ALAN STOCKHOLM Head Coach

Al Stockholm brings more than his horseshoes to the bench for a Cortland State basketball game. And he probably won't need any such aids to come up with his second consecutive winning season at the Red Dragon helm.

With a 13-9 record last year, the Montrose, Pa. native compiled the best of his seven seasons at the Cortland reins. This will be his sixth year in a row as head basketball coach, having also taken over the team in 1965-66 when Barney Williams was on a leave of absence.

The assistant professor of physical education, in addition to basketball exploits reaching back to undergraduate days at East Stroudsburg, is one of New York's top competitors in horseshoe tournaments and a former state champion.

Holder of an M.A. degree from the University of Maryland, Stockholm is currently completing work for a Ph.D. from Indiana University.

JOE SUPER

Assistant Coach

Joe Super is already a veteran of athletics and academics. After earning a B.S. degree in history from the SUNY College at Oneonta he taught

history in high school and coached basketball at the high school and college level. He's now at Cortland working toward teacher certification and a master's degree in physical education.

After graduating from Oneonta, Super taught history for three years at Charlotte Valley (Davenport) High School. For two of the three years there, he also coached junior varsity basketball at Oneonta Senior High School. His teams were 14-4 and 15-3. While teaching at Charlotte Valley, he served as assistant varsity basketball coach at Hartwick College.

TOM JACKSON

JV Coach

A member of the Physical Education Department faculty for the second year, Tom Jackson serves as an assistant coach in football and worked principally with the offensive line. He's a graduate of Penn State where he earned national recognition as an offensive guard. He played in three football bowl games.

Before coming to Cortland, he taught and coached at Watchung Hills Regional High School in Warren , N.J. He has done graduate work at Montclair State and Seton Hall. He's a native of Scotch Plains, N.J.

JIM LUCHSINGER Assistant JV Coach

Now a graduate student at Cortland, Jim was last season's leading scorer for the Red Dragons at 14.4 points per game. Massapequa native Luchsinger also played lacrosse while a Cortland undergraduate. He also attended Nassau Community College.

RED DRAGON OUTLOOK

Any visiting coach hoping to leave Cortland with a smile on his face might do well to make a stop on Grant Street before heading to the PER Center.

It's in a house on Grant that the impetus to a highly successful Cortland State basketball season resides—the scoring and the playmaking.

Juniors Barney Robinson and Bruce Spencer are those ingredients and coach Al Stockholm isn't at all worried about their compatibility on the court.

They're both graduates of Taft High School in New York City, both juniors and they even share the house on Grant. The only reason this is Spencer's first year on the varsity while Robinson quarterbacked Stockholm's offense last year is that Bruce, a 6-foot-3 forward, detoured for a year at Midwestern University.

"I figure Bruce will lead our team in scoring," said Stockholm, basing his appraisal on Spencer's myriad of inside moves.

And Barney, while still a junior, is definite all-conference material--"or more" according to his coach.

Added to their shared scoring ability and great quickness is a penchant for gambling defensive play, something which could help Stockholm put together a fast breaking, high-scoring outfit.

The key to the fast break is the one senior starter, 6-5 center Greg Tyler. The Lewiston product should add more points to his solid rebounding, defensive game.

The real "runner" on the fast break is one of two other seniors on the roster, 5-7 sparkplug Rich Berg. However, he won't be eligible until the Dragons' seventh game, at the beginning of second semester. He's sitting out a year after transferring from Plattsburgh.

The other guard starter is transfer Bob Dixon, from Mohawk Valley CC. And right behind him is his MVCC running mate, Tom Mossotti. Both solid fundamental players, they have been surprises during preseason workouts.

Teaming with Spencer up front will be returning junior Ed Prue and Cortland's standout soccer goalie Tom Wignot. Prue, the man Stockholm says "we'd look for if we needed a last shot" was the team's top sub a year ago. Wignot, late in joining the team after soccer, is a transfer from Dean JC and at 6-3 is a natural scorer.

Also back from last year's club is the other senior, Pete Weishan, who is making the transition back to his natural forward position after a year at guard. The other returnees are Mark Bennett, Tyler's backup in the pivot, and Dale Greabell, a guard who's slow starting after knee ligament problems.

Up from the JV squad is forward Tom Moore and Phil White. Moore is a player to whom Stockholm is looking with thoughts of the future, while White has worked himself into a spot from which he'll be one of the first guard subs.

"I think we're as quick as anybody we'll play," says Stockholm. "And we have unusually good jumpers--boy, do we get off the floor."

And for the outcome of the season? "I think we have ECAC possibilities. Buffalo State and Brockport are the teams to beat in the conference with ourselves and Geneseo as dark horses. I'll be disappointed this year any time we don't go over 80 points."

MARK BENNETT, junior center, 6-6, 210, Rome, N.Y.... strength is his size...good shooter...possesses variety of shots...could use more aggressiveness... will back up Greg Tyler.

RICH BERG, senior guard, 5-7, 140, Hicksville, N.Y... won't be eligible until January...played two years at North Country CC and a semester at Plattsburgh... super-quick...height is deceiving, can jump with six-footers...lefty, but can handle ball well enough... great driver and outside shooter...quickness and fast breaking ability his strengths.

BOB DIXON, junior guard, 6-0, 160, Rome, N.Y.... streak shooter with a nice jump shot...jumps well... very quick on defense, but needs to learn more about it... great attitude...transfer from Mohawk Valley CC.

DALE GREABELL, junior guard, 6-1, 165, E. Syracuse, N.Y.... "Betty" to teammates...coming off knee ligament trouble...good outside shooter...can be erratic handling ball...behind team in conditioning due to injury.

TOM MOORE, sophomore forward, 6-3, 197, New York, N.Y. ...successful with "flat" jump shot...good worker... needs more discipline in his play.

TOM MOSSOTTI, junior guard, 6-0, 175, Syracuse, N.Y. ...transfer from Mohawk Valley CC...fundamentally, best defensive guard on team...could be top guard sub...makes up for lack of quickness with hard work ...Dixon's backcourt partner at MVCC.

ED PRUE, junior forward, 6-1, 180, New Hartford, N.Y. ... the man to look for if you need one shot to win... fundamentally sound...can stay with bigger forwards... can't handle ball well enough to be guard... could be top "fireman" for second year in row.

BARNEY ROBINSON, junior guard, 5-10, 170, New York, N.Y...on verge of all-conference or more...still streaky...shows flashes of greatness, especially scoring and passing...excellent driver...gambling defensive player...hampered by knee trouble...great quickness...shooting improved.

BRUCE SPENCER, junior forward, 6-3, 215, New York, N.Y...played JV ball after transferring from Midwestern U...prolific moves...should lead team in scoring...top-notch offensive rebounder...quickness makes him rover on the press...nose for the ball... moves well in a crowd...deadly jump shot from anywhere up to 20 feet.

GREG TYLER, senior center, 6-5, 215, Lewiston, N.Y... steady rebounding, picking center...has gained moves and confidence...clogs middle of zone...strength makes him solid rebounder...key to running game with great outlet passing.

PETE WEISHAN, senior forward, 6-2, 177, Cattaraugus, N.Y....back up front after year as swing man...very intense...really crashes offensive boards...needs to relax more and take pressure off himself.

PHIL WHITE, sophomore guard, 6-0, 160, Holcomb, N.Y. ...best shooting guard on team...very smooth...no deficient part of game...will play more than orginally expected.

TOM WIGNOT, junior forward, 6-3, 170, Walpole, Mass. ...picture book jump shot...can play with 6-6 opponents...good shooter and scorer...slowed by late arrival from soccer, where he's a goalie...transfer from Dean JC.
