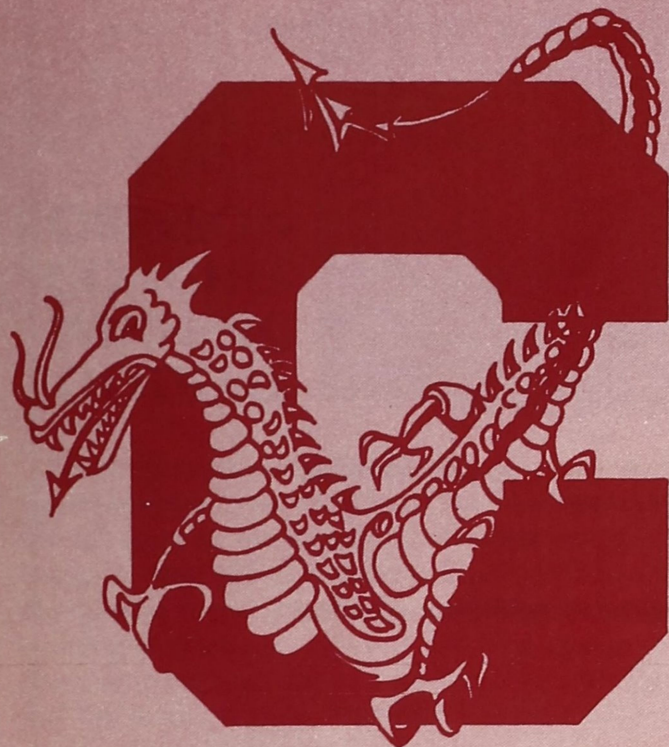

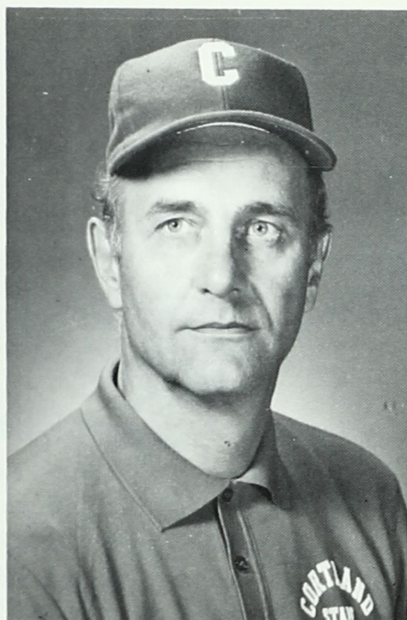

ROBINSON COACHES WINNING FOOTBALL



Cortland State football under Coach Roger Robinson has been among the best of small colleges playing the fall sport in the Eastern College Athletic Conference. In nine years, Robinson-coached teams have compiled a record of 48 wins and 28 losses for a .615 winning percentage. Eight of the nine seasons have been winning seasons. In a total of 75 games during the Robinson regime, the Red Dragons have out-

scored their opponents by 1,584 points to 1,034. Cortland teams have averaged 21 points per game while holding their opponents to a 13 point average.

The Cortland coach is particularly proud of the high caliber of the Red Dragon schedule each year. The 1972 schedule includes New York State colleges plus teams from Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Only one of the nine opponents in '72 does not engage in spring football practice. Neither does Cortland, and the Dragons operate with no athletic scholarships. These factors alone are high commendation for Robinson's ability to generate winning teams.

Robinson has coached four football College All-Americans at Cortland. Rod Verkey was a first team end in 1967; Ray Viladesau was a second team center in 1968; and tackle Pat Nugent and receiver Earl Rogers were accorded honorable mention in 1969.

Robinson is an associate professor in the Men's Physical Education Department. He also is an assistant coach in track. He has bachelor's and master's degrees from Syracuse University where he excelled as a starting tailback in football. He was an assistant coach for six years at Harvard before joining the Cortland faculty.

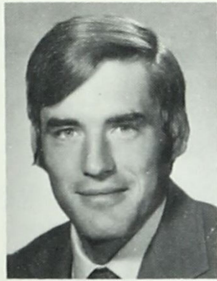

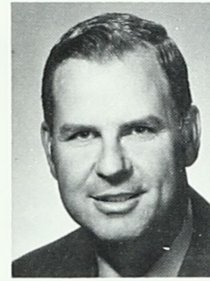

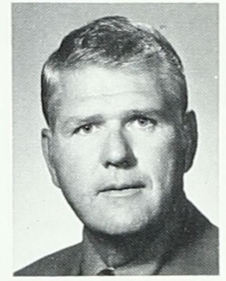

ASSISTANT COACHES

BOB CAMPBELL, Offensive Backs: One of Penn State's all-time running backs; is in his first year with the Cortland staff although he helped last year while a graduate student; finished his master's degree work this summer; was MVP in 1969 North-South game and played in the National Football League with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

JERRY CASCIANI, Defensive Ends and Linebackers: Member of the faculty since 1970; was head wrestling coach in 71-72 while Vince Gonino was on sabbatical leave; has B.S. from Springfield and M.S. from Penn State; coached previously at high school and junior college level.

VINCE GONINO, Assistant J.V. Coach: An assistant professor of physical education, he is returning to campus after a year's sabbatical leave to work on Ph.D. at Ohio State where he did his undergraduate work; his master's is from Ohio University; has worked regularly with freshman footballers since

coming to Cortland in 1965; was named head wrestling coach in 1969.

LARRY MARTIN, J.V. Coach. A Cortland native, he graduated from local schools and earned B.S. and M.S. degrees at Cortland; was a starting end on Chugger Davis teams; earned D.P.E. from Springfield; is an associate professor in Men's P.E. Department and has served as varsity golf coach.

TOM STEELE, Defensive Backfield: Second year with the Red Dragons as coach and assistant professor of physical education; played halfback at Hiram College where he obtained B.A. degree; master's degree is from Kent State; has completed Ph.D. course work at Ohio State.

DICK WHEATON, Offensive Line: Graduated from Brockport and has master's from Ithaca; played linebacker and fullback at Brockport and with U.S. Marines; came to Cortland in 1971 after highly successful coaching job at Owego Free Academy where his teams won five league crowns.

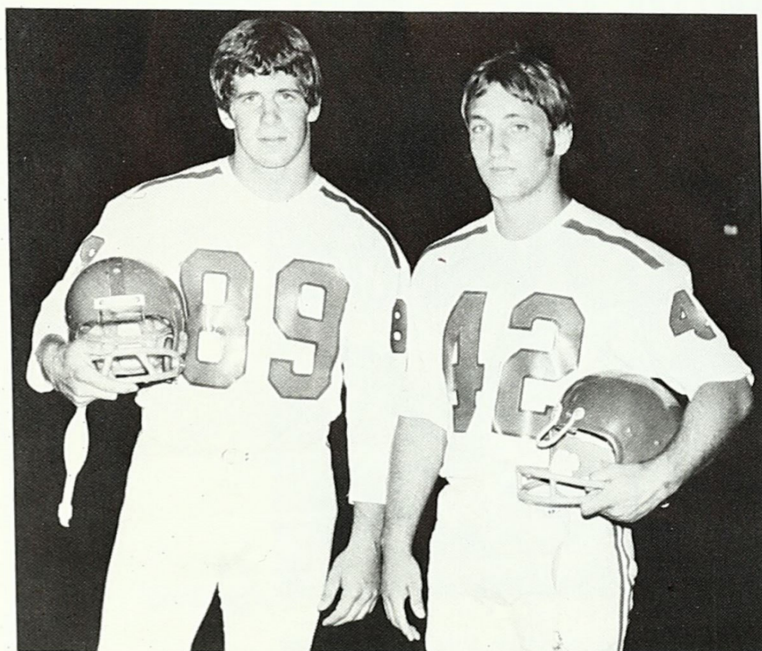

GARY THEOBALD is a 6-3, 215 pound senior from Oceanside, N.Y. He transferred to Cortland from Nassau Community College and is majoring in physical education. He is a graduate of Oceanside High School. At Cortland, he was the team's leading pass catcher in 1971 with 26 receptions for 306 offensive yards. As an offensive end, he is considered one of the best in a long line of outstanding Cortland receivers.

JOHN ESPEY is a 5-10, 180 senior from Uniondale, N.Y. He transferred to Cortland after two years at Nassau Community College and is majoring in physical education. He is a product of Chaminade High School in Mineola. During the 1971 season, he was highly regarded as one of the Red Dragon's leading tacklers. Injuries kept him sidelined somewhat during the year but he came up with 30 unassisted tackles in the course of his playing time. He plays defensive safety.

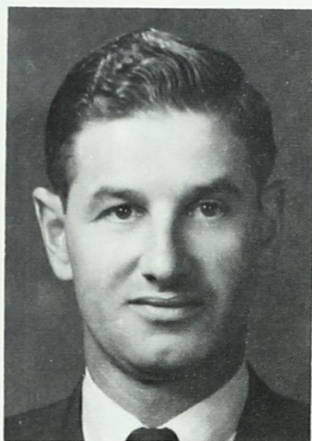

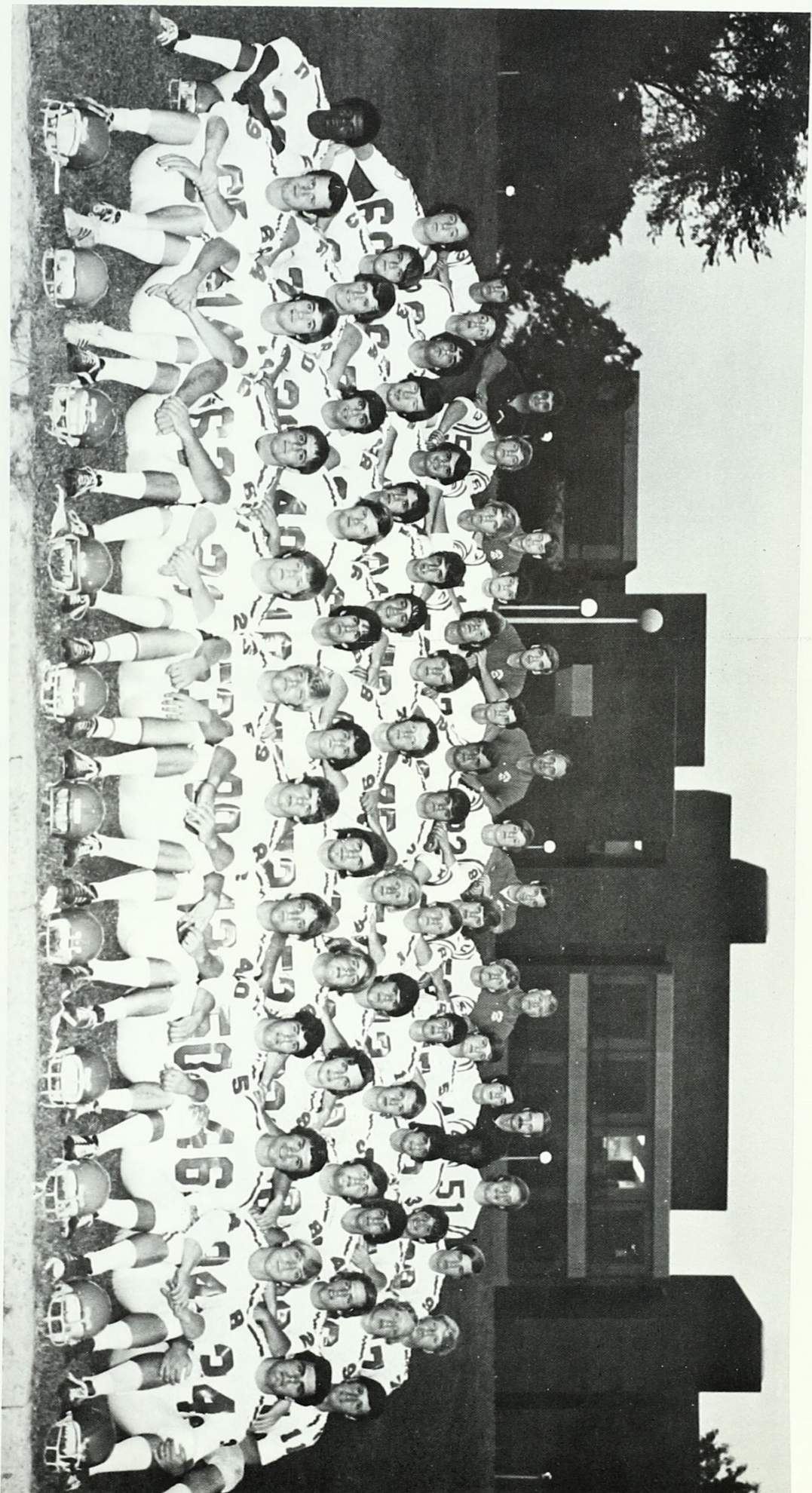
