


Larry Cain Freshman Holmes, New York




Mitchell Wynn Junior Staten Island, New York

1985-86 MEN'S GYMNASTICS

#### HEAD COACH ERIC MALMBERG

Eric Malmberg begins his seventh season as the Red Dragon men's gymnastics coach in 1985-86. Growing up in the Philadelphia suburb of Ambler, Pa., he first became interested in gymnastics in high school. Malmberg attended East Stroudsburg State, where he was a two-event NAGL champion in vaulting and all-around. He earned a B.S. degree in physical education in 1974. For the next three seasons, Malmberg was assistant gymnastics coach at the United States Military Academy at West Point.

In 1977, Malmberg came to Cortland State and began building a national gymnastics powerhouse. In 1978, Cortland was the top Div. III men's gymnastics team in the nation. In 1979, the Dragons won their first NAGL crown and had their first All-

America competitor.



After a two-year hiatus while working in the private sector, Malmberg returned to Cortland State as a physical education instructor and men's gymnastics coach in 1982. Eight of a possible nine competitors on the 1982-83 Dragon squad qualified for the NCAA Div. Il nationals; three were All-Americas and two went to the NCAA Div. I Championships.

For the past two years, Cortland State has been

voted the top Div. III gymnastics squad in the United States. During the last seven seasons, the Red Dragons have qualified more gymnasts for the NCAA Div. I Championships than any other New York State college or university.

As head coach, Malmberg views the Cortland program as "very teaching and learning oriented. Our emphasis here is on the teaching and the development of the individual. In short, gymnasts

are made at Cortland."

"We stress the complete understanding of gymnastics," continued Malmberg. "With this emphasis, we've been able to turn out as many gymnastics coaches as any college in the eastern United States in recent years. Gymnastics here is made to be interesting so that the understanding level among our gymnasts is very high."

Those same teaching/learning techniques will be offered to the general public in the summer of 1986 when the Olympeak Gymnastics Training Camp will again be staged at Cortland from June 29-August 1. The camp, said Malmberg, is patterned after the

U.S. National Training Camps.

"In this," he said, "we bring the highest calibre of gymnastics training and learning experiences to the average gymnast who wants to better himself or herself."
