ROGER SIPHER

Roger Sipher is in his first season as head coach of the Cortland State women's varsity basketball team during the 1978-79 season. Sipher succeeds the departed Ernest Lanford, who last year guided Cortland to its most successful season ever. The Dragons finished at 17-7 and won their first New York State AIAW Championship.

Sipher is a professor of history and coordinator of secondary social studies with the Cortland State History Department. He received a B.A. degree from Potsdam State and an M.Ed. degree from the University of Rochester. His Ph.D. is from Syracuse University.

Before coming to Cortland 17 years ago, Sipher was the J.V. basketball coach at Williamsville and Liverpool Central Schools. While at Liverpool, he also served as assistant varsity football coach.

A native of Gouverneur the new Cortland coach excelled in basketball during high school and college. He earned All-Northern honors in basketball while at Gouverneur High School and played three years at center for Potsdam State. During his senior year of college, Sipher was elected team captain.

Sipher, who took over the coaching job in a volunteer role, believes that his strong basketball background as well as his teaching experience will assist him in his new position. In addition, Sipher plans to utilize some of his successful teaching techniques to provide a "positive learning experience" on the basketball court.

1978-79 SEASON OUTLOOK

Coming off its best season ever, the Cortland State women's basketball team has a tough act to follow. Last year the Dragons roared to a 17-7 season and the New York State Championship. In addition, they finished second in the Manufacturers Hanover Invitational and advanced to the Eastern AIAW semi-finals before being eliminated in the chase for the national crown.

Under new coach Roger Sipher, the Dragons will be rebuilding during the 1978-79 season. Gone from last year's team are five seniors who totaled more than 55 points a game, including two who were drafted by the new Women's Professional Basketball League, Lynda Lyman and Dawn Forster.

Sipher, who is carrying a 16 player squad, believes that all are capable of playing. "Although this is a young and inexperienced squad, it is one of considerable depth and enthusiasm and I expect it to mature into a strong team before the season is over," Sipher said.

Leading the Cortland team will be senior co-captains Lori Slaght and Bev Carter. Slaght, a native of Ithaca, has three previous years of experience at forward for the Dragons. Carter, a 6'0" center from East Douglas, Mass., averaged over 13 points a game last year and led the team in rebounds. She was plagued with knee injuries during pre-season.

In addition to Carter at center, Sipher has three other candidates for the job. They are Ramona Benjamin, a 5'10" junior from Brooklyn who last year shuffled between the varsity and J.V. teams; Karen Blend, a 6'1" junior transfer from Landing, N.J.; and Beth Davidson, a 5'10" junior transfer from Belvidere, N.J.

Coach Sipher said that he expects Davidson to play both forward and center. "She may be the best shooter on the team," he noted.

Other forwards for the Dragons will include 5'9" Debbie Drabinski, a sophomore from Elmira, 5'7" Linda Shrauger, a junior from Lisle, and 5'7" Heather Harrington, a sophomore from Olcott. All are returning veterans on the varsity team.

Moving up from the J.V. team of last year are two forward candidates. Both sophomores, they are 5'8" Diane Abrey of Rochester, and 5'9" Mary Ortelee of Pittsford.

Two returning players at the guard posts are Julie Gilmore, a junior from North Greece, and sophomore Mary Anne Jules of Baldwin. Up from the J.V. are sophomore Cheryl Monica of Malone, and sophomore Katie Mooney of Delmar.

Another guard candidate is Elizabeth "Tish" Fahey of West Organge, N.J. She's a transfer from Delta State. The only freshman on the Dragon team is guard Pat Kugler of Argyle, a player with "outstanding potential" according to Sipher. 1977-78 Results: 17 Wins, 7 Losses

1977-78 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

The 17 wins were the most ever in a single season for Cortland. The team won its first New York State AIAW championship in its 7th consecutive tournament appearance. The Lady Dragons also advanced to the EAIAW final four before being eliminated in the race for the national tournament title. Cortland took second place in the Manufacturers Hanover N.Y.S. Invitational Tournament for the second straight year and Dawn Forster completed her college career with a total of 1,260 points. Forster and Lynda Lyman, who scored 987 points in four years, were drafted by the newly formed Women's Professional Basketball League.
