

With 230 pound Carl Savino at tackle, 210 pound George Wilbur at center, and the 220 pound Ev Umhey at right end, the Iroquois averaged over 200 pounds in the line. The team also had a fine passer in Ray Manahan and an excellent punter in George Redden. The high spots of the season were the 13-0 victories over Arnold and Thiel plus the 8-6 losing encounter with Middlebury, one of the leading teams in the New England states that season.
