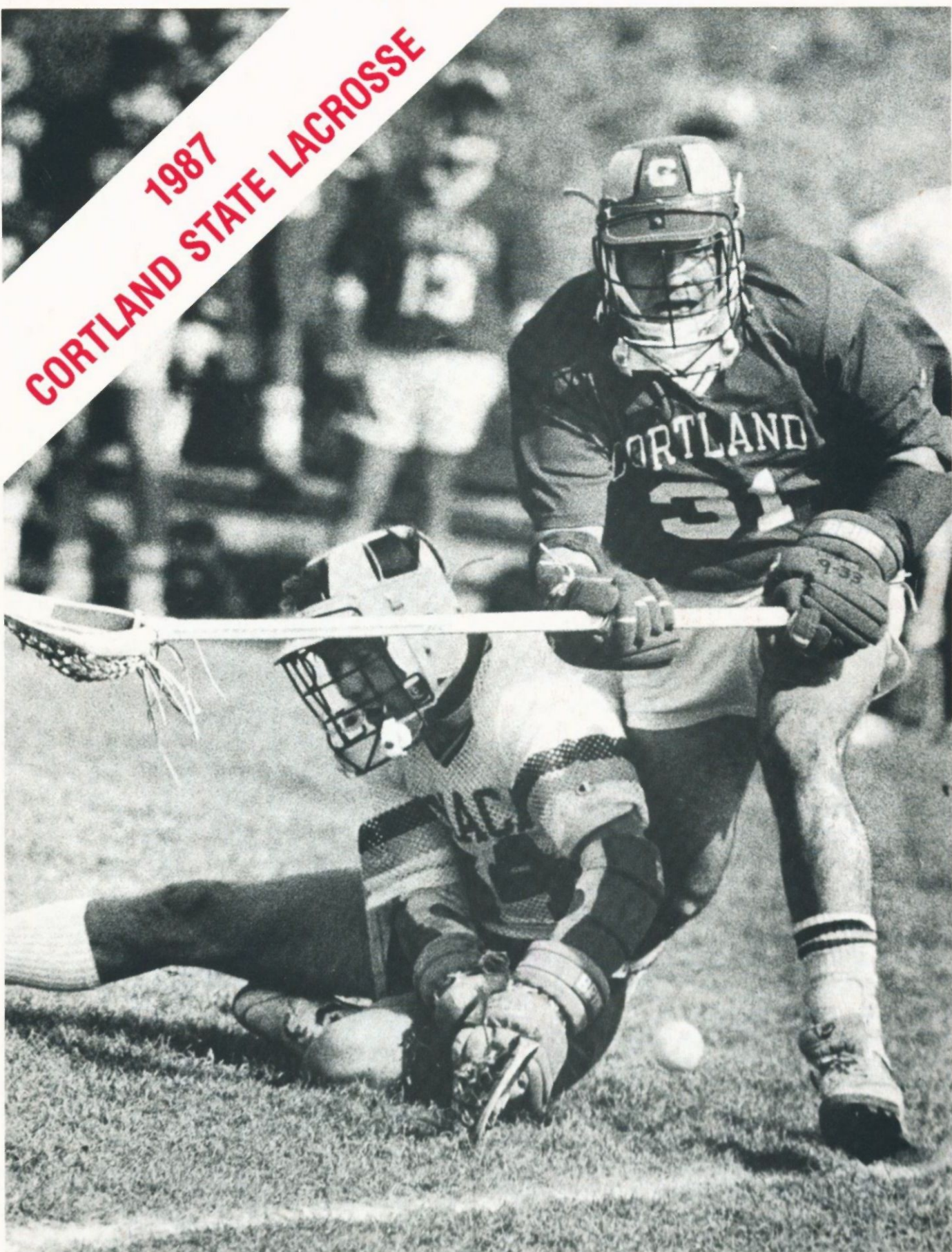

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK COLLEGE AT CORTLAND

Located atop one of the many hills in Central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of the legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to a bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland College was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, more than 5,600 undergraduate and 600 graduate students are pursuing degrees within the College's two academic divisions — Arts and Sciences and Professional Studies. Twenty-three departments with a faculty of more than 300 offer the Cortland State student body some 40 majors from which to choose, including economics, biology, sociology, elementary and secondary education, physical education, health education and recreation, to name a few.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 30 major buildings. Fourteen of these structures are residence halls and provide on-campus housing for 2,600 students. Cortland also operates its Outdoor Education Center at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, the Hoxie Gorge Nature Preserve outside Cortland, and the Brauer Memorial Geological Field Station near Albany on the Helderberg Escarpment.

At Cortland State, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland State participates in 24 intercollegiate sports — 12 men's and 12 women's — in an attempt to provide a broad program of athletics which will meet the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The stated objective of the College's athletic program is the development and welfare of the student. In the coaching of individual sports as well as in the direction of the overall athletic program, the College endeavors to provide a high calibre of professional leadership which is consistent with the goals of the institution.

Cortland State is particularly proud of its long tradition of intercollegiate athletics and its high standing in small college athletic circles. In support of this heritage, the College offers its student athletes a number of outstanding indoor and outdoor facilities

which are used for intercollegiate competition as well as educational and recreational purposes.

The Park Center for Physical Education and Recreation, opened in 1973, features a main gymnasium with a seating capacity of 3,600, an Olympic-size swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500, an ice arena which can accommodate 2,500 spectators; racquetball and squash courts, a wrestling room, and modern athletic training facilities. Nearby Lusk Field House, with its new tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. The Red Dragon football and lacrosse squads compete on Davis Field, with its 5,000 seating capacity. Cortland's soccer teams play on Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests. The College has 50 acres of athletic fields and 24 outdoor tennis courts.



Cortland College's first student union, Brockway Hall was named for the late George Brockway, former president of the Brockway Motor Truck Corporation of Cortland, who donated the money for the building's construction in 1950. Brockway Hall houses a dining hall, the Creamery snack bar, and WSUC-FM, the student radio station. In 1985, the Cortland College Alumni Association refurbished the Brockway Hall formal lounge, which is used for receptions and special events.

HEAD COACH JERRY CASCIANI

Dr. Jerry Casciani, a member of the Cortland State faculty since 1970, begins his fourth season as the Red Dragon head lacrosse coach.

The Niagara Falls, N.Y., native, who has taken the Dragons to the NCAA Div. III Tournament in each of his previous three seasons, maintains a coaching philosophy that demands discipline and responsibility from his players, but in turn allows them a greater amount of freedom on the playing field.

"A coach needs to be the leader of a team," says Casciani, who directed Baltimore (MD) Junior College to the unofficial national title in 1967. "The coach makes the critical decisions and imposes discipline, but he teaches his players to take responsibility on the field. The test of a good leader is that when the leader's absent the group functions just as well without him. The more responsibility the players can take, the better off they are as a team."

In addition to serving as assistant lacrosse coach at Cortland, Casciani has also been the Red Dragon head wrestling coach, assistant wrestling coach, and linebacker coach with the Red Dragon football squad.

Casciani earned a bachelor of science degree from Springfield College in 1959, a master's degree from Penn State in 1960, and an Ed.D. in Physical Education from West Virginia University in 1980.

He played semi-pro football in Pennsylvania for two seasons and was an assistant football coach at Manhasset (NY) High School. From 1964 to 1967, Casciani was head lacrosse and wrestling coach, and assistant football coach at Baltimore Junior College. Before coming to Cortland, Casciani served as district chairman of health and physical education of the Northeastern School District of York County, Pennsylvania.

An associate professor in the Cortland Physical Education Department, Jerry and his wife, Judith Lee, and their children, Christopher, 18, and Jennifer, 15, reside in Cortland.

ASSISTANT COACH RICH CECCONI

Rich Cecconi, beginning his third season with the Red Dragons, will be the defensive coordinator in 1987.

A native of Little Falls, N.Y., Cecconi graduated from Cortland State with a B.S. in Education in 1974. He played lacrosse while at the College. For the past 13 years, Cecconi, a member of the National Science Teachers Association, has been a science instructor in the Homer Central School District.

From 1976 to 1980, Cecconi guided the Homer High junior varsity to a 47-28 lacrosse record. As Homer High head coach from 1981 to 1984, Cecconi's charges posted a 43-26 mark. Cecconi, who belongs to the USLCA and USILA, has been the Central New York correspondent for *In the Crease* magazine.

He and his wife, Christine, and their children, Andrea, 6, and Nicholas, 2, reside in Cortland.

ASSISTANT COACH JOHN EBERENZ

An All-America attackman on Cortland State's powerhouse teams in the early 1970's, John Eberenz starts his fourth season as a Red Dragon assistant.

Born in Ancon, Panama, Eberenz grew up on Long Island and played his scholastic lacrosse at Plainview High. At Cortland State, John competed in lacrosse from 1969 to 1972. He won third team All-America honors on attack for the 1972 Red Dragon squad, to date the only small college team ever invited to participate in the NCAA Division I Tournament.

He is single and resides in Cortland.

ASSISTANT COACH RICH KEEGAN

Rich Keegan, who won numerous honors as the highly successful Simsbury (CT) High head lacrosse coach during the past four years, joins the Cortland staff as goalie coach in 1987.

A native of Manhasset, Keegan captained the Manhasset High team to the Nassau County title in 1975 before attending Penn State, where he was a three-year defensive starter and co-captain his senior year. Keegan earned a B.A. in Speech Communications from Penn State in 1979 and later received his graduate certification in physical education from Central Connecticut State.

After two years as assistant coach at Avon Old Farms, CT, Keegan became head coach at Simsbury High. From 1982 to 1985, he took his teams to the state quarter-finals two years and to the state semifinals two years, while posting a 46-19 record. The Connecticut High School Coach of the Year in 1983, Keegan was president of the Connecticut High School Lacrosse Coaches Association in 1984. That same year, he coached the North squad in the Connecticut All-Star Game and was an assistant coach at the national North-South Game in Baltimore.

Rich is single and resides in Ithaca.



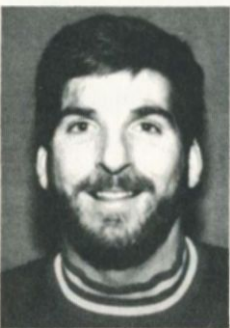

Joe Gargiul, who helped coach the Dragons in 1984, returns to the Cortland staff in 1987.

A social studies teacher at Moravia High, Gargiul directed the Auburn High lacrosse team in 1985. The Auburn, N.Y., native played goalie for High High before attending Ashland (OH) College, where he earned MVP honors as a lax goaltender.

Gargiul, a former junior varsity soccer and basketball coach at both Auburn High and Lowville High, has also directed the girls basketball team at Lowville and was assistant women's basketball coach at Oswego State.

Gargiul is single and resides in Auburn.

1987 OUTLOOK:

DRAGONS BLEND IMPROVED OFFENSE WITH VETERAN DEFENSIVE CORPS

Last year, the Cortland State squad posted an 11-5 record, captured yet another State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) lacrosse championship, and advanced to the NCAA Division III semifinals before losing to perennial power Hobart College.

Head coach Jerry Casciani, who's taken his Red Dragons to the NCAA playoffs every one of his three previous years at the helm, says his 1987 unit packs a more powerful scoring punch and boasts its most seasoned defense in years. Yet the Dragons must replace no less than six midfielders who graduated in 1986.

"We think we're going to improve this year, although I'm not sure what that means in terms of wins and losses," said Casciani. "We lost five games last year — three to Division I teams and two to Division III championship Hobart. This year we'll have to hold our own against teams like RIT and St. Lawrence. I would be disappointed if we weren't even more dominant in the SUNYAC. We have more depth, especially with guys who can score."

For Cortland to better its mark in 1987, the Dragons must fell more Division I timber at the same four road stops which began the season a year ago: Army, Cornell, Princeton and Syracuse. Cortland went 1-3 — Princeton being the lone victim — to start the 1986 campaign.

"We should definitely be better this year," said Casciani. "We think we have the chance to win three of those four."

The Dragon mentor quickly qualified his statement with a list of prerequisites which, in effect, will decide just how far this latest Cortland edition will go in 1987.

"We have to become a ball control team in addition to a scoring team off the transition," Casciani explained. "We have the ability to do that. If we can get the leadership, and if our defense plays as well as we think it can, and if our middies are really aggressive on groundballs — if we do all those things — we have a chance to win three of our first four games."

When surveying the talent of his Dragon unit, Casciani points to the Dragon defense as one of the team's mainstays this spring.

"The best thing for sure we can say is that we're going to be unusually strong defensively," said the Cortland coach. "We have basically the same people back. They have all improved and we've added three or four good players to that group."

Seniors John McCarthy and Craig Papach, and juniors Jeff Thomas and Rob Droluk head the close defense, which begins its second season under the guidance of assistant coach Rich Ceconi. Juniors Mark DeLany and Tony Levin, freshmen Steve Smart, Jeff Klodzen and Bob Jones, provide depth.

The Dragon defensive midfield, which Casciani views as "exceptional," has veteran Chris Tedeschi teamed with Pat Coward and Tom Ogden.

"Midfield's a big question mark, obviously," said Casciani, who must replace six seniors, including the tandem of John Caveny and All-America Dave Cook that combined for one-quarter of the team's groundballs last season.

"We have all new people," he continued. "There'll be no seniors there. Right now, nine people have emerged as competitive for the top six spots. There will be more maneuvering. We will run only two midfield units but more people will be involved. However, we already have better stick skills than last year's midfield. Whether they're going to be as effective on groundballs and between the restraining lines, or as intense, is the question."

Mark Stuver, a transfer from Hofstra University, heads the midfield list along with a pair of Dragon veterans, Paul Cicio and Fred Saracene, who make the transition from attack. Sophomores John Roth and Ed Whelsky bring familiarity with the Cortland scheme, while Cobleskill transfer Brian Jenkins and freshmen Mike Leuze and Joey DiLaura will contribute to the effort. Junior Sandy Franzetta, who won 59 percent of his faceoffs in 1986, is back.

"We have to improve the defensive ability of our short stick middies, our so-called offensive middies," noted Casciani. "One of the ways I want to do that is more ball control on offense, number one. Number two, to stop the opponent's transition. We're an excellent transitional team ourselves, but we don't do so well stopping the opponent's transition. The

onus is on the middies to not put as much pressure on the defense as we did last year."

On attack, the Dragons lost John McNerney, who tallied 196 points during his four years. But seniors Mike "D.D." Kesselring, who tied McNerney for the scoring lead with 40 goals and 23 points in 1986, and All-America Tim DeLany, the Dragons' top goal scorer with 46 a year ago, are back. Talented senior Bob Williams, who had a mediocre junior season, takes his offensive talents to attack. For depth, the Dragons have sophomore Matt Chapple and seniors John Rainis and Joe Lawless, though Casciani may use Cicio and Saracene at attack as well as at their new midfield roles.

"One thing we've never had that I want to have is a much better disciplined offense and ball control," Casciani said. "That, I see as really important to our success. If we don't get that, we're not going to be as successful as we can become. The offensive skills are there to have that kind of ball control. We really didn't have those kind of offensive skills at the midfield last year. We had it at places. But we should be able to control the ball if we're intelligent."

Junior Hal Newman, who handled most of the Cortland goaltending duties last season, returns in the nets. Newman earned a 10-5 record but had a 56.5 save percentage and a 12.49 goals/against average. Backing up Newman will be Charlie Gast and Jim Konen, both juniors.

"The thing we need in goal is an outstanding game against the people who shoot very well, like Syracuse and Hobart," said Casciani. "Overall, I think there'll be less pressure on the goalie this year. Now that we're a little stronger defensively, he'll be able to better predict where the shot's going to come from. And we may even be able to dictate where they're going to get the shot, or who's going to take it."



Experience should make two-year veteran Hal Newman the pre-season favorite for the starting goalie spot. Newman, a junior, had a 10-5 record in 1986.

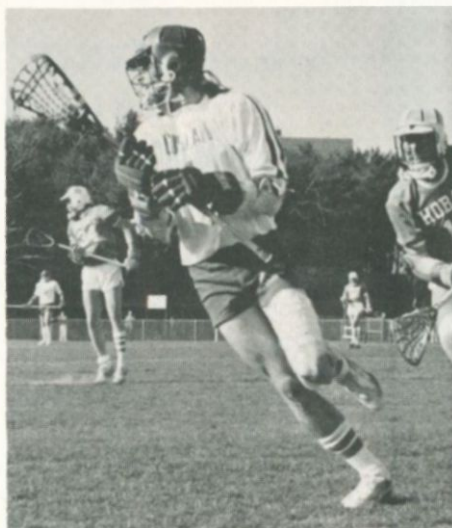

CORTLAND STATE: CRADLE OF LACROSSE COACHING

Over the years, a significant number of Cortland graduates — almost all of them former Red Dragon players — have entered the coaching ranks at all levels to foster the sport of lacrosse.

These Cortland alumni continued to distinguish themselves in 1986. Dave Urick, who was selected to the Cortland Hall of Fame in November, directed Hobart to another NCAA Div. III title.
