We might say that we're home to meet some mighty tough competition rather than any pushover. If anything, the schedule gets harder as the season progresses.

At this point we would like to extend a hearty greeting to coach Curt Gaylord and his Brockport State Teachers College Golden Eagles, who will provide the opposition here tonight. The green and gold always play well against Cortland inasmuch as the rivalry between the two schools has always been very keen. This year will be no exception as Coach Gaylord has five lettermen along with very good heighth. John Benson and Don O'Brien, the two backcourt men, are very fast and are exceptional shooters from the outside. We're quite sure that they will be up for this one and that the Red Dragons will not take them too lightly in this initial contest of the new year in Cortland's beautiful gymnasium.

To catch up on some back business, after the season's opener against Buffalo State, Cortland traveled to Alfred where they eked out a close 75-74 win over the Saxons. In their next outing in Syracuse, the Dragons downed an always tough LeMoyne team 87-82 in overtime. Hitting the proverbial skids on their New Jersey trip, the Dragons lost two very close contests. The first heartbreaking loss came at the hands of a tough Rider College team 77-78. The next night Farleigh-Dickinson proved too much for the Dragons as they won 77-72. This put the Dragons 3-2 on the season before entering the Hofstra tournament.

At Hempstead, the home of Hofstra College, the red and white faced very stiff competition but did remarkably well in winning third place and a fine trophy. In the opening game, the Dragons beat Springfield College 81-62. The following night they met a very strong Bucknell five, who beat the red and white 87-62. Bucknell went on to finish second, losing the championship game to West Virginia Tech. The consolation against Hofstra College was won by Cortland 76-66.

In a recent trip up north, the Dragons lost a close one to St. Lawrence 76-80. 'The following afternoon the Coreymen downed a strong Clarkson five 85-58. In this victory, the team displayed fine team play and this game gave them a 6-4 record before returning for a six game home stand.

Friday night the Dragons entertain the University of Buffalo, with Mansfield coming here a week from tonight.






