#### BONNIE O'HARE

This is the first court season at Cortland for Coach Bonnie O'Hare. A native of Denver, Colorado, she joined the College's Department of Women's Physical Education as an instructor and also will serve as assistant softball coach in the spring.

She comes to Cortland from Washington State University where she taught physical education and was assistant women's basketball coach. Previously, she taught and coached girl's varsity basketball at North Montgomery High School in Crawfordsville, Ind. While at North Montgomery, she wrote a textbook on physical education activities used at the high school level.

O'Hare is a graduate of Indiana State University and has a master's degree from Washington State. As an undergraduate at ISU, O'Hare played 3 years of varsity basketball, 4 years of softball, 3 years of volleyball, and competed one year in track. She was singled out for outstanding defensive awards while a member of the ISU women's basketball team.

#### SHARYN MADISON

ASSISTANT COACH

Sharyn Madison is in her second year as assistant basketball coach with the Dragons. She is a graduate of Nyack College, where she played guard for a club team. After graduating in '72, Madison stayed at Nyack and coached volleyball and basketball for two years. Her strong point with the Dragons is conditioning.

#### JANET GREENE

ASSISTANT COACH

A graduate of Lock Haven State College, Janet Greene is now doing graduate work in physical education at Cortland and is assisting with coaching duties. She'll be assistant basketball coach for women this winter. Last spring, she coached the women's lacrosse team.

While a student at Lock Haven, Greene played four years of basketball and three of lacrosse. Before coming to Cortland, she was assistant girls basketball coach at Central Bucks East High School in Pennsylvania.

#### WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

1979-80

The Cortland State women's basketball team will combine youth and experience to tackle a tough '79-80 schedule. Two-thirds of the Dragons' opponents have a definite height advantage this year, but according to Coach Bonnie O'Hare, the season promises to be "exciting." There are five returning hoopsters plus four freshmen and one transfer student. The team will be basically a running team, with strong points in shooting.

Senior Julie Gilmore is back for her second year with the Dragons. Gilmore is a senior education major and was last year's leading scorer with a 12.6 point average per game. A transfer from Brockport State, Julie is from North Greece, N.Y. Also returning is senior Beth Davidson. A recreation major, Beth is from Bernards ville, N.J., and was last year's leading rebounder. Beth is a transfer student from Upsala College in New Jersey. Junior Sandra Jenson should stand out this season with her speed and polished mechanics. Sandra is a physical education major from Morris, N.Y., and transferred from Oneonta State. Freshman Maureen Shiel is another speedster for the Dragons and will be a starting forward. She is a physical education major from New City, N.Y.

This is O'Hare's first year at Cortland, but in four years of coaching elsewhere she has an overall record of 53-12.
