ALAN STOCKHOLM

HEAD COACH

Alan Stockholm, a native of Montrose, Pa., has been the head basketball coach at Cortland for ten years. An assistant professor of physical education, he filled in as head coach of the Red Dragons in 1965-66 and became head coach in 1968-69. A 13-9 record in 1973-74 was his best year. His 1968-69 team was 9-1 in the SUNYAC and tied Buffalo State for the conference title. That Dragon team finished 11-8 overall.

Stockholm graduated from East Stroudsburg State College in Pennsylvania. He played guard on the basketball team and was a first baseman in baseball as an undergraduate there. Continuing his education, Stockholm earned an M.A. at the University of Maryland and has a doctor of physical education degree from Indiana University.

Stockholm has been the junior varsity baseball coach at Cortland in addition to his basketball duties. He also is a top horse-shoe competitor and a former New York State champion. Before coming to Cortland, he was basketball coach and physical education instructor with Allegheny Community College, Cumberland, Maryland.

KEVIN TOUHEY

ASSISTANT COACH

Serving as assistant varsity coach for the second year is Kevin Touhey, a graduate of Kean College of New Jersey where he earned a B.S. degree in outdoor education. He previously served as assistant coach for two years at Morris County College in Randolph, N.J.

Touhey, a native of Nutley, N.J., set basketball scoring records while playing for

Morris College. He scored a single game high of 36 points and set the single season scoring record which has since been broken. He was the team's MVP in 1970-71 and was named to all-conference and all-region junior college teams.

DARRELL BECKER

JUNIOR VARSITY COACH

Rochester native Darrell Becker, a newcomer to the Cortland coaching staff, will head the junior varsity squad this year. A graduate of East Rochester High School, he won a Cortland Alumni Association graduate assistantship last year. In addition to his junior varsity coaching duties, Becker is teaching a number of physical education activity courses.

Becker was a steady backcourt on the Cortland varsity for the last four years. He averaged 8.3 points per game and led the Red Dragons in free throw shooting his last two seasons. He played in every game as a junior starter two years ago and had a 6.9 scoring average.

BASKETBALL OUTLOOK FOR 1978-79

Overall team speed, versatility, and hustle - that's what head coach Al Stockholm hopes will bring his Red Dragon cagers success in the 1978-79 campaign. A potent one-four offense shouldn't hurt either, according to Stockholm, who enters his 11th Cortland hoop season. "We've improved on both ends of the court, but we are really high on our offense. That's reason number one why we'll be better than last year."

Returning junior guard from Cambria Heights Nick Wharton, one of four 1977-78 holdovers, figures to be the point guard and floor general in the new alignment. Slowed by a knee injury a year ago, Wharton takes over for last season's top scorer (16.2 points per game) and playmaker (74 assists) Terry Murphy.

An Oceanside native, Murphy completed his four-year varsity stay with 309 points to raise his career total to 1,046, placing him fourth on the all-time list of leading scorers at Cortland.

Stockholm, however, feels his strength this year is up front despite the absence of a dominating "true center." "We've got five or six players up front that are ready to go if they stay healthy," according to the Red Dragon coach, who opted for the 1-4 set up because of the group's versatility.

Senior captain Vince Gaetani is among the front-liners. The 6-3 188 pounder from Binghamton averaged 9.5 in eight games last season and scored at an 8.5 pace with 83 rebounds as a part-time starter two years ago.

Fellow returnees Ray Terken from East Meadow and Carle Place's Mike Polan look promising. "His shirt is wet after the first five minutes," says Stockholm of the aggressive, 6-4, 185 pound Terken. "And Polan is an all-around good player. He's sound and he'll play all over for us." Polan, at 6-3, 195 pounds, was a 7.8 point scorer as a freshman guard-forward last year.

Oyster Bay's Jim Meyerdierks (6-5, 195) was summoned from the jayvees a year ago and averaged 9.8 in five varsity appearances. A dominant JV performer, the sophomore needs

some work defensively according to Stockholm but is an explosive scorer.

Brentwood senior Jim Staak, sidelined with injuries since transferring here two years ago, is trying to rebound from a knee operation. A torrid shooter when healthy, he averaged 16 points and led Cortland to a 4-2 start before a broken wrist ended his first season.

Newcomer Kevin Miller, a 6-4, 205 pound Morris County (N.J.) College transfer, has impressed Stockholm and is a strong starting candidate because of his inside strength. Speedy Ithaca transfer Danny Price (Camden) and muscle man Kurt Smith (Valhalla), who co-captained the JV last year, strengthen the Cortland front line.

Three transfers supply backcourt depth. East Worcester's George Brown, Jeff Monroe of Auburn, and Miller Place's Dan Austin will spell Wharton. All are steady sharp shooters.

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION - RECREATION CENTER

Cortland's home basketball games are played in the main gymnasium of the College's PER Center. Seating capacity is 3600. An elevated glass enclosed press box provides a complete overview of the entire arena. Ample parking is provided in the College lots entered off Tompkins Street.

The PER Center was completed in 1972 and provides facilities for academic programs in physical education and recreation education and is the focal point for Cortland's intercollegiate and intramural athletic programs. In addition to the main gymnasium, other features of the building include a 50-meter swimming pool with gallery seats for 1500 spectators, an ice arena with a seating capacity of 2400, a gymnastics center and dance studio.

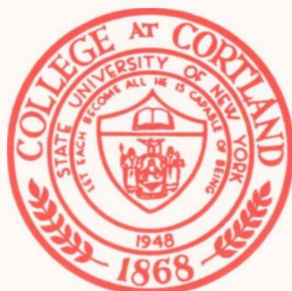
