



As Seen From The Press Box

As the autumn leaves take on their brilliant colors and the days become a little crisper here in Central New York, all thoughts turn to our annual Homecoming Weekend. At this time the Men's Athletic Association would like to welcome all alumni to this wonderful, event filled, Homecoming weekend. We hope that all of you have an opportunity to see and visit with all your old friends and faculty. Welcome back!

This year our opponents are the Brockport Golden Eagles. For those of you who do not realize it, Brockport and Cortland are the only two New York State Teachers Colleges to field football teams. Coach Boozer brings with him a team that has two wins and one loss beating Mansfield State, (Pa.) and Montclair, (N.J.) State, while losing to Slippery Rock (Pa.) State. Their game with Clarion, last week was cancelled because of the flu epidemic at Clarion.

It may be remembered that last year, Cortland went to Brockport for the Eagles Homecoming game and Cortland spoiled it for them by walloping the Golden Eagles, 45-0. In that same game, Cortland set new school records in total offense, rushing offense, and most points scored in one game. Our record with Brockport is 7 wins and 1 tie in the series, which dates back to 1949.

The air was cold and the ground was damp as the Red Dragons opened their season with a Saturday night encounter at Alfred University. The game was brought to a thrilling close as Cortland scored with only a minute remaining to gain a 12-12 tie against a very tough Saxon eleven. Art Smith opened Cortland's scoring with a five yard skirt of right end early in the first quarter. Alfred bounced right back on the ensuing kickoff driving all the way on option plays for their first TD. Later, Alfred surged ahead in the third quarter, getting a touchdown on a 15 yard pass play that had been set up by a previous pass that covered 41 yards, thrown by the outstanding Saxon quarterback, Jimmy Harnett. For a long that seemed to be the necessary margin for victory. It was not until very late in the fourth quarter that the Davismen put on their tie-gaining 61 yard touchdown march.

The following week, Bloomsburg State came up from Pennsylvania with a tough, battling team.

Cortland was able to roll over them 42-12. Art Smith scored three touchdowns and Tom Decker broke away for touchdown runs of 20 and 53 yards. Cortland proved too much for the Huskies on their inside tackle breakthroughs as there were many long gains recorded. The Red Dragons scored one touchdown in the first, two in the second and third periods and one in the fourth. Wayne Weiss set a new school record, making six out of six points after touchdowns. Many of the touchdowns were either scored by or set up by long runs. The average scoring play covered 24 yards.

Although the air was cool, the Red Dragon attack was hot as it crushed Ithaca College 32-13 before a Homecoming crowd at Percy Field. Cortland's Tom Decker scored on touchdown runs of 58 and 14 yards to bring his total to 4 touchdowns in the last two games. Art Smith scored two TD's on plunges of 5 yards and 1 yard that brought his total to 7 in the three games he has played. Smith highlighted the Red Dragons' second score by intercepting a pass and running 30 yards to the Ithaca 15. Later in that same second quarter a 51 yard pass play from Koesterer to Smith sparked Cortland's fourth TD of the game. In the fourth quarter, with Cortland leading 25-13, Freshman Tom Decker put the game on ice for Cortland as he raced 58 yards for his second score of the game. The teams were very evenly matched but Cortland got off the long gains that made the difference.

In their next encounter, the Davismen will play Coach Howdy Meyer's Hofstra College eleven. This will be Cortland's last home game of the season. Hofstra is undefeated in 4 games, beating Wilkes, St. Lawrence, Upsala and Temple. Up to today, end Don Baldwin (#70) was fourth in the nation in pass receiving with 197 yards and two touchdowns. Quarterback Larry Magilligan (#10) stands eleventh in the nation in forward passing, having a .429 percentage and four touchdowns.

The following week Cortland travels to East Stroudsburg (Pa.) State to renew our oldest rivalry that started in 1925. Cortland leads in series with 11 wins, 10 losses and five tied. The last game for the Red Dragons is on November 9 at the University of Buffalo. Our record with the Buffalo Bulls is three wins, three losses and one tied.

Coach Carl "Chugger" Davis commences his 23rd year as head football coach at Cortland State. Over the years, "Chugger" has made close to a .600 percentage in the win column. He compiled one of the most outstanding records in college football here in the years 1932 to 1935 when his teams tasted defeat only once. In 1948 and in 1955 his teams lost only one game.

What ever season it is, "Chugger" loves the sport. For many years he coached all three major sports but now coaches only football and baseball. His teams have always been among the leaders in small college athletics. Coach Davis graduated from Springfield (Mo.) College in 1926 and did graduate work at Springfield (Mass.) College. In both high school and college, he was an outstanding athlete and today is still in near-perfect physical condition. Our hats are off to Coach "Chugger" Davis and we wish him another successful season.

Doctor Robert Weber has worked in the line for his sixth year. He played center for the University of Iowa, graduating in 1947, and played football on service teams. He coached and taught in the public High Schools of Iowa and at the University of Iowa. During his last two years of Publie School coaching, his teams lost but one game and won their Conference Championship. He is now Director of Athletics.

The end coach is Mr. Anthony Tesori, who graduated from Cortland State in 1939. He played end for Coach Davis in his undergraduate days and was one of the better Basketball players to graduate from CSTC. He taught at Tully Central High School for three years and was in the Navy four years. He joined the coaching staff here in 1946 and also coached Basketball and Golf as well as Foot-

The youngest member of the Varsity Coaching staff is backfield coach, Robert Wallace. Mr. Wallace graduated from Cortland in 1953 and went to Painted Post High School, there to coach his teams to two successive championships. While an undergraduate, Mr. Wallace was one of Cortland's outstanding quarterbacks. Mr. Wallace joined Cortland's Physical Education Staff in 1956.

Absent from the picture, is Junior Varsity head coach, Albert Watrell. A graduate of Syracuse University, he is starting his fourth season as Junior Varsity coach. He has played under such men as Biggie Munn, Forest Evascheski, Floyd Schwartzwalder, and he has coached at Syracuse, Eastwood High School and Bolles Military school.

Fran Woods, the Assistant J. V. coach is a 1956 Cortland garduate. This past year he taught at Utica Free Academy and coached Freshman Football and assisted with Basketball. We would like to welcome Fran to our school again.

Review of 1957 Intercollegiate Football Rules Changes

Here are the more important changes that should interest intercollegiate football fans:

- 1. Last season permission to use a rubber covered ball was given the team when it was on offense if it so desired. For 1957 this permission has been deleted and the home team shall furnish a leather covered ball unless it is mutually agreed, in advance, to use a rubber covered ball.
- 2. There are additional markings on the field for 1957. One-yard "hash marks" are optional and may be seen at the inbounds line and outside the side line. This was done for the particular convenience of the officials, news, TV and radio commentators. Any decorative markings in the end zone shall be at least two feet from the goal, end and side lines. This new restriction will help in more accurately determining when the ball and players are out of bounds. It will also be noted that a "team area" has now been established on each side line from the 35-yard lines to the end of the players bench. Players, coaches and attendants must re-

main in this area during the entire game unless they are entering or leaving the field.

- 3. One of the most interesting changes for this season is the checking of substitutes by the officials. The players will report to the umpire or field judge. These officials will wear colored arm bands in order that players identify and report to the proper official throughout the game. This will also cause the head linesman to be stationed on one side of the field for the whole game instead of changing sides at the end of the first half.
- 4. As a safety measure players are prohibited from grasping the face mask of an opponent which includes the player carrying the bal!
- 5. The rule prohibiting offensive linemen from going beyond the scrimmage line on forward pass plays unless they made and kept contact with opponents has been liberalized and now extends the area which such contact may be made to a point not exceeding 1 yard beyond the scrimmage line.






