PETE CAHILL

HEAD COACH

Pete Cahill's contributions as head coach of the men's intercollegiate swim team at Cortland can be observed in the steadily improving won-lost records of the Red Dragons over the past four years. In his first year at the helm, Cortland managed just one win in 11 meets. In his second year, the Dragons improved to 5-8-1. In the last two campaigns, Dragon swimmers have been looking better and better while compiling records of 9-4 and 10-1. The upcoming season could be one of the best ever.

Cahill is a 1966 graduate of Cortland. He has a master's degree from the University of Massachusetts and a doctorate from Springfield College. He is a native of Watertown, N.Y., and grew up in Malone, N.Y., where he graduated from Franklin Academy.

Before coming to Cortland, Cahill was a member of the faculty at SUNY Plattsburgh, where he coached swimming and tennis, and was a teaching fellow at Springfield College.

While an undergraduate at Cortland, Cahill concentrated on the butterfly and breaststroke events as a member of the swimming team. He was captain in his senior year. In addition, he played varsity tennis.

As a member of the Cortland staff, he also coaches cross country in the fall.

AN INDIVIDUAL LOOK AT THE 1977-78 TEAM

ANDY ARTHUR, freshman from Rome, will be a big boost to the team in the sprint freestyle events. Andy attained High School All-American status while at Rome and was a member of the record setting medley relay and freestyle relay teams from Rome.

DOUG ARTHUR, a junior and Andy Arthur's older brother, is a transfer from St. Lawrence University where he attained NCAA Division III All-American status his freshman year in the 100 yard backstroke event.

PAUL BARTLETT, junior from Vestal, will supply some depth in the middle distance freestyle events. Paul has improved greatly since being a member of the 1974-75 squad.

TOM BOWEN, freshman from Apalachin, will help the team in its weakest event, breaststroke. Tom should also see action in the individual medley.

PAUL CAIN, junior from Camillus, will be one of many strong distance swimmers on the Cortland team. Paul swam for Western Kentucky University his freshman year before transferring to Cortland last year.

LARRY COLLINS, sophomore from Elmira, was a member of the 1977 NCAA Division III All-American medley relay team. This year's season should see improvement in Larry's 200 yard breaststroke times.

KEVIN GARRITY, junior from Voorheesville, will add a great deal of depth to the team in backstroke event. Last year Kevin won the consolation finals in the 100 yard backstroke in the conference championships. Kevin also will swim the individual medley event.

JOHN GALLO, junior transfer from Long Beach, should be a major contender in the butterfly events at the conference championships. John swam for two years at Morrisville where he was a finalist in the 100 yard butterfly at the National Junior College Championships.

ERIC HARVEY, sophomore from Newark, will be used primarily in the sprint events, but is one of the most versatile members of the team. He may be called on to swim in the 200 Fly and 200 IM events.

GARY INSCHO, sophomore from Owego, has improved greatly over the past year. Gary should certainly be a contender in both the one and three meter events in the conference championships.

SCOTT JOHNSON, senior from Geneseo, is showing much improvement with each session. Scott has developed into a steady performer in the 50 and 100 yard events.

MARK KLIER from Liverpool will be another excellent distance swimmer. Mark has shown much promise in the preseason work and will be one of many swimmers vying for a position on the 800 freestyle relay team.

BOB KOLLAR, senior from Wantagh, showed tremendous improvement during the last year's season. Both he and Eric Harvey were members of the National Qualifying 400 freestyle relay team.

KEVIN MARKWARDT, sophomore from Ithaca, was a member of the two national qualifying relay teams his freshman year. Kevin is also an extremely versatile competitor who will be swimming mainly in the freestyle and individual medley events but also can be counted on in the breaststroke.

JEFF MAXWELL, sophomore from Troy, was an All-

American in three events as a freshman. Besides backstroke, Jeff shows much promise in the middle distance freestyle and individual medley events. He holds both the 100 and 200 yd varsity backstroke records at Cortland.

TOM OLIVO, junior from Bedford Hills, has proven to be one of the leading divers in the state. Tom has finished in 14th place in the Nationals in both his two previous seasons. With his strong gymnastics background, Tom has improved tremendously over the past two years. He presently holds all varsity and pool records.

STEVE OLSEN, freshman from Woodstock, will help round out the sprint events. Steve will also be entered in the 200 yard freestyle.

MARK OUIOMET, freshman from Liverpool, will be a leading contender in the middle distance freestyle events. Mark will be a key figure in both the 400 and 800 freestyle relay teams.

BRIAN PAYNE, junior from Horseheads, will be a major contender in both the one and three meter diving events. Brian should finish in the finals on both boards at the conference championships.

PAUL ROTUNDI, junior from Oceanside, will be competing for the first time this season and will be used primarily in the breaststroke events.

JIM RUDNITSKI, junior from Afton, will be adding depth to an already strong distance freestyle field. Jim swam for Monroe Community College last year.

BOB SLATER, senior from Ithaca, is the only three year letterman on the team. Bob was a member of the All-American relay team last year and currently holds both the 100 and 200

butterfly records.

BILL THOMAS, freshman from Nichols, showed much promise in preseason work. Bill will be diving competitively for the first time this year but will be expected to carry on Cortland's fine tradition in diving.

HARRIET R. HOLSTEN POOL

Cortland swimming teams are beginning their fourth season in the College's impressive Physical Education-Recreation Center. The pool is named in memory of the late Harriet R. Holsten who specialized in the aquatics area as a member of the physical education faculty at the College from 1929 to her retirement in 1972. She died in March 1977.

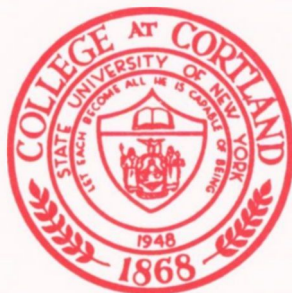
The Holsten Pool measures 45 feet by 50 meters and can be divided into three areas through the use of a pair of movable bulkheads. Generally, the bulkheads are used to allow separate areas for swimming and diving competition and warmups.

The pool is divided into six competitive lanes, while the diving area has two one-meter boards and two three-meter boards. Other features of the facility include an automatic timer and scoreboard, underwater lighting and a surface agitating system for diving competition.

The spectator gallery, on a steep enough angle so each person can see each swimming lane, has room for a crowd of 1,500. In addition to intercollegiate meets, the men's and women's pool also is used by local high schools, synchronized swim groups and for special exhibitions.
