, tied for third twice, placed fourth once and fifth once. All-American honors have come to 17 players who have played soccer for "Prof," a record for any Cortland State coach.

Such an outstanding record of achievement has been compiled by a gentleman of a coach who doesn't recruit his players and fully advocates the theory of getting all his players into a game, sometimes to the extent of risking the final outcome. The closeness of soccer scores through the years at Cortland are evidence of Prof's liberal substitution policy.

Holloway's fame in soccer circles is truly on a national scale. He was chairman of the original constitution committee of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and served as president in 1952. In 1958, he received the 16th Honor Award, the highest tribute the Soccer Coaches Association can bestow on one of its members. In gaining the admiration and respect of his peers, he was acclaimed as "author, educator, leader of youth and leader of men, sportsman, athlete, coach, tireless worker and standard bearer for the sport of soccer."



The Cortland coach who also is a professor of physical education, is a past chairman of the New York Region NCAA Soccer Selection Committee and was a longtime contributor to the NCAA Soccer Guide. One of his most significant contributions to the game occurred when he organized the present statistical system used in choosing and evaluating soccer All-Americans and his revision of the NCAA rating system which is presently used in the selection of tournament teams.

Born in Scotland, Coach Holloway came to the U.S. in 1912 and attended high school in Waterbury, Conn. He graduated from Springfield College where he played soccer and competed in cross country and gymnastics. His master's degree also is from Springfield and his Ph.D. is from N.Y.U..

Coach Holloway says that in soccer, "the fun is outthinking your opponent within the framework of the rules." He adds, "the naive athlete goes out to beat his opponent but the true athlete goes out to test himself against formidable opposition."

### CHUCK WINTERS

#### Assistant Coach

A native of Rochester, N.Y., Chuck Winters has been a member of the Physical Education Department at Cortland State since 1970. He is a graduate of Bowling Green State University and has a master's degree from there. While he was a graduate assistant at Bowling Green, he taught physical education and soccer and assisted with the coaching of lacrosse. He was an All-American lacrosse player during undergraduate days and was selected to play in the annual North-South game. He has been assistant lacrosse coach at Cortland



for two years and was named head lacrosse coach in August 1972.

Cortland fielded a varsity "B" team in soccer last fall which Winters coached to a 3-2-1 season record. The team was comprised mostly of sophomores who played some games with the varsity but were able to gain considerable experience through regular participation with the B squad.

### FRED TAUBE

#### Freshman Coach

An assistant professor in physical education at Cortland since 1970, Fred Taube has enjoyed two winning seasons as frosh coach. His 1970 team was 4-3-1 and the Baby Mules finished 4-2-1 last year.

A graduate of SUNY College at Brockport, Taube earned his master's degree in physical education at the University of North Carolina and has a Ph.D. from the University of Utah. Before joining the Cortland staff, Taube was in the Physical Education Department at MacMurray College, Jacksonville, Ill., for seven years and coached track and soccer. Three of his soccer players were All-Americans. He also coached the soccer club while he taught at Auburn University in Alabama from 1960 to 1963.

While a student at Brockport, Taube was a three-year varsity letterman in soccer and track, co-captained both teams, and was named to the All-New York State soccer team in 1959.

Last season, Taube served as chairman of the National Team Rating Board for the Intercollegiate Soccer Football Association of America.



## 1972 SOCCER OUTLOOK

Heading into his 35th campaign at Cortland State, head coach T. Fred Holloway is expressing cautious optimism. He has invited 35 players back from last year's varsity, the varsity "B" team and the freshman squad. Of the returnees, 16 are lettermen, six earned participation awards with the "B" team and 13 received freshman certificates. Included on the pre-season roster are 11 seniors, 12 juniors and 16 sophomores.

Holloway has had only 3 losing seasons in his lengthy coaching career at Cortland but the competition is getting consistently rougher in recent years. The last several seasons have been logged as winning campaigns, but just barely. Cortland had a 5-4-3 campaign in 1970 and 5-4 record in 1971.

Cortland lost 10 seniors from the 1971 squad. Missed the most will be backs Doug Galke, Gary Lack, Walt Nadolny and Tony Sorrentino, fullbacks Aldo Filippone, Gary Kalinkewicz and Bert Severns, and goalie Jack McGetrick. Nadolny won the team's Red Letter Award which annually goes to the senior player who contributed the most to the team.

Even with McGetrick gone, Coach Holloway believes that goal tending will be no serious problem for the new season. He has two lettermen available for the job, senior John Bory of Deer Park and junior Ed Bulgin of Central Islip.

There are at least five leading candidates for fullback duty, two of whom are juniors, Bob Gould of Hobart and Chris Tyson of Northport. Added to the list are seniors John Moren of Hicksville, Tim Morsch of North Merrick and Fred Virgil of Fabius.



Halfback slots should be filled by any combination of these five: Joe Chiavaro of Newfane, Carl Ferraro of Lindenhurst, Bill Koban of Endicott, Dennis Marchesi of Lindenhurst and Tim Ramsey of Mayfield. Koban and Marchesi are returning lettermen.

The forward positions are where Prof. Holloway can find the most experience with four lettermen available among five leading candidates. Junior Steve Ballard of Davenport is the upstart here and he should see lots of playing time. The lettermen returning are Paul McGee of Plainview, Don Murphy of North Merrick, Doug Putnam of Fabius and Dan Viglione of Wantagh.
