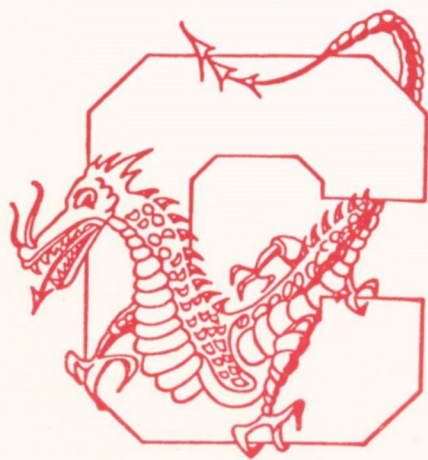

## ROGER ROBINSON

## HEAD COACH

The 1977 football season will be the 15th for Coach Roger Robinson at Cortland. Robinson has been the head coach for Cortland more years than any other man except the late Carl "Chugger" Davis who coached for 31 years. In 14 seasons, Robinson-coached teams have compiled a record 62-55-3 against some of the best teams in the NCAA's Division II and III groupings. Cortland, a Division III team, regularly plays teams from Division II. For example, this year five of Cortland's 10 opponents are Division II schools.

A graduate of Syracuse University, Robinson was one of the nation's leading punters during his intercollegiate career. He was a starter for the Orangemen at tailback and also saw duty as a defensive safetyman. In his senior year, Robinson was named to the East squad for the East-West Shrine Game. He also earned a master's degree at Syracuse.

Robinson's first coaching assignment was as a line coach under Andy Kerr at Lebanon

Valley, Pa., from 1948-50. He was head football and track coach at Port Jervis High School (N.Y.) from 1951-1956. Robinson's next six years were spent at Harvard where he was the backfield coach in football and the freshman coach in track.

Robinson is a native of Endicott, N.Y., where he competed in football, basketball and track at Union-Endicott High School. He is well known as a speaker at football clinics for high school players and coaches and has devoted considerable attention to the study of football head and neck injuries for the NCAA.

In January 1976, Roger Robinson was named director of athletics for the men's intercollegiate athletic program at Cortland. In addition to being athletic director and football coach, Robinson is an associate professor of physical education and an assistant coach with Cortland's outdoor track team.

## DICK WHEATON

## DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Dick Wheaton is in his seventh season as an assistant coach and assistant professor of physical education at Cortland State. His success with the Cortland defense comes as no surprise since he was highly successful as a high school coach at nearby Owego High School before joining the Red Dragon staff in 1971. Wheaton's Owego teams won five high school league championships in seven seasons, compiling an overall record of 43-14-1.

Wheaton is a former member of the U.S. Marine Corps and a graduate of the SUNY College at Brockport. His master's degree was earned at Ithaca College. During playing days, he saw action as both a linebacker and a fullback.

## TOM STEELE

## DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Tom Steele is beginning his seventh season as an assistant football coach at Cortland State. An assistant professor of physical education, Steele received his B.S. degree from Hiram College in Hiram, Ohio. At Hiram, Steele was a two-way starter at halfback. He earned a master's degree at Kent State University and a Ph.D. in physical education at Ohio State University.

At Ohio State, Steele coached offensive backs on the freshman football team and later moved to the varsity where he worked with wide receivers and was part of the scouting team. Prior to his experience at O.S.U., he had been football coach at East Liverpool High School in Ohio and was an instructor at Adrian College in Michigan.

A newcomer to the Cortland coaching staff this year is Tom Saxon, a native of Columbia, S.C. He is a graduate of North Carolina Central University and has a master's degree in physical education from the University of Wisconsin.

While he was doing graduate work at Wisconsin the past two years, Saxon served as an administrative assistant in physical education and in the minority studies program. He coached the defensive line for Wisconsin's varsity football team and was assistant varsity coach for women's basketball and was head coach of the women's JV team.

During football playing days at NC Central, Saxon was outstanding as an offensive guard playing in the tough Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. He was a member of two championship teams and earned All-Conference honors three years in a row. In 1973, he was named to the Associated Press' College Division All-American team, the NAIA All-

American team, and the Mutual Black Sports All-American team.

LARRY MARTIN

J.V. COACH

Larry Martin is a Cortland native who earned a B.S. and M.S. at Cortland. He played college football as a starting end under the late Dragon coach, Chugger Davis. Martin received his doctorate from Springfield College where he studied under an NDEA doctoral fellowship. While at Springfield, he also served as an assistant with the football coaching staff.

Martin is an associate professor of physical education at Cortland and also is head golf coach. Before coming to Cortland, Martin served as a director of athletics, coach of several sports and physical educator at three high schools in northern New York--Gouvernor, Massena and Canton.

STEVE GARNER

DEFENSIVE BACKS

A native of Trumansburg, Steve Garner played three years of varsity football (1971-73) at Cortland State as a defensive back. He was an effective open field tackler and was tough to beat on pass plays.

Garner is doing graduate work in physical education at Cortland as a recipient of an Alumni Graduate Assistantship for 1977-78. He returns to the campus after teaching health and physical education at Bloomfield Central High School. He coached wrestling and organized a new lacrosse club which he coached.

BILL ASSENHEIMER

DEFENSIVE LINE

A Little All-American pick for his line-backing work with Alfred University teams in the late sixties, Bill Assenheimer has arrived on Cortland's campus to undertake graduate work in physical education and to assist with Red Dragon coaching chores. In the fall of 1968, his senior year at

Alfred, Assenheimer was team captain and earned All-ECAC honors. He also played goalie for Alfred lacrosse teams. He graduated from Alfred with a BA in liberal studies.

JOHN SCIERA

ATHLETIC TRAINER

A Cortland graduate, John Sciera has been athletic trainer for the Red Dragons since 1965. He has an M.S. degree from SUNY Buffalo and is a licensed physical therapist. He was head trainer at SUNY Buffalo under Jim Peele for seven years and served as trainer for the annual Coaches All-American football game when it was played in Buffalo. In 1975, he was one of the head trainers for the U.S. Pan American team which competed in Mexico City.

In addition to his training duties, Sciera monitors the College's program in athletic training which is offered as a concentration in the physical education major. He served as the first president of the recently established New York State Athletic Trainers Association.



## 1977 RED DRAGON OUTLOOK

Cortland State's 1977 football team is expected to show improvement over last year's squad which finished the season with 4 wins and 5 losses. Coach Roger Robinson will have the benefit of 24 returning players, 17 of whom are lettermen. Incoming freshmen and transfers are expected to provide needed depth, with a little more size evident in the offensive and defensive lines.

"The most critical positions that need rejuvenation if Cortland is to be stronger this year are tight end, defensive tackles and safety," Robinson noted. "We have some excellent candidates for these spots but they will need varsity game experience."

Cortland's strength will be in the offensive line with Bob Mance (Poughkeepsie), Mike Hastrich (Kenmore) and Dan MacNeill (Cortland) filling the guard positions and Rich Brown (Massapequa) at tackle.

The backfield has the most depth.

Record-setting Lyle Schuler (Kingston) will lead the Red Dragon rushing game. Last year, he ran for a total of 857 yards which was a single season rushing record for Cortland. He broke the old mark of 739 set in 1969 by Joe Bramante. Schuler set other records too. He had the most touchdowns in a season - 15, and the most points in a season - 92.

Teaming with Schuler in the backfield will be running backs Mike Altomare (Fishkill), Mark Barbano (Oneida), John Devendorf (Chittenango) and Tony Chambrovich (Orangeburg). Upcoming sophomore runners are Dan Halpin (Broadalbin) and Greg Sciera (Cortland).

For four campaigns, Ralph Boettger (Levittown) was the starting quarterback for Cortland. He graduated in May after setting numerous career and single season passing records. His career marks include: most pass attempts - 654, most pass completions - 313, most passing yardage - 7

3,762, most TD passes - 20, and most total offense - 3,865. His season records are: most yards passing - 1,036 in 1976, and most passes attempted - 197 in 1974. He also holds a number of single game records.

Competing for the job as Boettger's successor will be Greg Didio (Syracuse), Gene Iozzino (Highland Mills), and transfer student Steve Zappia (Endicott). Another QB prospect is Tim Pendergast (Syracuse) but he'll also get a close look as defensive safety.

The defense for the Red 'n White will be anchored by linebacker Ken Yancey (Syracuse). Duncan McCormick (Binghamton), Bob Timmerman (Riverhead) and George Mott (Moravia) are experienced at tackle. Middle guard prospects are Dave Dengler (Amherst), Pete Baldine (Gloversville).

Defensive ends will be Ross Cuiffo (Flushing), Alan Barry (Manorville) who is a transfer from Nassau C.C., Larry O'Leary (Levittown), Steve Hannay (Kingston), and John Sciera (Cortland). Tom

Potter (Oneida Castle) is also a DE prospect but he'll get a shot first at tight end.

The defensive secondary will consist of Dale Cook (Lake Katrine), Rich Caravaggio (Lake Ronkonkoma), Walt Doane (Apalachin), and Dan Reynolds (Nichols). Sophomore candidates for the secondary are Tim Pendergast (Syracuse), and Bill Sherlack (Pawling).

#### DAVIS FIELD

Home games for Red Dragon football are played on Carl "Chugger" Davis Field. Seating capacity for football is 5,000. When approaching from the north or south, use Interstate 81 to Exit 11 and follow Route 13 through the City of Cortland to the campus entrance. From the east or west just follow Route 13 to the campus entrance.
