

# Football for 1952 at Cortland

This page in the Cortland State football program is designed to tell fans something about the team, the opponents for the day and football news in general. Since this is the first game of the 1952 Cortland football season, this can serve as a welcome back to football fans of this area. We hope that you will attend the next three home games of the Red Dragons of Cortland State.

This is also a welcome to the Bulls of the University of Buffalo. However, it is the wish of Coach Carl Davis and his men that the visitors not take this welcome too literally. The fact is that this is the third meeting between the two teams and Buffalo has won the first two without allowing the Red Dragons to score. Such things should not continue, in the opinion of Cortlandites, and today is the day the Dragons hope to stop this trend. Cortland men do not relish the memories of the past two years, the 1950 game in which Buffalo won 13-0 and the 1951 game in which the Bulls doubled their previous year's score, winning 26-0.

Since this is the first game of the year for both clubs, there is little basis for comparison. Both squads have been hurt by graduation and the inroad of the Selective Service program. The only basis of comparison is last year's game which Cortlandites hope is no indication of the abilities of the two teams.

Head Coach Davis has had his work cut out for him this year as he has had to seek replacements for 20 lettermen who have graduated, entered the service, completed their eligibility or left the squad for other reasons. The nine who graduated in June include Herb Carlberg, John Clarke, Frank Colwell, George Lee, Joe Lucey, Fred Raulli, John Sciera, Royal Steubing and Frank Wawrzaszek. Three lettermen have entered the service since last year, Herb Collins, Jim Dexter and Sherry Smith. Bob Wallace and Don Mer-

rill have completed their football eligibility while Gene Fitzpatrick, John Graham and Bob June have dropped out of school. Feno Volpe, Gordon Robinson and Frank Losurdo are not out for football this year.

The loss of these lettermen included both quarterbacks, Wallace and Robinson and both 1951 fullbacks, Raulli and Dexter. These positions have been one of the bigger problems which the coaching staff has been faced with since the men reported for practice September 2. One advantage this year has been that the squad had two weeks of two-a-day practices instead of one as in the past two years.

Eighteen lettermen from the 1951 team are on the squad this year. They include: Whitney Armstrong, Dick Poole, Jerry Riendeau and Larry Martin, ends; Frank Brusger, Alan Chase, Frank Chicosky, Ray Cozens, Craig Hitchcock, Joe La Rocca, Mike Norris, Al Renken, Stan Silver, and Louis Zych, linemen; Norm Foster, Bob Hoppey, Vinc Mascia and Chet Pelsang, backs.

The coaches saw the squad under fire last Saturday when the team journeyed to Clinton and met the Hamilton College team in a practice scrimmage. All members of the squad who were physically able were given their chance during that scrimmage and several members of the freshmen class showed that they were going to push the upperclassmen for starting positions.

After today, the Dragons have six more games, with three of them being here on Randall Field. Next Friday night they play Hofstra College at Hempstead, October 11 Alfred comes to Cortland, October 18 Ithaca College is the Homecoming opponent, October 25 the Dragons play at Brockport, November 1 Stroudsburg comes to Cortland and November 8 the Dragons play at Springfield College.

# The Coaching Staff



Miller, Weber, Eckard, Davis, Tesori, Wallace, Merrill

Carl "Chugger" Davis is in his 18th season as head coach of football at Cortland State Teachers College. Up until this year he has compiled a record of 68 wins, 37 defeats and eight ties for a .648 percentage. His outstanding teams included a string of four seasons with only one loss (1932-1935). His best postwar year was the 1948 season when his team lost only one game. In addition, Chugger has coached the Cortland baseball team since 1933 and has consistently had winning teams. In the last three seasons his teams have won 24 and lost six. He also coached varsity basketball until 1950. Coach Davis is a graduate of Springfield (Mo.) College and has done his graduate work at Springfield (Mass.) College.

David Miller is a Cortland graduate in the Class of 1936. His record in the 100 yard dash still stands as the Cortland mark and he also played varsity football at Cortland. He coached at Phelps Central School for five years, served in the Navy during the war, earned his masters degree at Syracuse University in 1946 and coached at Sherburne Central School for two years prior to coming back to Cortland in 1948. He also is coach of varsity wrestling and varsity track and field.

Anthony Tesori is another Cortland graduate (1939) where he played four years of varsity football and basketball and was Sports King in his senior year. He taught at Tully Central School

prior to entering the Navy. After finishing his Navy tour he earned his master's degree at New York University and returned to Cortland as a faculty member in 1946. He has assisted in football and basketball and coached golf but his primary assignment is as supervisor of the men's physical education practice teaching program. In addition to working with the ends, he serves as a scout.

Roland Eckard is a graduate of Ohio State in 1940 and he taught at Painesville (Ohio) High School before and after the war, his service there being interrupted by a hitch in the Air Force where he was a bombardier. After the war, he completed his work for his masters degree, returned to Painesville for two years and came to Cortland in 1948. He coaches the gym team in the winter months

Robert J. Weber is new to the coaching staff this year, having come to the Cortland faculty from the University of Iowa where he earned his doctor's degree in June, 1952. He is a graduate of that university where he played football. He has had five year's experience in public school teaching as well as teaching at Iowa.

Donald Merrill and Robert Wallace are Cortland seniors who have completed their football eligibility. Don was a guard on last year's team and is working with the linemen. Bob was last year's quarterback and is assisting with the backs.






