### PHYSICAL EDUCATION - RECREATION CENTER

Cortland's home basketball games are played in the main gymnasium of the College's PER Center. Seating capacity is 3600. An elevated glass enclosed press box provides a complete overview of the entire arena. Ample parking is provided in the College lots entered off Tompkins Street.

The PER Center was completed in 1972 and provides facilities for academic programs in physical education and recreation education and is the focal point for Cortland's intercollegiate and intramural athletic programs. In addition to the main gymnasium, other features of the building include a 50-meter swimming pool with gallery seats for 1500 spectators, an ice arena with a seating capacity of 2400, a gymnastics center and dance studio.

## COACHING STAFF

ALAN STOCKHOLM

HEAD COACH

A native of Montrose, Pa., Alan Stockholm has been head basketball coach at Cortland for eight years. An assistant professor of physical education, he filled in as coach of the Red Dragons in 1965-66 and then became head coach in 1968-69. His best year was the 13-9 record of the 1973-74 team. His 1968-69 team finished 9-1 in SUNYAC and tied Buffalo State for the league crown. That Dragon team overall was 11-8.

Stockholm is a graduate of East Stroudsburg State College in Pennsylvania. As an undergraduate there, he played guard on the basketball team and was a first baseman in baseball. Continuing his education, Stockholm earned an M.A. from the University of Maryland and has completed the requirements for a doctorate at Indiana University.

In addition to coaching basketball at Cortland, Stockholm is J.V. baseball coach. He also is a top horseshoe competitor and is a former New York State champion. Before coming to Cortland, he was basketball coach and a physical education instructor with Allegany Community College, Cumberland, Md.

TOM JACKSON

ASSISTANT COACH

A member of the Physical Education Department faculty for the fourth year, Tom Jackson served two years as JV basketball coach and as a varsity assistant coach. As an assistant football coach, he works with the Red Dragon offensive line. Before joining the Cortland staff, he taught and coached at Watchung Hills Regional High School in Warren, N.J. He's a native of Scotch Plains, N.J.



Jackson graduated from Penn State where he earned national recognition as an offensive guard in football. He played in three bowl games, the Gator Bowl and the Orange Bowl twice. As a senior, he was team captain for the Nittany Lions. He has done graduate work at Montclair State and Seton Hall.

BOB DIXON

JUNIOR VARSITY COACH

Guiding JV basketball fortunes at Cortland in 76-77 will be Bob Dixon of Rome, N.Y. He played two years at Cortland for Coach Al Stockholm as a guard and was a letter winner in his senior year. He was a transfer to Cortland from Mohawk Valley Community College. A graduate of Rome Free Academy, he majored in physical education at Cortland. He has coached in summer basketball leagues and at summer camps.

JIM HUGHES

ASSISTANT J.V. COACH

Working as an assistant JV basketball coach is Jim Hughes of Wappingers Falls, N.Y. A physical education major at Cortland, Hughes played JV basketball for the Red Dragons and was an offensive end in football.

## RED DRAGON BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

Returning only two lettermen from a disappointing 4-18 campaign in 1975-76, it obviously is a rebuilding year for Cortland State. Several factors, however, hopefully will make Coach Alan Stockholm smile as the new season gets underway.

The guard situation should be greatly improved with the return of a healthy Terry Murphy of Oceanside who appeared in several games last year but never played at full strength. Returning lettermen Darrell Becker of Rochester and Ed Leone of Syracuse will be joined by Murphy, a junior, and two very promising players moving up from the JV, Mike Valenti of Albany and Gerry Price of New York. These two will add some speed and quickness that last season's team sorely needed.

The front court will be brand new with graduation claiming Ed Prue and Tom Mossotti and Wayne Brown deciding to pass up another court season to concentrate on academics. Stockholm is looking to some highly rated junior college transfers to provide shooting and board strength. High on the list is Jim Staak from Farmingdale Ag-Tech College at 6'4", Tom Howitt, a 6'7" transfer from Corning Community College, and 6'5" Gerry Greiner from Herkimer Community College. Joining these three are 6'3" Mike Merriman, a transfer from Auburn Community College who was injured last year.

Junior varsity players earning spots with the varsity are 6'5" Tom Ryan of Saranac and 6'4" Vince Gaetini of Binghamton. A freshman, 6'3" Al Kaval from Massapequa, could be counted on more as the season progresses.

Another transfer prize for Stockholm is Jim Williams, 6'7" forward who graduated from Central Tech in Syracuse. He played college



ball in Texas and won't be eligible until January. He's both strong and quick with a good touch.

This group of players could result in Cortland having the tallest and most talented front court Coach Stockholm has had to work with in eight years.

The Dragons again are expected to play their pattern offense and defend opponents with helping man to man pressure and changing zone defenses.

Leading JV candidates for 76-77 include Mike Gregory of Oneonta, Nick Wharton of New York, Gary Sauer of Rochester, Mark Root of Oswego, and Bud Dahlgren, a 6'8" center from Corning.
