Davis Field Dedication

Before the game today, the College at Cortland will take time to formally dedicate Carl "Chugger" Davis Field.
One of the true teaching-coaching giants on the Hill, Chugger David died May 22 this year at his retirement home in Sarasota, Florida. By renaming the football field in his honor, Davis' name will be perpetuated in the life of the College which he served for 33 years.



CARL A. "CHUGGER" DAVIS 1902-1973

The record of Carl "Chugger" Davis is legendary in the sports annals of State University College at Cortland. Although not an alumnus of the College, he was inducted as an honorary member into the Cortland C-Club Hall of Fame in recognition of his many contributions to the advancement of physical education and athletics.

A native Missourian, Davis came to Cortland in 1932. He coached football for 28 years, from his first year on campus to 1962. During that period, his coaching record was 105 wins, 67 losses and 17 ties. He had undefeated seasons in 1932, 1933 and 1935, Davis coached baseball for 20 years, winning 135 and losing 62, and coached basketball for 10 seasons, compiling a record of 86-71.

When Davis retired from the faculty in 1965, the College's Athletic Department designated the annual award for the most outstanding scholar-athlete at Cortland to the Carl "Chugger" Davis Award.

Retired district principal of the Lyme Central School, Chaumont, N.Y.; now a resident of Cortland and manager of the ice arena in the College's new PER Center; as an undergraduate, he played baseball, football, basketball and soccer.

WILBUR S. BERGSTROM '33

Retired director of physical education at Kensington High School in Buffalo; at Cortland, he played football and basketball and ran in track; as a senior in football, he scored 80 points in a 5-0-2 season.



GEORGE J. KING '49

Executive vice president of the Buffalo Braves in the National Basketball Association; as a student at Cortland, he played end in football, wrestled in the 167 class, and ran the 220, 440 and mile relay in track; in football, catching passes was his forte but he prided himself on his defense.
