## FRED TAUBE

### Head Soccer Coach

The 1973 soccer season will be the first at Cortland State for Frederick W. Taube who served as freshman soccer coach for three years before being elevated to the head varsity job. Taube succeeds one of the winningest coaches in any sport at Cortland, T. Fred "Prof" Holloway who retired in June.

An assistant professor of physical education at the College, Taube has a freshman coaching record of 12-7-1. He also is an assistant coach in indoor track.

The new varsity coach was elected this year as third vice president of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. He has been an active member of the Association since 1959, serving on a number of committees. In addition, he is a past national chairman of the National Team Rating Board for the Intercollegiate Soccer Football Association of America.

A Brockport graduate, Taube has a master's degree from the University of North Carolina and a Ph.D. from the University of Utah. While a student at Brockport, Taube was a three-year varsity letterman in soccer and track, co-captained both teams and was named to the All-New York State soccer team in 1959.

Before joining the Cortland faculty in 1970, Taube taught for seven years at MacMurray College in Jacksonville, Ill., where he coached track and soccer. He also taught at Auburn University in Alabama from 1960 to 1963 and coached the soccer club there.

## CHUCK WINTERS

### Assistant Coach

A native of Rochester, N.Y., Chuck Winters has been a member of the Physical Education Department at Cortland State since 1970. He is a graduate of Bowling Green State University and has a master's degree from there. While he was a graduate assistant at Bowling Green, he taught physical education and soccer and assisted with the coaching of lacrosse. He was an All-American lacrosse player during undergraduate days and was selected to play in the annual North-South game. He was assistant lacrosse coach at Cortland for two years before being named head lacrosse coach in August 1972.

## CORTLAND SOCCER UNDER COACH FRED "PROF" HOLLOWAY

After 35 years as head soccer coach at Cortland State, Fred "Prof" Holloway retired in June 1973. With one of the longest soccer coaching careers in the United States, Holloway's teams compiled a record of 191 wins, 94 losses and 23 ties, a .670 winning percentage. His teams suffered losing seasons only three times in his coaching career at Cortland, 1936 to 1972.

Under Coach Holloway, Cortland was in the NCAA Championship Tournament in 1960, 1962, 1964 and 1966. In 14 years of competition in the 11-team SUNY Athletic Conference, his teams were first place finishers six times. Seventeen players coached by Holloway at Cortland achieved All-American ranking, including five first team picks.

the course of a season. In this respect, Cortland is in a favorable position with two junior goal keepers, Wayne Donsky of Rochester and Ed Bulgin of Central Islip. In varsity play last year, Donsky recorded 38 saves. Both men have a knack for their job and are strong on agility and courage. Taube regards them as an outstanding goalie combination and would not hesitate in using either player.

Taube has a notion that the eventual success of the season could be determined in the last four games, all away. Four of the toughest teams the Red Mules will face, Cornell, Brockport, New Paltz and Oneonta, will be met in consecutive season ending contests.

Cortland will play three of its six home games at night and Taube is looking forward to this development as an encouraging development for local area fans.
