

## The Red Dragons 1953 Football Campaign

Today marks the return of the Red Dragons of Cortland State to playing action here at Randall Field. Coach Carl "Chugger" Davis has brought his team through four contests to date with a won 1 lost 2 and tied 1 record. It is with the highest hopes that the Red Dragons take to the field for a renewal of the battle "between teachers", as the Golden Eagles of Brockport State provide the opposition.

The Davismen will be looking to make it three straight over the Golden Eagles. Last year the Dragons were victorious over Brockport 42-6, while the 1951 score board reads 35-12. To date Brockport has yet to win, having lost to Ithaca College 12-4, Alfred University 39-0, New Haven Teachers 18-0 and Clarion Teachers 51-7.

Cortland's grid season opener of Sept. 19th began on a rather "sour note" as Springfield College ground out a 34-6 victory. The Indians wasted no time, as Joe Chandler and Hal Haines scored on short runs, while Ron Rouleau converted to give the visitors a 14-0 lead at the end of the first period. The Dragons bounced back with a touchdown which came as a result of a 36 yard pass from Art Riedel to Jay Clark, this being followed by Joe O'Heanney's 16 yard dash around end for the lone Cortland score of the day. Springfield countered with another score as Ted O'Connor covered the final eight yards of an Indian push down field to make it 21-6 at half time. Norm Morris widened the scoring gap by galloping to a touchdown in each of the final periods, while Rouleau made good his extra point attempts.

October 3rd found the Dragons in Buffalo. New York, for an arc light game with the "Bulls' from the University of Buffalo. Cortland marched down the field for the initial score midway through the first period as Don Quinn bucked over from the one yard line. The conversion attempt was The Bulls came to life two minutes before half time as Emil Jahn raced through the center of the Teacher's line for eleven yards and a tie ball game. Jahn turned the trick once again in the third quarter to give University of Buffalo the lead momentarily. The final scoring occurred in the closing minutes of the game as Johnny Arcaro slipped up the center slot for the tally after a Clarence Powell - Chester Pelsang pass good for seventeen yards and two successive running plays had put Cortland on the nine yard line. score: Cortland State 12—University of Buffalo 12.

Next came another away from home night contest with Alfred University on October 10th. This game saw the speedy Saxons shut out the Dragons 19-0 as Les Gobel & Co. lived up to previous statistical reports. Ron Northrup sprinted fourteen yards for the first tally and kicked the extra point after Alfred had marched down the field on a series of running plays. That constituted all of the first half scoring. The third quarter produced another Saxon tally as Chuck Schultz

caught a pass from Al Moresco in the end zone. Finally the clincher came about as Jay Abbott dashed 37 yards to give Alfred its victory over Cortland. The Davismen threatened continually during the game but failed either because of fumbles or the strong defense put up by the Saxons.

Last Friday night, October 16th found the Dragons pitted against the Ithaca College Bombers in Ithaca, New York. The opening minutes of the game say Mel Decker run an Ithaca punt back twenty yards. Bob Hoppey quarterbacking for the first time this season, hit Phil Nicklaus with a ten yard pass after five yards were gained by rushing. The Dragons moved steadily down the field and scored as Hoppey sneaked over from the one yard line. Lou Pettinelli's try for the extra point was blocked. In the second quarter "Big John" Beecher recovered a fumble on the Bombers own twenty-six yard line. Don Quinn picked up five yards and John Millet ran twentyone yards for a score, which left the Dragons leading 12-0. The third period produced a stalemate as both teams went scoreless. However, the last quarter was an explosive one for the Dragons as they took the kickoff and marched down field to their third touchdown of the evening. Quinn carried from the three yard line, and Powell passed to Burroughs for the extra point. Next, Al Chase and Don Sterritt blocked a Bomber punt which Pete Trainor recovered and ran thirty-four yards for the touchdown. Powell successfully kicked the extra point. The last scoring play occurred when Powell intercepted a pass on the Cortland thirty-three yard line, and then connected with a 57 yard pass to Herb Hemindinger who ran the final ten yards for the score. Final Score Cortland 32 — Ithaca 0, this being the first Dragon win of the season.

Coach Davis is experiencing a year known to all coaches at one time or another as "Rebuilding", having lost twenty-seven men through graduation and other reasons including the following fourteen senior lettermen: Vince Mascia, Norm Foster, Whit Armstrong, Gerry Riendeau, Joe La-Rocca, Joe Mancarella, Bob Keenan, Larry Martin, Mike Norris, Ron Schaertl, Louis Zych, Craig Hitchcock, Richard Poole and Albert Renken.

Eight returning lettermen comprise the nucleus of the squad, they being John Arcaro, Alan Chase, Ray Cosens, Robert Hoppey, Chester Pelsang, Louis Pettinelli, Donald Quinn and Arthur Riedel. Others who returned to this year's squad are: Frank Brusgar, Eugene Wheeler, Robert Miller, James Wachob and Pete Trainor who played J.V. ball last year.

Next week, October 31st is Homecoming, when Cortland plays host to the "Flying Dutchmen" of Hofstra College, Long Island. The final game of the 1953 season is on November 7th when Cortland travels to East Stroudsburg, Pa., to play their arch rivals, East Stroudsburg State Teachers College. BETA PHI

### The Coaching Staff



Eckhard, Davis, Donati, Weber, Bub, Stephens


Carl "Chugger" Davis is in his nineteenth season as head coach of football at Cortland State Teachers College. Prior to this year he had compiled a record of 72 wins, 39 defeats and 9 ties for a .649 percentage. His outstanding teams were in the years between 1932-1935 when a winning streak of games was marred by only a single defeat. The best post-war season for Chugger was in 1948 when the team lost only one game. In addition to coaching football, Coach Davis has also piloted the baseball team to winning ways most consistently. He also coached basketball until 1950. The past four seasons have seen his teams win 37 contests while losing only 10 contests. Coach Davis is a graduate of Springfield (Mo.) College. Later he did his graduate work at Springfield (Mass.) College.

Robert J. "Doc" Weber is beginning his second year as line coach here at Cortland. Previously he had earned a doctor's degree at the University of Iowa where he also played football as an undergraduate. He had five year's experience in public school teaching as well as teaching at Iowa. Roland Eckard is coach of the Junior Varsity Football team. He is a graduate of Ohio State University and taught high school at Painesville, Ohio, prior to his entry into the Air Force, where he served as a bombardier during World War II. In the post-war period he completed work leading to a masters degree, after which he returned to Painesville for two years before coming to Cortland in 1948. During the winter months he coaches the gym team.

John Donati, a newcomer to the coaching staff, will be backfield coach. He is a graduate of Syracuse University where he played four seasons of football in the backfield. Last year he coached the Frosh football team at Syracuse University, a team which played Cortland's J. V. squad, so one may say that he is not a total stranger to our campus.

Richard Stephens and Robert Bub are the student coaches on the staff. Dick is a senior who will assist the backfield coach. Bob played at full-back last year (Frosh) and is now working with the ends.
