HEAD COACH

PETE CAHILL

Beginning his sixth season as head coach of the men's intercollegiate swim team and his first season as the women's head coach, Pete Cahill has solidly established himself in the Cortland State aquatics program. Cahill's steadily improving 33-26-1 coaching record is evidence of Cortland's emergence as a major contender in SUNYAC competition.

In his first year at the helm, the Cortland men's squad managed just one win in 11 meets. In his second year, the Dragons improved to 5-8-1. Over Cahill's last three campaigns, Dragon swimmers have compiled 9-4, 10-1 and 8-3 records, respectively. Eight Cortland swimmers, including assistant coach Kerry Quilty, have earned All-American status under Cahill's direction.

Cahill is a 1966 graduate of Cortland. He has a master's degree from the University of Massachusetts and a doctorate from Springfield College. He is a native of Watertown, N.Y., and grew up in Malone, N.Y., where he graduated from Franklin Academy.

Before coming to Cortland, Cahill was a member of the faculty at SUNY Plattsburgh, where he coached swimming and tennis, and was a teaching fellow at Springfield College.

While an undergraduate at Cortland, Cahill concentrated on the butterfly and breast-stroke events as a member of the swimming team. He was captain in his senior year. In addition, he played varsity tennis.

A 1977 Cortland alumnus, Kerry Quilty is serving as assistant swimming and diving coach for the Cortland State men's and women's teams. As an undergraduate, Quilty was a four-year participant on the men's varsity swim team. In 1975, he earned All-American honors for Division III diving.

According to Coach Pete Cahill, Quilty will work primarily with the divers; however, his assistance will prove "very valuable to the entire team."

Quilty, a native of Liverpool, N.Y. is a graduate student in physical education at Cortland.

AN INDIVIDUAL LOOK AT THE MEN SWIMMERS

ANDY ARTHUR, a sophomore from Rome, is currently injured. Coach Pete Cahill hopes to have him back in January. Andy specializes in freestyle events.

DOUG ARTHUR, a senior and Andy's older brother, qualified for the NCAA Division III Nationals in the 100 yard backstroke last year. Doug, who also swims in the individual medley event, is expected to be one of the oustanding backstrokers in the state again this year.

JOHN GALLO, a senior from Long Beach, was a member of Cortland's NCAA Division III National qualifying medley relay team last year. John should be a major contender in both the 100 and 200 yard butterfly events in the conference championships again this year.

BRUCE GARDNER, a freshman from Fayetteville, will help the Dragons in both the butterfly and individual medley events this year. Bruce was a four year swimmer for Jamesville-Dewitt High School before coming to Cortland.

ERIC HARVEY, a junior from Newark, finished last season as a member of both the 400 yard and 800 yard freestyle relay teams. Eric's ability in the freestyle and individual medley events adds a great deal of versatility to the team.

STEVE HOFF, a freshman freestyler from Jamesville Dewitt High School, has shown excellent promise in pre-season workouts this fall. Steve is expected to be one of the premiere sprinters in the conference this season. MARK KLIER, a sophomore from Liverpool, specializes in the distance events for Cortland. Last year, Mark finished higher than any other freshman in the conference in the 1650 yard freestyle event. Mark will be swimming the 500 and 1000 yard freestyle events as well as the 400 yard individual medley.

KEVIN MARKWARDT, a junior from Ithaca, will be swimming the middle distance freestyle events and should be a major contender to win the 100, 200 and 500 yard freestyle events at the SUNYAC championships. Kevin was a member of Cortland's two national qualifying relay teams in his freshman year.

JEFF MAXWELL, a junior from Latham, has earned NCAA Division III All-American status in both the 100 and 200 yard backstroke for the past two years. Jeff, who holds the 100 and 200 yard varsity backstroke records at Cortland, has been undefeated in these events for the past two years at the state conference championships.

ED MORFORD, a native of Endicott, is a senior transfer from Oneonta State. Ed will add a great deal of versatility in not only the middle distance, but also the distance freestyle and butterfly events. Ed is expected to be a finalist in three events at the conference championships.

STEVE OLSON, a sophomore from Woodstock, showed tremendous improvement as a freshman swimmer. This year, Steve will be entered mainly in the sprint freestyle events.

MARK OUIMET, a sophomore from Liverpool, was a member of both the 400 and 800 yard freestyle relay teams last year. Mark, a sprint freestyler, will primaily be swimming the 100 and 200 yard freestyle events.

BILL RITTER, a freshman from New Hartford, will add a great deal of depth in the individual medley event for the Dragons. Bill also shows promise as both a 100 and 200 yard breaststroker.

MIKE ROBINSON, a freshman from Ronkonkoma, will be swimming the sprint and middle distance freestyle events. Mike was a swimmer for Sachem High School before coming to Cortland.

TOM SIMMS, a junior transfer from Fairmont State College in West Virginia, will specialize in the sprint freestyle events for the Dragons. Tom is a native of Bath, N.Y.

ERIC WALDBAUER, a local swimmer from Cortland, transferred from Oneonta State this year. Last year, Eric finished in the finals of the 200 yard breaststroke at the state championships while an Oneonta swimmer. Eric, a sophomore, will add a great deal of depth in the breaststroke events which has traditionally been a weak spot for Cortland.

MIKE WARD, a sophomore from Ithaca, will be swimming the 100 and 200 yard breaststroke events and will also be one of the major IMers on the Dragons this year. A transfer student, Mike previously attended Alfred ATC and Tompkins Cortland Community College.

The Cortland State men's varsity swim team will receive additional depth from: Paul Bartlett, a senior from Vestal, who swims distance freestyle; Chris Carnesale, a freshman from Monsey, in the butterfly competition; Bill Nilsson, a freshman from Holbrook, in both the freestyle and butterfly events; and John Turbayne, a junior from Rochester, who specializes in distance freestyle.

According to Cahill, there appears to be more depth on the team than in any previous year that he has been at Cortland. This added depth should make Cortland a major contender in every event.

OUTLOOK FOR THE MEN DIVERS

Traditionally strong in diving, Cortland should have more depth in the diving events than ever before during the 1978-79 season. Senior Tom Olivo of Bedford Hills, is returning for his final season with the Dragons much to the delight of Coach Pete Cahill. Tom currently holds all varsity and pool records in diving and has qualified for the National NCAA Division III Championships for the past three years. Last year, Olivo attained NCAA Division III All-American status in the 3 meter diving event.

Also returning to the Dragon diving team is Brian Payne, a senior from Horseheads. Brian, who is beginning his fourth and final season on the team, has qualified for NCAA Division III Nationals the past two years. It is expected that Payne will be one of the finalists in both the one and three meter diving events at the State Championship meet this year.

Three freshmen are vying for positions on the diving team. Scott Creighton, a graduate of Jamesville-DeWitt High School, impressed in pre-season. Tom Kenneally of Central Valley and Mark Zeller of Apalachin also will be strong.

According to Coach Cahill, these three divers combined with the two returnees "will undoubtedly give Cortland one of the strongest teams in the state." Cahill also credits assistant coach Kerry Quilty for the strong pre-season performances of the Cortland divers. Quilty a Cortland alumnus, attained NCAA Division III All-American status during the 1974-75 season in the one meter diving event.

1977-78 Brenda Hickey, 400 Yard Ind. Medley With eight AIAW Small College National qualifiers returning, Pete Cahill is in an enviable position as Cortland State women's varsity swimming coach. Cahill, who took over the helm from Mary Kay Kazlusky this year, inherits a team that earned a 6-3 dual meet record and a sixth place in NYSAIAW, and participated in both the EAIAW Regional and AIAW Small College National Championships during the 1977-78 season.

As with the men, the women's diving team will be exceptionally strong. Three AIAW Small College National qualifiers, Lynn Hunziker of Rye, Dale Fiegl of Clarence and June Preger of Lauderhill, Florida (formerly Great Neck, N.Y.), will form the nucleus of the Dragon diving team. Hunziker and Fiegl, both seniors and qualifiers in the one and three meter diving events at the nationals, are three year veterans on the team. Preger, a sophomore, holds varsity records in both one and three meter diving at Cortland, holds the pool record for one meter diving, and qualified for both the one and three meter diving events at the nationals.

Freshmen Lorie Brown of East Aurora and Sue Muller of West Islip also have looked very impressive in pre-season diving workouts and should be major contenders for Cortland this year. According to Cahill, all five divers appear very close in ability.

In the swimming events, Cortland should be strong in both backstroke and distance freestyle where a combination of veterans and newcomers will provide a great deal of depth. Soph Darlene Connell of Scottsville and junior Debbie Thoman of Katonah are returning to lead the Dragon backstrokers, while Sophs Mary Ellen

Plubell of Buffalo and Cynthia McAllan of Amityville should be major contenders in the distance freestyle events. Cortland appears weakest in breaststroke events where only soph Karen Toper of Watertown has competed previously for the Dragons.

AN INDIVIDUAL LOOK AT CORTLAND'S WOMEN SWIMMERS

RENEE BECKLEY, a freshman from Valhalla, will be competing mainly in the individual medley events for Cortland. According to Coach Pete Cahill, Renee has shown a great deal of promise in preseason workouts.

DARLENE CONNELL, a sophomore from Scottsville, was a national qualifier in the 100 yard backstroke last year. Darlene holds both varsity and pool records in the 50 yard backstroke, as well as a pool record in the 100 yard backstroke.

THERESA CONTOS, a sophomore from Syracuse, will compete in the butterfly and freestyle events. A newcomer to Cortland swimming, Theresa should make her presence felt in both events. Theresa also competes in softball and soccer at Cortland.

MARY ELLEN FAVA, a freshman from Mamaroneck has shown a great deal of promise in pre-season workouts. Mary Ellen will compete in the sprint freestyle and butterfly events.

MONICA FLANNERY, last year's athletic trainer, returns to the team as a swimmer this season. A senior from White Plains, Monica will compete in freestyle events.

KATHY KLIER, a junior transfer from Liverpool, will be swimming distance freestyle and backstroke events for the Red Dragons. Kathy, whose brother Mark competes on the men's swim team at Cortland, previously attended SUC Buffalo and Kansas University.

BETH LEONARD, a sophomore from Attica, was a member of the 200 yard medley team that qualified for the nationals last year. Leonard, who specializes in sprint freestyle events, holds the varsity record at Cortland for the 50 yard freestyle.

CYNTHIA MCALLAN, a sophomore transfer from Amity-ville, is an all-around swimmer and should add a great deal of versatility to the team. Cynthia will compete primarily in middle distance and distance freestyle events and should be a major contender for the Dragons. Cynthia previously attended the University of South Carolina and Farmingdale ATC.

CATHLEEN O'CONNOR, a sophomore from Larchmont, returns for her second season. A versatile swimmer, Cathleen will be competing in both freestyle and backstroke events.

MARY ELLEN PLUBELL, a sophomore from Buffalo, showed tremendous improvement in pre-season workouts. Mary Ellen, who will be swimming primarily distance freestyle events, was a member of the 200 yard freestyle relay team that holds a Cortland varsity record and qualified for the AIAW Small College National Championships last year.

ANN RIDLER, one of the four seniors on the team, returns as a sprint freestyler for the Dragons. Ridler, who was the lead-off swimmer on the national qualifying 200 yard freestyle relay team last season, hails from Lockport.

DEBBIE THOMAN, a junior from Katonah, holds the varsity record for the 100 yard backstroke event and was also a member of the record setting 400 yard medley and 800 yard freestyle relay teams two years ago. This season, Debbie will be competing in the backstroke and individual medley events for Cortland.

KAREN TOPER, a sophomore from Watertown, returns as Cortland's leading breaststroker. As a freshman, Toper set varsity records in the 50 and 100 yard breaststroke events, set a pool record in the 100 yard breaststroke event, and was a member of the national qualifying and varsity record setting 200 yard medley relay team. Karen should be a major contender in the state for the Dragons this year.

SYLVIA WEISER, a sophomore from Monsey, is a newcomer to the Cortland swim team. Sylvia, who competed in swimming at Spring Valley High School, will add depth in the breaststroke events for the Dragons.

Other Cortland swimmers who will add depth in distance freestyle events include: sophomores Amy Lyn Grandrath of Westport; Debbie Miller of Hartsdale; Sue Scheier of Stony Brook; and junior Gretchen Van De Carr of Orchard Park.

Missing from the 1978-79 Cortland State women's swim team will be two-time All-American Brenda Hickey, a junior from Rochester who is studying in Germany. Hickey set eight varsity records and one pool record during her two years on the Cortland team. As a freshman, she received All-American honors as part of Cortland's 800 yard freestyle relay team. Last year, Brenda qualified for the AIAW Small College National Championships in the 50 butterfly, 200 butterfly, and 400 individual medley events. Hickey earned All-American honors for her performance in the 400 individual medley event at the nationals.

HARRIET R. HOLSTEN POOL

Cortland swimming teams are beginning their fourth season in the College's impressive Physical Education-Recreation Center. The pool is named in memory of the late Harriet R. Holsten who specialized in the aquatics area as a member of the physical education faculty at the College from 1929 to her retirement in 1972. She died in March 1977.

The Holsten Pool measures 45 feet by 50 meters and can be divided into three areas through the use of a pair of movable bulkheads. Generally, the bulkheads are used to allow separate areas for swimming and diving competition and warmups.

The pool is divided into six competitive lanes, while the diving area has two one-meter boards and two three-meter boards. Other features of the facility include an automatic timer and scoreboard, underwater lighting and a surface agitating system for diving competition.

The spectator gallery, on a steep enough angle so each person can see each swimming lane, has room for a crowd of 1,500. In addition to intercollegiate meets, the men's and women's pool also is used by local high schools, synchronized swim groups and for special exhibitions.


